SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to today's New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

CHAIRPERSON BROOKS-POWERS: [GAVEL] Good morning and welcome to today's hearing of the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure. I am Selvena Brooks-Powers, Chair of the Committee.

Today we will be voting on Proposed

Intro. number 1139-A sponsored by Council Member

Amanda Farías, a local law in relation to advertising
on the interior of for-hire vehicles.

This proposed bill would permit for-hire vehicles to display digital advertising on an approved electronic tablet attached to the interior of the vehicle and allow drivers to bring in additional revenue through this advertising. I want

to also take a moment to just highlight the first hearing of this Committee was done jointly with Council Member Farías and the Committee on Economic Development, and we are concluding with one of her bills that was a top priority so I want to take point of privilege to congratulate you in advance of the vote. I will now allow Council Member Farías to speak on her bill.

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COUNCIL MEMBER FARÍAS: Thank you so much, Chair Brooks-Powers. As Chair of the Committee on Economic Development and the proud representative of District 18 in the Southeast Bronx, I'm excited we are voting on my bill, Intro. 1139-A, which would allow for interior advertising for for-hire vehicles. Intro. 1139 puts drivers first and supports their economic mobility, and it is leveling the field for drivers and customers with tablets in every rideshare opportunity they take. This new advertising possibility, while not a new idea to this city, provides rideshare drivers with an opportunity to earn a passive income from advertisements that could allow for more money to stay in the pockets of our hardworking drivers and their families. New York City is home to roughly 100,000 rideshare drivers. A huge

COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE share of our drivers are hard-working immigrants, first-generation Americans, and black, Latino, AAPI New Yorkers from across the five boroughs. The rideshare economy has provided and continues to provide a huge opportunity for working class and immigrant communities to have financial stability and upward economic mobility for themselves and their families, but rideshare is not only a huge opportunity for hard-working people, it is also a key part of our city's economy, transit systems, and it has become a truly essential part of so many New Yorkers day-to-day lives. The ability for drivers, specifically that service our outer borough communities, to have advertisements in their cars comes at an urgent moment with more fees incoming to our drivers in communities like mine, due to rising gas prices, cost to electrify, congestion pricing, and the upcoming Green Rides Initiative. The revenue sharing model outlined within this bill will allow drivers to truly reap the benefits of ad revenue as they will earn 25 percent of what plays on the tablets.

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Finally, I'd like to say thank you to my Colleagues who have signed on on this important
