Welcome to the Subcommittee on Planning,
Dispositions and Concessions. I'm Council Member
Steve Levin, chair of the Subcommittee. Today we
are joined by members of the Subcommittee Peter
Koo of Queens and Charles Barron of Brooklyn.
We're also joined by Council Member Al Vann of
Brooklyn, Council Member Diana Reyna of Brooklyn
as well, and Council Member Larry Seabrook of the
Bronx and Council Member Vinny Ignizio of Staten
Island and anyone else? Mark Weprin of Queens.

We are going to vote this morning on Land Use No. 296. This is Maujer, Ten Eyck, Bedford and Brooklyn Community District No. 1, Council District 34, represented by Council Member Diana Reyna, C110095 HAK. We're going to take a vote on this item. We had a hearing on it yesterday and does anyone have anything to add on this item in particular? Council Member Reyna?

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: A list of thank yous. I wanted to just thank you, Mr.

Chair, first of all for your indulgence in making sure that we were able to finalize some of these details. I want to just reference 2005

Greenpoint-Williamsburg re-zoning, a list of 2 points of agreement that were supposed to be 3 accomplished throughout the course of a decade and 4 5 we're mid-ear through and affordable housing is 6 precious--the development of new construction and preservation in Williamsburg and Greenpoint. Representing the south side of this community, I 9 wanted to just express my gratitude in making sure that the most vulnerable of families that are 10 11 being displaced are going to be receiving some 12 hope that there is going to be in the next 18 13 months a few more units that will accommodate so many of the families that are being harassed and 14 15 can't afford their particular unit because of the 16 pressures of the market. Clearly, we started out this project with conversations by--HPD convened 17 18 with the developer and I am happy to say that the 19 project has been turned around so that today we 20 are voting in favor of it. We have at a Bedford 21 site, Ten Eyck and Maujer Street, lots that will 22 be converted into affordable housing at 100% in 23 perpetuity that will guarantee at minimum 52 units 24 of which 1 bedroom, 2 bedroom and 3 bedroom 25 compositions accommodating primarily families,

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which is where the greatest need is--families that are earning up to 60% of AMI.

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And I wanted to just thank a host of individuals, starting with the staff of the Land Use Committee, Carol and Amy, Gil Benjamin [phonetic] who leads this great team, and I wanted to just thank the great work of HPD, Carol Clark, who could have lost her mind throughout all these days and didn't, and she's very gracious in having entertained so much. I want to thank Susan, Mike from the Mayor's office, Jack Hammer from HPD, Wendell Walters, Beatriz de la Torre, the developer Raymond Yu, who we will continue to speak to to bring to the table to make sure that this project is a success at the day of its ribbon cutting. But I am happy to have worked with all of these individuals, especially with my staff, who just made sure that we continued these discussions in a very fruitful way. So today I happily ask for a supportive vote of this project. Thank you.
