At this time and going forward, no one is to approach the dais. I repeat, no one is to approach the dais.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON LEE: [GAVEL] Good morning, everyone. My name is Linda Lee and I'm the Chair of the Committee on Mental Health, Disabilities, and Addiction.

Today the Committee will vote on several pieces of legislation. First, Council Member Riley's Proposed Intro. 651-A, a local law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to create and distribute materials

2 identifying mental health resources available to
3 individuals who have experienced pregnancy loss.

Next, Council Member Gutiérrez's Proposed Intro. 869-A, a local law to amend the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to outreach and education regarding parental mental health resources, and Proposed Intro. 890-A, which I'm proud to co-sponsor, that is a local law in relation to implementing a pilot program to establish postpartum support groups.

Additionally, I'm proud to sponsor five
Resolutions today. They are Reso. 402-2024, a
Resolution calling on New York State Legislature to
pass and the Governor to sign legislation to require
health insurance plans to develop and implement a
maternal mental health quality management program to
promote access to affordable and comprehensive
maternal mental health services; Reso. 403-2024, a
Resolution calling upon the New York State
Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign
legislation mandating all accredited psychiatry
residency programs to offer a one-year post-residency
fellowship program specifically focused on perinatal
mental health; Reso. 404-2024, a Resolution calling

on the New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign legislation to require obstetricians and gynecologists to conduct maternal mental health screening during pregnancy and postpartum and to require Medicaid to cover such services; Reso. 405-2025, a Resolution calling upon New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign legislation mandating Medicaid managed care organizations to collect and report prenatal and postpartum depression screenings and follow-up data using HEDIS measures and, finally, Reso. 406-2024, a Resolution designating May annually as Maternal Mental Health Awareness Month in the City of New York and calling on New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign S156/A6603, which would make the same designation statewide.

Now, I'd like to call upon Council Member Gutiérrez to make a statement on her bill.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUTIÉRREZ: Thank you, Chair. I would like to first thank Speaker Adams and all of the co-sponsors of the bill who supported this. This Council, led by the first women majority, has done a tremendous amount of work to really create a safer and a more accessible atmosphere for parents,

for new parents, and I think more importantly, to ensure that we're keeping women and women of color alive and safe during the pregnancy process and postpartum as well so I'm really, really proud to sponsor this bill, which would require the Mayor's Office of Community Mental Health to implement an education program to raise awareness about resources at every level of government addressing mental health challenges faced by parents so I'm super proud as, yes, a mom, but also as a representative, as someone who works really hard and diligently to raise awareness on the importance of healthy pregnancy, healthy postpartum, and to see and hear women and pregnant people and their unique experiences navigating pregnancy and the hospital process so I'm really thankful to the Speaker and all of my cosponsors. I want to just shout out Anya Lehr, my Chief-of-Staff, and the whole team that went back and forth for a long time on this bill. I'm really grateful and thank you, Chair.
