number one, Sara Gonzalez number one? Okay.
Alright. We are here today to vote out all of the
items that were taken care of in the subcommittee
meetings that were held in the past week.

Member Koppell's district, Land Use Item No. 367,
Bronx Community Board 8, Item No. 20115439 TCX.

It's a café called Goodfellas. Yeah. We have
Land Use Item No. 372. It's an amendment to the
Zoning Map--Land Use Item 372, Union Avenue
rezoning in Staten Island in Council Member Rose's
district-- Item No. C 100118 ZMR. It's a Union
Avenue rezoning. We have Land Use Items 373 and
374, which are related. They're amendments to the
Zoning Map, zoning text and an amendment to the
zoning text to allow for the FRESH Resolution to
be implemented as part of the South Jamaica
rezoning. They're in Council Member Wills,

2	Sanders and myself district. It's Item No. C
3	110145 ZMQ and 110146 ZRQ and N 110193 ZRM. We
4	have a few landmark items. I need to read this.
5	Okay. It's an amendment submitted by the
6	Department of City Planning pursuant to Section
7	201 of the City Charter for amendment of the
8	Zoning Resolution of the city of New York. Oh,
9	I'm sorry. I combined it. Sorry. N 100193 ZRM
10	is the lower Manhattan arcades text amendment in
11	Manhattan Community Board 1, which is an amendment
12	to the zoning text to allow for the changes within
13	the arcades area in the Special Lower Manhattan
14	District. Then, we have a landmark item, Landmark
15	Item No. 376, Council Member Ignizio-it's in
16	Staten Island Community Board 3. It's the
17	Reverend Issac and Rebecca Gray Coleman House.
18	It's a historic landmark in Sandy Ground. It's
19	20115464 HKR. Also in part of the Sandy Ground
20	area, the Rossville AME Zion Church, Landmark Item
21	377 in Council Member Ignizio's district, Staten
22	Island Community Board 3. And also the landmark
23	item—the last one in this one—565 and 569
24	Bloomingdale Road Cottages, Landmark Item 378,
25	Item No. 20115466 HKR and that's to landmark the

cottages in the Sandy Ground area, as well. We
have another historic district that it's my
district, the Addisleigh Park District, Queens
Community Board 12, Item No. 20115467 HKQ. It's
to landmark the Addisleigh Park area in Queens.
We also have a landmark item in Speaker Quinn's
district. The Manufacturer's Trust Company
Building in Manhattan Community Board 5, Landmark
Item 380, Item No. 20115516 HKM. It's located at
510 5 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and 2 West 43 <sup>rd</sup> Street—the interiors
of the Manufacturer's Trust Building. A sidewalk
café in Speaker Quinn's district-Land Use No. 382,
Manhattan Community Board 12, 20115007 TCM. It's
the sidewalk café, Empanada Mama, at $763~9^{\mathrm{th}}$
Avenue. Empanada, excuse me. We have third party
transfers in Council Member Seabrook, Cabrera,
Rivera, Foster, Arroyo and Palma's districts in
Bronx Community Boards 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9 and 12.
Third party transfers under Item No. 20115650 HAK.
It's regarding the transfer and disposition of
property and tax related exemptions for seven
different properties. We also have a sites-school
selection for a new school, which will be called
P.S. 313 in Queens in Council Member Van Bramer's

2	district within Queens Community Board 2, Land Use
3	No. 384, Item No. 20115274 SCQ. It will be a 379
4	seat primary school facility to be located at 45-
5	46 42 <sup>nd</sup> Street in Queens School District 24. We
6	have a UDAPs which will be listed in a minute-Land
7	Use Nos. 346, 347, 348 and 381. 346 is in Council
8	Member Dickens' district, Item No. 20115546 HAM.
9	Its address is 110 West 114 <sup>th</sup> Street, 241 West 137 <sup>th</sup>
10	Street, 271 West 150 <sup>th</sup> Street, 2049 5 <sup>th</sup> Avenue-it's
11	on a neighborhood redevelopment program in Block
12	Community Boards 10 and 11 in Council Member
13	Jackson's district, Land Use No. 347, Item No.
14	2011547 HAM, 8 St. Nicholas Terrace in Manhattan.
15	It's in Community Board 9 in Council Member
16	Levin's district, Land Use No. 348, Item No.
17	20115548 HAK, 356 Jay Street. It's a Section 577
18	tax exemption and also these are in Council Member
19	Vann's district, Land Use Nos. 381, 20115619 HAK,
20	788 Lafayette Avenue, 788A Lafayette Avenue, 790
21	Lafayette Avenue, 792, 794, 796 Lafayette Avenue
22	and 123 Van Buren Street, all in Brooklyn, all are
23	income rental program, Section 577.

COUNCIL MEMBER VANN: If you read it, you'd find out that at the end of the rental period, the tenants can become the owners of this particular project.

COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: If you read the Harlem, you'll find out the same applies.

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Okay.

Alright. Here we go. Yeah, yeah, yeah.
