COMMITTEE: Public Safety

TITLE: A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the police department to report on missing persons

SPONSORS: Council Members Louis, Stevens, Riley, Restler, Farías, Williams and Brooks-Powers

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Int. No. 831 would require the NYPD to annually report on missing persons cases.
