Proposed Intro No. / Title: *Intro 564-A / in relation to creating an archive of official government social media accounts*

Sponsors: Brewer, Hanif and Cabán

Committee: Governmental Operations, State & Federal Legislation

Summary of Legislation: This legislation requires the Department of Records and Information Services (DORIS) to maintain a searchable online database containing all public content and metadata from official government social media accounts. No later than January 31 of each year, each agency, and the office of each elected official, shall provide to DORIS information related to any account on a social media platform associated with such agency or elected official and identified as an official government account.

Effective Date: 120 days after enactment
