2	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Good morning.
3	I'm Council Member Brad Lander. I'm pleased to
4	call this meeting of the City Council's Land Use
5	Subcommittee on Landmarks, Public Siting and
6	Maritime Uses to order. I'm joined this morning
7	by Council Members Maria del Carmen Arroyo, Rosie
8	Mendez and Dan Halloran, and our counsel,
9	Christian Hilton. We have one item on the
10	calendar this morning. L.U. 425, P.S. 316 in
11	Queens in Council Member Ulrich's district, and
12	we'll [off mic] Gregory Shaw and Kenrick Ou to
13	join us to testify. We're also joined by Council
14	Member Jumaane Williams of Brooklyn.
15	GREGORY SHAW: Good morning,
16	Chairperson Lander and Council Members. My name
17	is Gregory Shaw. I'm principal attorney for real
18	estate for the New York City School Construction
19	Authority, and to my left is Kenrick Ou, director
20	of real estate for the New York City School
21	Construction Authority.
22	The New York City School
23	Construction Authority has undertaken a site
24	selection process for the proposed 416 seat

primary school facility that will be located on

Tax Block 9064, Lots 31 and 35 and Block 9063, Lot		
27, located at the northeast and northwest corners		
of 90 th Street and 101 st Avenue in the Ozone Park		
section of Queens. The proposed school site is		
also located in Community School District No. 27		
in Queens Community Board No. 9. The project site		
contains a vacant, former parochial school		
building and convent. The site has a total of		
approximately 20,000 square feet of lot area.		
Under the proposed plan, the SCA would acquire the		
property and demolish the existing school and		
convent and construct a new 416 seat primary		
school facility. In phase one, environmental site		
assessment and phase two, environmental site		
investigation were conducted at the site. Phase		
two determined that no hazardous materials will		
impact the project site. All soil removed from		
the site will be properly disposed of in		
accordance with federal, state and city		
regulations.		

The notice of filing for the site plan was published in the New York Post and city record on February 11th, 2011. Queens Community Board No. 9 was also notified of the site plan on

that date and was asked to hold a public hearing
on the proposed site plan. Community board No. 9
held a public hearing for the site plan on March
8 th , 2011. It submitted written comments in favor
of the proposed site plan. The City Planning
Commission was also notified of the site plan on
February 11 th , 2011 and it also recommended in
favor of the site. The SCA has considered all
comments received on the proposed site plan and
affirms it pursuant to Section 1731 of the Public
Authority's Law. In accordance with Section 1732
of the Public Authority's Law, the SCA submitted
the proposed site plan to the mayor and Council on
June 16 th , 2011.

We look forward to your

Subcommittee's favorable consideration of the

proposed site plan. We are prepared to answer any
questions that you might have. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you very much, and again, thank you for being here to testify. So the site will be acquired not longterm leased?

GREGORY SHAW: Yes, it will be acquired. We entered into a contract of sale with

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2	the church several months ago, and if it's
3	approved by this Committee as well as the Council
Ŀ	and the mayor, we would expect the close sometime
5	in July, hopefully.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Diocesan Catholic church? It's a Diocese church? KENRICK OU: Yes, the building formerly was used as a St. Stanislaus parochial school, and the convent was also associated with that parish and it's under the Diocese of Brooklyn.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: And they've agreed to sell it?

KENRICK OU: Correct.

GREGORY SHAW: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Okay. I checked in with Council Member Ulrich and he is supportive of the project and glad to have some additional school seats. We'll see whether there are any teachers to teach in the building, but let's get it built. Any questions from any of my colleagues about it? No? Alright. Seeing none, thank you very much for your time and appearance today. We don't have anyone signed up to testify,

COUNSEL: By a vote of five in the abstentions, L.U. 425 is approved and referred to the full Land Use Committee.

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CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you very much. This meeting of the Subcommittee is adjourned.
