2 CHAIRPERSON DILAN: Alright, I'd

like to call the Committee to order. Good morning. My name is Erik Martin Dilan, and I'm the chairperson of the City Council's Housing and Buildings Committee. Today the Committee is conducting a hearing for the purposes of a vote on proposed Intro 338-A, which is a Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York and the building code of the city of New York in relation to greenhouses, as well as Resolution 507, which is a resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to amend Section 499-aaa of the New York State Real Property Tax Law to allow the Green Roof Tax Abatement to extend to owners who produce live food producing plants.

proposed Intro 338-A adds
greenhouses to the list of rooftop structures that
may be excluded from height limitations under the
building code and from being considered an
additional story under the building code when a
greenhouse and any other structures would occupy
in aggregate of no more than 33 1/3 percent of the
roof's area. The bill has been amended from its
original version by adding a provision which

extends greenhouses' exclusion from height

limitations and the exemption from being counted

as an additional story for buildings built prior

Resolution 507 calls on the State Legislature to amend the New York State Real Property Tax Law to allow the Green Roof Tax Abatement to extend to owners who produce live food producing plants. The Green Roof Tax Abatement does not clearly allow for vegetable roof growing as it does not contain certain language classifying a Green Roof as one that is covered by live food producing plants. Green Roofs can, in addition to providing storm water management and air pollution control, provide new opportunities for urban agriculture. The Council calls on the State Legislature to provide new opportunities for urban agriculture. The Council calls on the State Legislature to also amend the Real Property Tax Law to clearly allow the Green Roof Tax Abatement to be extended to live food producing plants, which would allow for more Green Roof owners to take advantage of the Green Roof Tax Abatement and result in more fresher locally

Here I go. I'm going to be voting no on Intro
338-A. I don't know if it is a citywide problem,
but I know from personal and direct contact with
the Brooklyn Department of Buildings that the
abuse of greenhouses for the purpose of illegal
conversions is becoming rampant in and around
southern Brooklyn. I have found the Buildings
Department is utterly and totally incapable of
dealing with it, even when it's pointed out to
them directly by the local elected officials, so
God help a citizen who is living next door to
someone who has illegally converted a greenhouse.
The purpose of Intro 338-A is to encourage
greenhouses, and that would be great if we were
actually building greenhouses, but I can't in good
conscience vote for this piece of legislation
until and unless we have an ability to stop the
abuse, so I vote aye on the resolution and no on
Intro 338-A.
