CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Okay. Excuse
the delay. Please everyone show their ID before
they can come into the meeting. This is the Land
Use Committee for September 7 <sup>th</sup> , 2011. We're going
to consider the few items. I want to introduce
the members that are here: Council Members Jumaane
Williams, Dan Garodnick, Maria del Carmen Arroyo,
Rosie Mendez, Dan Halloran, Vinny Ignizio, Diana
Reyna-now that doesn't work; anybody could show
that-Peter Koo, Al Vann, Larry Seabrook, Charles
Barron, Inez Dickens and James Sanders.

We are going to consider the following items. First is a disposition of city-owned property, the HHC. It's in Council Member Dickens' district in Manhattan Community Board 10, and the item number is 20125029 HHM. It's to transfer of property located at 264-272 West 118<sup>th</sup> Street for use by Harlem Hospital Center. We also have an amendment to a previously approved UDAP. We've been joined by Council Members Lappin, Lander and Jackson. To a previously approved UDAP to create housing for low-income artists in Council Member Mark-Viverito's district. It's called the El Barrio Artspace, Manhattan Community

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Board II, item number 20125031 HAM. We're going
to-there's a modification for a project located
213 East 99 <sup>th</sup> Street. And we have a third party
transfer of residential buildings in Council
Members Reyna, Vann, Eugene and Mealy's district,
Brooklyn Community Boards 3, 4, 8, 12 and 16,
20125041 HAK. We also have a third party transfer
of vacant land in the districts of Council Members
Dilan, Eugene, Fidler, Nelson, Brooklyn Community
Board 12, 14, 16, 18, item number 20125042 HAK.

We have two sidewalk cafes—one in Council Member Reyna's district called Lodge, Brooklyn Community Board 1. It's a sidewalk café at 318 Grand Street, item number 20115678 TCK, and a restaurant known as the Old Town Hot Pot in Manhattan Community Board 4 in the Speaker's district, item number 20115769 TCM. It's a sidewalk café at 70 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

Then we have one last item, which is the item in Council Member Recchia's district. It's an amendment to the zoning map in Brooklyn Community Board 13, Land Use item number 451, item number C110058 ZMK. It's known as Ocean Dreams. It's an amendment to the zoning map and four

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special permits to facilitate a mixed use
development at the western end of the Coney Island
Boardwalk, and that's item number 451 through 455,
which are related. One other one-sorry-the
Century 21 text amendment, which is an amendment
to the zoning text to facilitate the expansion of
Century 21 in Council Member Chin's district,
Manhattan Community Board 1, item number N100307
ZRM. This is to create a waiver of accessory off-
street loading berths within a special Manhattan
district-the Century 21, which we know has been a
major retailer and a major support to the lower
Manhattan area, especially after what happened in
9/11.

I have three more landmarks.

Interior landmark for the City Service Building,
the first floor interior, in Council Member Chin's
district, Land Use number 458, item number
20125023 HKM. It's to designate the interior
first floor of the City Service Building located
at 70 Pine Street. And then there is the land
marking of the City Service Building at 70 Pine
Street—the outside of the building. That item
number is 20125204 HKM, and then finally, there's

2	a special permit to allow retail use of a building
3	at 38-40 Grand Street in Council Member Chin's
4	district, Land Use item number 460. Council
5	Member Chin again has been working with them to
6	make this happen. That item number is C110235
7	ZZM, and again, that's for a modified use and
8	regulations to allow a ground floor retail use in
9	the cellar of an existing five-story building.
10	Would any member like to speak on any of the items
11	on today's agenda, knowing that they've been well-
12	discussed in the Subcommittees? Council Member
13	Dickens?
14	COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: Thank you
15	so much, Mr. Chair, and this is mainly because I
16	want to antagonize my colleague from Brooklyn,
17	Council Member Barron and—do I hear a hand clap
18	for that?

21	COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: I want to
22	thank my colleagues at Zoning and the chair of
23	Zoning, Chair Weprin, for supporting this effort.
24	This is a very important transfer of property to

Harlem Hospital because the lease that Harlem

Hospital had at the Sydenham Clinic on 125 <sup>th</sup> Street
was not renewed and so those clinics, which
includes pre-natal healthcare as well as
mammograms, et cetera would be forced to go into
already small quarters at Harlem Hospital proper,
so this will allow for that clinic to relocate
just a mere few blocks away. It's a wonderful
building. I went through the building. Harlem
Hospital has been renting that space and paying
rent all of this time, and had some mental health
clinics there, and I wanted them protected as
well. And so this will allow Harlem Hospital to
be able to be effective for the community. I want
to thank all my colleagues for voting for this.
Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Any other members or any other comments on today's agenda? We've been joined by Council Member Joel Rivera, Council Member Brad Lander—I think I got everybody. I said Jessica earlier. She popped in and popped out—Jessica Lappin—Council Member Steve Levin.
