2	CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Good morning,
3	everyone. I am Mark Weprin. I'm chair of the
4	Zoning and Franchises Subcommittee and I thank
5	everyone for being here today. I'm joined my
6	following colleagues who are on the Committee:
7	from Manhattan, Jessica Lappin and Dan Garodnick;
8	my colleague from Queens to my left, Leroy Comrie;
9	all the way to the right from the Bronx, Joel
10	Rivera; and Diana Reyna who's from Brooklyn and
11	Queens. To my right is Christian Hilton, the
12	counsel to the Committee. We have seven cafes on
13	today and we're going to start with the first one
14	on our agenda, which is 529 Fabiane's Cafe and
15	Pastry. I'm going to call Robert Callahan
16	[phonetic] up. Mr. Callahan happens to represent
17	four different cafes today. Mr. Callahan, if it's
18	okay with you, we'll do them one, two, three,
19	four. Okay. So, if you could start with 529,
20	Fabiane's and describe the application and any
21	information you want to read to the record.
22	ROBERT CALLAHAN: Yes. Dear
23	Council Member Reyna, this letter should serve as
24	our agreement with your district office and
25	Community Board 1 that we will commit to the

2	following: arrange our tables in a way that will
3	leave a three foot clearance from the fire escape
4	ladderOh, I'm sorrymy name is Robert
5	Callahanarrange our tables in a way that will
6	leave a three foot clearance from the fire escape
7	ladder that is above our cafe. If this is not
8	possible, we will remove one or two tables to
9	accomplish this. We will remove the bench on
10	North 5th Street. We will have a three foot wait
11	service aisle available in the sidewalk cafe at
12	all times. If there are any questions or anything
13	else that is required, please call Michael Kelley
14	[phonetic]. Sincerely Fabiane Lima [phonetic],
15	Vice President.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you, Mr.

Callahan. I'm going to call on Council Member

Reyna whose district this is in.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Thank you,
Mr. Chair. Hi, how are you? Good to meet you. I
just wanted to thank you for coming down, taking
the time from your busy schedule of leading a
business to be able to come and represent your
business. I just wanted to make sure that these
particular items had been addressed, and as you

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have read into the record, that we continue to
just allow for these particular points to continue
to be in operation and just the dialogue between
our officesto be able to provide any assistance
to you moving forward for your business to
continue to flourish in the neighborhood. So
thank you very much.

ROBERT CALLAHAN: We'd like to thank you and we look forward to that dialogue.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Great. Love happy people. Look at that. Anyone on the panel want to make a comment or question? Seeing none, thank you on this item. We're going close that item and move on to the next one, which also is represented by Mr. Callahan. It's 530, Atlas Cafe, also in Council Member Reyna's district. Mr. Callahan? We're joined by Robert Jackson from Manhattan. Mr. Callahan?

ROBERT CALLAHAN: Yes. My name is
Robert Callahan, and I am representing Atlas Cafe.

Dear Council Member Reyna, this letter should
serve as our agreement with your district office
and Community Board 1 that we will commit to the
following: we will arrange our tables according to

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the sidewalk care plans and it necessary, remove
any tables and chairs to provide a nine foot
clearance from the traffic light, remove all
planters and illegal signs attached to them, we
will remove any tables and chairs that obstruct
the fire escape ladder, and we will leave a three
foot clearance. If there are any questions or
anything else is required, please call Michael
Kelley. Sincerely, Lucca Pacone [phonetic], Vice
President.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you again, Mr. Callahan. I once again will ask

Council Member Reyna--would you like to make a comment on this discussion?

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Yes. Thank you, Mr. Chair. Mr. Callahan, thank you so much for coming down and representing both of these businesses. I just wanted to inform you if you can pass this on—the message to the business owners—we're in discussion with DCA to try to figure out how do we deal with non undercutting the beautification in and around the establishment of the small business where planters are considered to be obstruction as opposed to part of

a beautification processthat one's not reflected
in the scope of work for the architectural plans
that are filed, then have to be removed or the
cost of trying to amend the plans to reflect them.
So we hope that we can deal with this in a cost
effective way for the business owner, and what
would be in the safety of the public so that both
parties are able to be in a happy medium. These
are two establishments of which were probably one
of the first sidewalk cafes in my neighborhood,
and so I want to thank both establishments for
continuing to do business and just beautifying
what is Havemeyer Street with local restaurants,
and we hope to continue to work with them on the
merchants' association that we're working on in
the near future.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you.

Anybody else have any comments? Seeing none, Mr. Callahan, thank you. We're going to close number 530, and then we're going to skip--I apologize to the other people here--but we're going to skip to

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2	532, Lunella 'cause Mr. Callahan has two other
3	items that he is representing, and we'll let him
4	get right to it. So, Mr. Callahan, number 532,

Lunella in Council Member Chin's district.

ROBERT CALLAHAN: Yes. My name is Robert Callahan. I'm representing Lunella. Council Member Chin, this letter should serve as our agreement with your district office and Community Board 2 that we will commit to the following: arrange our tables in a way that will leave a three foot clearance from the fire escape ladder that is above our cafe, we will comply with all fire safety rules, we will maintain a three foot wait service aisle at all times, we will configure our sidewalk cafe according to the approved plans, we will remove the illegal menu board and we will remove any outside audio speakers. If there are any questions, please call my office. Signed, Guyataina [phonetic] Russo, President of Lunella.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Mr. Callahan, the concern of the fire escape also is that it has a way to get down--is that something that is going to be addressed? Not just the space between the

2	awning and the fire escape, but will it be able to
3	come down? Is there room to come down? Is there
4	a space or

ROBERT CALLAHAN: Yes, when the ladder comes down, there will be a three foot clearance around that ladder for the ladder to come down and anyone to come down that ladder.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Is there an opening in the awning? Can they get down through the awning? Do you know?

ROBERT CALLAHAN: Yes, and it's in the process of being done right now.

understand Council Member Chin's office is okay with this, and understands these discussions, so I'm going to ask anyone on the panel if they want to comment or question? Seeing none, thank you very much. We're going to move on to our next item. Right ahead. We're going to skip to the last item on the agenda, 535, S.P.Q.R. Ristorante S.P.Q.R., and Mr. Callahan, it is your last item, so you can start on that when you can.

ROBERT CALLAHAN: Yes. My name is Robert Callahan, and I am representing S.P.Q.R.

Dear Council Member Chin, this letter should serve as an agreement with your office and to assure the community board that I will commit to the following: we will maintain our sidewalk cafe in accordance with plans approved by the Department of Consumer Affairs, we will maintain our tables flush to the building line, we have disconnected and removed the amplified sound device that was installed on our property. This letter pertains to the current renewal application for S.P.Q.R. and signed Perry Chrisatelli [phonetic],

in Council Member Chin's district. She is at the doorway waving at us, and mouthed the words to me, "I'm fine with this." We are glad that she visited us here today. Does anyone have any comments or questions now that we have this agreement in writing? Okay. One compliment on the Christmas decorations you could bring back, we got from Council Member Reyna. Mr. Callahan, we appreciate that. We're going to close this item, and we excuse you to go back to work.

ROBERT CALLAHAN: Thank you very

Alright. We're now going to move to Rebecca

Houlihan [phonetic] who is representing Gusto, I

believe, right? Gusto in Speaker Quinn's

district. Ms. Houlihan, please state your name

for the record and start when you're ready.

REBECCA HOULIHAN: My name is Rebecca Houlihan, and I'm here representing Gusto Restaurante e Bar Americano [phonetic]. Dear Council Member Quinn, this letter serves as our agreement with the Chair, Council Member Mark Weprin and the encompassing members of the Subcommittee on Zoning and Franchises that we will commit to the following: the size of the sidewalk café will be reduced from 13 tables and 26 seats to 10 tables and 20 seats, specially removing a table and an accompanying two chairs which currently block the restaurant entrance, and two tables and four chairs from the middle section of the western portion of the café. The remaining tables and chairs in the western portion of the café will be centered between entrances of 60 and 62 Greenwich Avenue in a way that retains three

foot clearance from a stand pipe [phonetic].
Similarly the two tables and the four chairs on
the eastern portion of the café will be centered
between the two doorways of 60 Greenwich Avenue.
The three foot waiter service aisle on the Western
portion of the café will be moved from the outside
of the café to between the 8 tables and 16 chairs
so as to prevent service from the public sidewalk.
This waiter service aisle will additionally not
extend to the entrance of 62 Greenwich Avenue,
which is a non operational door. The two railings
currently in use at our sidewalk café will be
indicated on our plans. All of the aforementioned
changes will be reflected in revised plans
submitted to the New York City Department of
Consumer Affairs. A copy of the approved,
modified plans will be posted inside the
restaurant for employee reference. Manager,
Rebecca Houlihan-that's me-will oversee daily set
up of the sidewalk café. The four planters within
the sidewalk café zone have been removed and they
have not been indicated on the sidewalk café
plans. We will not operate the sidewalk café
prior to noon on Sundays. If there are any

questions, please call my office. Thank you.
Sasha Muniac [phonetic].

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you, Ms. Houlihan. I appreciate that. I understand from Speaker Quinn's office that they are aware of this agreement and approve of it. I do want to let you know that you should submit the plan you gave to us—the revised plan—to Department of Consumer Affairs as well, so just make sure they get a copy as well. Does anyone have any comments or questions? Seeing none again, we thank you very much, Ms. Houlihan. We're going to close that item.

Now we are going to move on to—actually, we're going to Land Use No. 534, which is Clem's. John Clement [phonetic] is here, and Mr. Clement, please state your name for the record and then describe and read into the record the agreement you have. This is in Council Member Reyna's district as well.

JOHN CLEMENT: Good morning. My
name is John Clement. I am the treasurer and
general manager of Grand Endeavors d.b.a. Clem's,
264 Grand Street, Brooklyn, New York, 11211. Dear

Chairperson Weprin and Council Member Reyna,
recently our business, Clem's Bar, located 264
Grand Street, Brooklyn, New York, was visited by
Peter Janocik [phonetic]. Mr. Janocik informed us
that although our sidewalk café was violation
free, an adjacent tree guard installed by the
building owner and a bicycle rack instead by the
DOT were in fact not DOT compliant. Both the bike
rack and the tree guard were installed after our
café had been in operation for many years and
without our knowledge. We have informed the
owners of the building that the tree guard needs
to be removed. They are eager to apply and the
process to remove it has begun. We would like to
see the back rack remain as the community utilizes
it. Our café has been in good standing for over
eight years with no opposition from local
Community Board 1. We look forward to having our
license renewed and continuing our business in the
future. Thank you.
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CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you, Mr.

Clement. - - I understand is the back rack is an allowed grandfathered use, so that's okay, but the railing around the tree is illegal—this blue

18 there is good neighbor to neighbor relationships.

19 Sometimes there is issues that are unknown to the

20 small business that we are able to mitigate and

21 this is the opportunity for that. Luckily as far

as your business is concerned, there are no

23 complaints, but we wanted to just assure that

there are compliancy with what are the plans on

25 | file, and as I have stated before to Mr. Callahan,

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representing two other businesses, we want to make sure that we continue our discussions with the Department of Consumer Affairs on the issues of tree guards and trees that perhaps have not been requested by the small business, nor the property owner that have been installed or bike racks such as the one you just indicated to be able to not be the responsibility of the small business because in fact, if there was an inspection that the onus would be on the small business if a fine were to be issued, and so we're trying to be on the preventive side of things and further dialogue with the Department of Consumer Affairs will allow us to figure out how to best deal with these issues. Thank you.

Council Member Reyna. Does anyone else have any

questions or comments? Mr. Clement, we appreciate

you coming down. We wish you luck with your

business and I'm glad you've been so cooperative.

Dear Council Member Garodnick, this letter serves as our agreement with the Chair, Council Member Mark Weprin and the encompassing members of the Subcommittee on Zoning and Franchises, that we will commit to the following: to the removal of the planters permanently unless a permit is obtained -- see the attached photo showing the removal of the planters; to the removal of the heaters permanently unless a permit is obtained-see attached photo showing the removal of heaters; the tables will be set accordingly to the approved plans by the Department of Consumer Affairs. restaurant's doors and windows will be closed every night at 11:30. Number 5, there has been an isolated incident on September 18th, 2011 during a birthday party celebration where the music was played louder and the restaurant closed at 1 am.
