CHAIRPERSON KOPPELL: Committee on
Mental Health, Mental Retardation, Alcoholism,
Drug Abuse and Disability Services. I'm Oliver
Koppell, the chair. We're here to vote on
proposed Resolution 94-A by Council Member Dromm
and Council Member, you want to make a brief
statement?

COUNCIL MEMBER DROMM: Thank you very much, Mr. Chair. I appreciate your leadership on this issue. The passage of Resolution 94 will send a powerful message to Albany that our city and state are ready to join 16 states and the District of Columbia in legalizing medical marijuana. It's time for New York State Legislature to catch up with what a majority of New Yorkers already know. It's wrong to deny this palliative measure to patients who so desperately need it. Medical studies have shown the effectiveness of marijuana in treating a wide range of conditions from glaucoma to appetite loss associated with cancer treatment. Passing medical marijuana legislation means these patients will no longer be criminalized by the state simply for seeking relief from crippling pain and other

debilitating symptoms. Resolution 94 is a	about
valuing true compassion over rigid bureaud	cracy.
It's about prioritizing the health of our	
community members over the federal war on	drugs.
I hope this resolution will not only push	state
legislators to act on medical marijuana, b	but will
also move along the larger discussion abou	ut drug
policy and enforcement in New York City.	In
recent memory, we have seen the long over	due
reform of the Rockefeller Drug Laws. We h	have even
heard positive words from the city's	
administration about limiting arrests for	minor
possession though actual implementation re	emains a
concern. Passing medical marijuana legis	lation
will be one more step toward a realistic a	and
humane approach to drug policy. I want to	o thank
all of my colleagues who signed on as co-s	sponsors,
with special thanks to Council member Oliv	ver
Koppell for shepherding the bill through	the
Committee on Mental Health, Mental Retarda	ation,
Alcoholism, Drug Abuse and Disability Serv	vices and
I also want to acknowledge , Council N	Member
Koppell for his efforts. I encourage all	of my
colleagues here today to vote yes on this	

2 important legislation.

CHAIRPERSON KOPPELL: 3 thank you very much. I don't want to read my whole 4 5 statement. I'll submit it for the record, but let me just say that on November 11th of last year, we 6 held a joint hearing with the Subcommittee on Drug Abuse regarding the resolution and I think that 9 that hearing demonstrated the laudable purpose of the resolution and I think evidence both at the 10 11 hearing and subsequently indicate that some of the 12 concerns with respect to the health effects of the 13 use of marijuana were addressed, so I hope we'll 14 pass this. I'm proud of the fact that in the 15 assembly years ago, I voted to decriminalize small 16 amounts of marijuana and I voted against the 17 Rockefeller Drug Laws when they were proposed, and 18 this in my opinion, although a laudable measure, 19 does not go really as far as we ought to go with 20 respect to decriminalization of marijuana, but I 21 won't go into that. So I support the resolution. 22 I'm pleased that Ruben Wills and Gale Brewer are 23 here as well. Ruben Wills, chair of our 24 Subcommittee, would you like to make any statement? Okay. Okay, so we'll take a vote. 25
