2	CHAIRPERSON BREWER: Okay. Today
3	the Committee on Governmental Operations is
4	meeting to vote on Intro 698-A sponsored by
5	Council Member Margaret Chin. This bill seeks to
6	modernize the notice requirements for rulemaking
7	hearings by requiring city agencies to publicize
8	hearings on their websites and via other
9	electronic means. Presently city agencies are
10	required to publish notice of a proposed rule or
11	rule change in the city record at least 30 days
12	prior to a public hearing. The city record
13	however has very limited circulation outside city
14	government. Indeed, the administration estimates
15	that there are only 300 non-government subscribers
16	to city record, yet new technology enables
17	agencies to more actively publicize upcoming
18	rulemaking hearings and to engage interested
19	members of the public in the process. 698-A will
20	modernize the notice requirements for rulemaking
21	hearings by amending CAPA [phonetic] in three
22	ways; first, every city agency will be required to
23	provide information about proposed rules and
24	hearings in a prominent location on the agency's
25	website at least seven days prior to the date of

the rulemaking hearing. Although some agencies
currently place information about upcoming
hearings on their website, many do not. For those
agencies that do provide information on their
websites about upcoming rulemaking actions,
information is often difficult to find. Second,
every city agency will be required to provide in a
prominent location on the website a link to NYC
Rules, the city's one stop point of access for
information about rulemaking actions. Finally,
every city agency will be required to the greatest
extent practicable, to publicize upcoming
rulemaking hearings via electronic means that are
likely to reach interested members of the public,
such as via social networks, e-mail, and other
new technology sites. Our Committee held a
previous hearing on this bill on December 14 th ,
2011. At that time, the Committee received
testimony from the administration, the New York
technology Council and participatory politics
foundation. Each witness testified in support.
The administration offered one amendment to
require agencies to post a link to NYC Rules. The
bill had been amended to include this requirement.
