2	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA:Westchester
3	Square BID on this morning. I'll just make a few
4	brief announcements. My name is Domenic M.
5	Recchia, Jr. I'm the chair of this wonderful
6	Committee, but let me just give all my colleagues
7	some updates. Tomorrow ten o'clock sharp we have
8	Finance with Education on Medicaid and special
9	education. Okay? It's an in depth hearing and it
10	deals with services children are getting in the
11	schools on how they're billing for it. As you
12	know the administration is billing Medicaid now to
13	get reimbursed. There's lots of issues that are
14	happening. If anyone has any issues dealing with
15	services of children and how they come about and
16	billing on it, tomorrow is the day to come to the
17	hearing and ask questions about it complaints
18	with special needs children not getting the
19	services in the school or the billing and
20	especially with OTs/PTs and speech therapists—lots
21	of problems with that going on throughout the New
22	York City Department of Education. On Friday, we
23	have the scree [phonetic] bill. There's a scree

hearing on Friday with the Aging Committee. I

know it's a lot of work beyond Finance, but this

is the month and it's going to get a little hairy.
Okay? So we have that on Friday. This deals with
what we should do with scree. Should we move it
back to the Department of-DFTA [phonetic]? Should
we keep it in the Department of Finance? If we do
keep it in the Department of Finance, what do we
want? How do we want it to be set up? There's a
big issue about who answers the telephone calls
because they go to 311, and that's unacceptable to
many of my colleagues I've heard from, so please-
it's a hearing. It's going to be very
interesting. We're going to have two
commissioners testify on Friday. We're going to
have Department of Finance and the DFTA
Commissioner-the Department of Aging. Okay? So
that's going to be on Friday. Monday morning ten
o'clock is the first Finance hearing. Mark Page
[phonetic] is going first. During the preliminary
budget, we have Mr. Page go first. During the
executive, we have him go last. Okay? That works
both ways. So if you have any questions for Mr.
Page on anything to do with the budget overall
please have your questions ready. You'll be given
an opportunity to ask some questions. We're going

to start Monday morning ten o'clock sharp in the
chamber. Okay? Are the hearings in the next two
days in the chamber too? Here? Monday's Finance
hearing is in the chamber. Tomorrow's hearing is
here at 16 [phonetic]. Friday's hearing I believe
is also, but you should check anyway. Alright.
So that is what is going on for the next three
days and after Monday begins all the other
hearings dealing with the preliminary budget.
Everyone is welcome to go to as many hearings as
they want one they want to attend and ask
questions. Alright. Thank you for joining us,
Darlene Mealy. Okay. What? They're not joint.
Every Committee has their own hearing; they're not
joint. The executive budget hearings are joint
with the Committee and with Finance. Does anybody
have any questions? Okay.
What we're going to do now is—hold
on for one second
[long pause]
CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Okay. I'm

going to make my formal opening statement, and

then we're going to hear from SBS to testify.

Committee hearing. My name is Domenic M. Recchia,
Jr. Today we have only one item on our agenda,
which is legislation in the Westchester Square
BID in Council Member Jimmy Vacca's district, and
he's just arrived. He held us up.

[background conversation]

CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you.

Even though he is not on this Committee, we're going to permit him to say a few words, but let me finish my statement. If you remember the Committee on Finance held a public hearing on October 17th. The legislation was laid over 'cause 30 day notice objection. On the 29th of November, 2011, the Committee found that the notice of public hearing was not sufficient. The bill was laid over again without a vote. The public hearing was held on January 3rd, 2012. The legislation was laid over to allow a thirty day period. The objection period ended February 2nd. We heard from SBS. We will hear from SBS today to determine whether notice for the January 3rd hearing was sufficient. The first year budget for this BID is \$320,000 with about two-thirds of this budget going towards marketing and sanitation.

2	Council Member Jimmy Vacca supports this BID. We
3	will now hear from the Department of Small
4	Business Services regarding the Westchester Square
5	BID, but before we hear from SBS, I want to remind
6	my colleagues about the two more hearings that I
7	just spoke about. We have a hearing on Thursday
8	with Medicaid and education. We have Friday's on
9	scree, Gale Brewer, who is an advocate for scree.
10	She's the one who has been screaming loudly about
11	us not running properly and she supports it going
12	back to DFTA. Only joking. It's a joke.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: [off mic]
14	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Okay, so
15	please. We're going to start ten o'clock,
16	especially tomorrow. The Speaker will be at the
17	hearing tomorrow. Now, Jimmy Vacca, before we
18	have SBS testify, Jimmy, do you want to say a few
19	words? Do you want to speak after SBS? Okay, SBS
20	will testify. Let's pull up a chair. Just pull
21	up a chair, Andy Schwartz.
22	ANDREW SCHWARTZ: Thank you. Happy
23	Leap Day. Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members
24	of the Finance Committee. I'm Andrew Schwartz,

first deputy commissioner of the Department of

Small Business Services. I'm here today with Eddy
Ng and Laura Rothrock [phonetic] from the BID
program. As required by the law, the Westchester
Square BID steering committee mailed the summary
of the City Council resolution to each owner of
real property within the proposed district at the
address shown on the latest city assessment roll
or to such other persons as registered with the
city to receive tax bills concerning real property
within the district and to tenants of each
building within the proposed district. In
addition, SBS arranged for the required
publication of a copy of the summary of the
resolution in the city record. We are pleased to
report on the result of the objections filed with
the city clerk against the establishment of the
Westchester Square Business Improvement District
at the conclusion of the objection period 5pm
February 3 rd , 2012, and taking into considerations
any objections postmarked by that date. There
were no valid objections filed with the city
clerk. One invalid objection was filed as there
was no proof of property ownership. The total
assessed valuation of property within the district

б

is \$32,289,212 and the total number of properties
is 87, which are held by approximately 77 property
owners. Our review concludes that the level of
objection files in terms of either the number of
property owners or percentage of assessed
valuation is within the accepted threshold needed
to advance the bill for favorable consideration by
the full City Council. Accordingly SBS requests
the Council to approve the establishment of the
Westchester Square BID in the Bronx. The
Department of Small Business Services supports the
establishment of the BID. In our judgment it will
improve business conditions and the quality of
life in the Westchester Square area, making it a
better place to live, work and visit and laying
the groundwork for further neighborhood
development activities in the Bronx. Thank you
and we're happy to answer any questions you may
have.

I want to thank the staff. I want to thank
Tanisha Edwards, who worked very hard on this. I
want to thank Preston Niblack. I want to thank
Jeffrey Rodus [off mic] and Ralph. Okay. Okay.
Jimmy, it's your show, Jim, and Al Vann has joined
us. Jimmy?

Mr. Chair and I would urge the Finance Committee to vote in favor as well as the full Council.

It's my privilege to represent Westchester Square and to represent merchants that have now banded together to form this BID. The Westchester Square commercial area was once a very, very thriving part of the East Bronx. We experienced bad times. We lost many of our key stores, many of our anchor stores left. We think that a BID will bring us back. We are a hub for transportation. We're in a perfect position in the East Bronx. The merchants, the community very much worked now for four years. This is a dream come true for us, and

2	I think that we are on our way back with this
3	approval today. Thank you.
4	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Okay. Thank
5	you very much, Jimmy Vacca and I guess you're
6	supporting it and you want everyone to vote aye.
7	Is that correct? Okay. Darlene Mealy has a quick
8	question I understand.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: I just
10	wanted to ask if you find out the owner is not the
11	owner what do you do in regards to that? Do you
12	still put them in the BID?
13	ANDREW SCHWARTZ: If they are on
14	the city rolls they are going to be notified. If
15	at after the point of being assessed or billed for
16	it, they're not the owner, they could go to the
17	Department of Finance and correct that.
18	COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: Thank you.
19	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you
20	very much. We've been joined by Fernando Cabrera
21	from the Bronx. Okay. Any other questions? Not
22	seeing any further questions, please call the
