CHAIRPERSON MEALY: All right. So I am very proud for her. Would you like to have some words?

SANTE CRADO MORGAN: Thank you for letting me come. This is a wonderful opportunity. I won't forget this day, and I will enjoy this day.

CHAIRPERSON MEALY: Thank you.

This morning, the Committee will vote on proposed intro 707-A. This legislation would require the Mayor to notify this council of cost overruns on large contracts for capital projects. We first discussed today's bill last October in connection with an oversight hearing in the City's management of its ITS contracts. During that hearing the administration acknowledged the role that the Council could play in helping to keep contracts on

track. Now in the past the council has done its
best to conduct oversight hearings once cost
overruns have come to light, but we have been
limited. We have received too little information,
too late. With today's legislation, the Council
will be able to improve the timeliness and the
quality of its oversight of contracts that begins
to go off course. And now I would like to turn it
over to the bill's sponsor, Council Member Letitia
Tames

My name is Letitia James, and I represent Downtown Brooklyn, and today I'm the proud sponsor of Intro 707-A 2011. As most of you know, when I served as Chair of the Contracts Committee, the Committee held hearings on the outsourcing of public services to the private sector, as well as two oversight hearings on the Office of Payroll Administrations contracts, otherwise known as CityTime. I criticized the contract at that time as costly and poorly managed. Since 2010 I have requested that the council's contract committee investigate a wide range of capital projects which have unfortunately engaged in cost overruns. They

include but are not limited to the following: the	
Emergency Communications Transformation Program,	a
\$286 million contract; NYCAPS program, a \$1.95	
million contract which is run out of the Health	
and Hospitals Corporation contract with Navigat,	a
private consulting company; and the list goes on,	
and on, and on. Specifically, this bill would do	
two things. Specifically, the Mayor would be	
required to notify the Council at two points in	
time. First, the Council will be notified of the	
initial request for a cost increase, and	
additionally, once the project extension or	
modification is taking place, the Council would b	e
notified of any additional contract extensions or	
modification that result in a 10% cost increase	
above the revised contract value. As most of you	
know, CityTime, which was originally budgeted at	
\$63 million, ballooned to almost \$600 million,	
resulting in the biggest scandal within this	
administration. And this is an attempt to rein	
those costs in. I thank all of my colleagues for	
all of your efforts in this regard, and I would	
urge all of my colleagues to vote yes on this	
bill. Thank you, madam chair.
