2	CHAIRMAN	RECCHIA:	All	Council
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Members please find your seats at the table. Good morning, welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. My name is Domenic M. Recchia, Jr., and I'm the chair of the wonderful committee. Today, we have a number of items on our agenda. Before we do that, I'd like to introduce all of my wonderful colleagues who have joined us here today. To my right, we have Al Vann, Joel Rivera, Julissa Ferreras. We have Diana Reyna, Jimmy Van Bramer. To my left, we have James Oddo, Vincent Ignizio and Robert Jackson.

First, we have three Land Use items. All Land Use items are HDFCs and will receive property tax exemptions through HPD. The first property is in the St. Lucy's Apartments, located in Manhattan Council Member Melissa Mark-Viverito's district. This property will receive a full property tax exemption.

The second Land Use item is the Mutual Housing Association of New York of Brooklyn, located in Council Member Mealy's district. This property will receive a full property tax exemption for the rehab of eight

2 units of rental housing for low income families.

The last Land use item is Savoy

Park, located in Manhattan in Council Member

Dickens' district. This property will receive a

full property tax exemption for the rehab of five

buildings with 1,800 units of rental housing for

low income families. All three members support

these land use items.

Our next item is a transparency reso. This reso sets forth designational changes in youth, local organizations receiving funding as designations or changes or certain organizations that receive funding pursuant to initiatives in the 2012 and 2011 expense budget.

For clarification purposes, it is to be noted that organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contracts, or the Council or any other entity are identified with asterisk next to its name.

Additionally, with all transparency reso, Council Members that have a conflict, they must make a statement before they vote, if they

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2 have a conflict, you know, today and at the Stated 3 meeting.

Our next piece of legislation is executive budget extender. The Administration has asked us to extend the date for submission of Fiscal 2013 Executive Budget April 26th to May 3rd, in order to give the Office of Management and Budget time to incorporate information from this year's income tax returns into their receive forecasts for the executive budget.

extra time to release the executive budget, the

Council will need extra time to hold the executive

budget hearings, which will now conclude on June

7th rather than May 25th. So, we're going to

start later and we're going to end later. So my

Council Members could adjust their calendars,

being on the Finance Committee. In the Finance

Commission, as a member, you're required to come

to every hearing.

This legislation would also extend the other Charter-mandated dates related to the executive budget actions taken by other officials, such as the Independent Budget Office and the Bohr

President. The legislation also changes the
target budget adoption date, the date for the
Mayor's submission of a revenue estimate and the
date for fixing the tax rates, from June 5th to
June 13th. So, Tuesday, June 13th is our goal for
budget adoption.

Did I hear, someone made a comment about that? We've been joined by Karen Koslowitz and Leroy Comrie.

Our next and last item on the agenda is an expense mod MN-3. This mod implements expense budget appropriations which were reflected by the City's February plan. The fund transfer totals approximately \$710 million, but the net effect of this modification is zero.

On the items for today, representatives from HPD are here to answer any questions on the Land Use items. OMB is here to answer any questions you may have on the mod. And representatives from the Finance Division are here to answer any questions on the transparency resolution.

Does anybody have any questions? Without seeing any questions, no on has any

a statement on behalf of Council Member Inez		
Dickens, who could not be with us this morning.		
She would just like her position to be made very		
clear that she supports this development in her		
district.		

There are a total of 1,810 units,

1,009 units out of the 1,800 are rent stabilized

which equates to 61 percent of the total units

being rent stabilized. She supports this. She

was able to guarantee that family size households

were a required overwhelming percentage of the

stabilized units. As far as the market rate units

are concerned, only 305 out of 1,800 are

considered market rate, which equates to 16

percent of the total units.

She also says that she is pleased that L and M Development is taking its role as a stakeholder in her community very seriously, by providing community enhancements that will benefit residents not only of her community but the rest of the Borough of Manhattan. She looks forward to working with L and M and seeing to this project is completed and continuing to have a working
