amend the New York City Building Code in relation

to sun control devices.

In brief, a sun control device can be used to combat heat gains in buildings, it can reduce glare and improve occupant comfort. If properly designed, sun control devices can decrease air conditioning loads between 30 and 60%. The New York City Building Code currently only allows sun control devices to extend ten

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inches from a building's façade, decreasing their			
effectiveness. Proposed Intro 340-A would			
increase the maximum allowable projection of a sun			
control device beyond the street line of a			
building to two to six

CHAIRPERSON DILAN: --2 feet to 6 inches, which corresponds to revisions to the City Zoning resolution scheduled to be voted upon today by the full Council at today's Stated Meeting.

amended from its original version by adding sun control devices to an additional section of the New York City Building Code regulation on the use of awnings, the addition of sun control devices to a list of encroachments of a street line subject to area limitations, extending the allowable projection for balconies, including railings and supporting brackets from 22 inches to 2 feet to 6 inches beyond the street line, allowing sun control devices supported entirely from the building to project not more than 2 feet, 6 inches beyond the street line if no part of the device is less than 8 feet above the ground or sidewalk

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2	level. And lastly, it was amended by the
3	enactment clause to provide for an effective date
4	of July 1, 2010.
