2	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Can we call
3	the members of Land Use Committee back into the
4	room? Okay, we're going to officially start the
5	Land Use Committee for July 17 th , 2012. I'm Leroy
6	Comrie, City Council Member. We've been joined by
7	Council Members and still joined by Council
8	Members Dan Halloran, Al Vann, Maria del Carmen
9	Arroyo, Jumaane Williams, Robert Jackson, Steve
10	Levin, Jessica Lappin, Annabel Palma, Inez
11	Dickens, Brad Lander, Charles Barron, Margaret
12	Chin, Joel Rivera, Rosie Mendez, Diana Reyna,
13	Vinny Ignizio is in the room, and James Sanders.
14	We ready to move forward with the formal vote the
15	adoption of Land Use Items No. 632, 633, 634, and
16	635, which are all related to the NYU University
17	Corps located within Manhattan Community Board 12,
18	Council Member Margaret Chin's district, Land Use
19	Items No. C120077MMM, Item No. C120122ZMM and
20	M120123ZRM and C120124ZSM.
21	We've all heard in the subcommittee
22	all of the details regarding the expansion of the
23	NYU Corps and the program, the core plan overview.
24	We won't repeat it again for the full committee,
25	since everyone was here. The members that wanted

2	to ask questions had an opportunity to ask them
3	during the subcommittee. Council Member Chin made
4	an opening statement during the subcommittee. I
5	would ask in deference of time that she would not
6	have to repeat that again. It was very extensive
7	and very thorough and very detailed. So unless
8	there is some technical issue that I'm not
9	covering, I think I've covered everything. We can
10	move ahead to a vote on this issue. I would
11	recommend an aye vote on the issue with the one -
12	- that there are some promises that were made to
13	myself, Council Member Dickens, regarding the
14	LBE plan [phonetic] to be finalized by the 25^{th} ,
15	and we will get that done. With that, I would
16	recommend a yes vote to the four items, which are
17	coupled. Again, those are item numbers 632
18	through 635, which are related. That's the only
19	thing on today's agenda as we voted everything
20	else. The next subcommittee meetings will be held
21	on July 23^{rd} . On July 23^{rd} , the next subcommittee
22	meetings will be held. His seven looked like a
23	nine to me, and the full Land Use Committee will
24	be held on September-see again, on July 24 th .
25	Wishful thinking, right? July 23^{rd} is the subs.

3	that, I would recommend an aye vote unless Council
4	Member Chin wanted to make another statement? I
5	just wanted to make sure you weren't trying to
6	convince her to make another statement. Alright.
7	With that, we will have the clerk call the roll.
8	COMMITTEE CLERK: William Martin,
9	committee clerk. Roll call vote Committee on Land
10	Use. Council Member Comrie?
11	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Aye.
12	COMMITTEE CLERK: Rivera?
13	COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: I vote aye.
14	COMMITTEE CLERK: Reyna?
15	COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Aye.
16	COMMITTEE CLERK: Barron?
17	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I want to
18	encourage my colleagues to vote no and send this
19	project back to the people and let the people
20	decide what they want in their neighborhood. With
21	that, I vote no.
22	COMMITTEE CLERK: Jackson?
23	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: All things
24	considered, thank you, Margaret, and I'm glad
25	you've reached a compromise agreement even though

2	everything was not had on either side, all things
3	considered, I've been through this process before.
4	I vote aye. Thank you.
5	COMMITTEE CLERK: Sanders?
6	COUNCIL MEMBER SANDERS: With
7	certain qualms, I vote aye.
8	COMMITTEE CLERK: Vann?
9	COUNCIL MEMBER VANN: explain
10	my vote.
11	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: So ordered.
12	COUNCIL MEMBER VANN: Explain
13	my vote. I find it difficult to vote against the
14	expression that so many people who live in this
15	district have. I'm very sensitive to that, but
16	I'm also very aware of Council Member Chin's
17	commitment to her community and integrity and
18	intelligence that she brings to this body
19	negotiations. I tend to be supportive of members'
20	positions in their particular district. I wish it
21	was one and the same, but I know that you have
22	negotiated on behalf of your community and what
23	you believe is in the best interest. There may be
24	factors that you are aware of that may not be
25	known throughout. In any event, it's difficult,

2	but I vote aye in support of you and in support of
3	the good will of this body. I vote aye.
4	COMMITTEE CLERK: Garodnick?
5	COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: Aye.
6	COMMITTEE CLERK: Palma?
7	COUNCIL MEMBER PALMA: Aye.
8	COMMITTEE CLERK: Arroyo?
9	COUNCIL MEMBER ARROYO: Aye.
10	COMMITTEE CLERK: Dickens?
11	COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS:
12	Recognizing the hard work that Council Member Chin
13	has done, knowing that this ULEP [phonetic]
14	process is very difficult and with the commitment
15	of Chair Comrie that changes will be done to the
16	MWLBE, I vote aye.
17	COMMITTEE CLERK: Lappin?
18	COUNCIL MEMBER LAPPIN: Aye.
19	COMMITTEE CLERK: Mendez?
20	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Permission
21	to explain my vote?
22	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: So ordered.
23	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Thank you.
24	This is a very difficult decision for me. The
25	easy thing for me to do would be to vote no or

2	abstain and make a lot of my people very happy.
3	I'm not happy with this plan. I think it's a
4	better plan than what we started out with.
5	Ideally, I would like to see NYU not build
6	anything ever again, but I know that's not going
7	to happen. I have to say going a few years back
8	the process that I went through with NYU to save
9	the Met Food [phonetic] was a process where we had
10	to get to a point where not either Met Food or NYU
11	was happy, but some common ground and years later,
12	it has shown to be that that was the right thing
13	for NYU and for Met Food. I will be voting yes on
14	this as a vote of faith in my colleague and my
15	sister Council Member Chin and as this process
16	goes through, I hope years from now when we look
17	at this that although the community is not happy
18	and maybe NYU is not happy with what it has given
19	up, that years from now we are in a better place
20	than we are now. I vote yes. Thank you.

22	COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: I vote yes.
23	COMMITTEE CLERK: Lander?
24	COUNCIL MEMBER LANDER: Aye.

3	Congratulations to Council Member Chin for
4	striking a delicate balance in what is a very
5	difficult process with many competing interests,
6	some reconcilable, some irreconcilable, but I
7	think Margaret that you did a very good job in
8	your due diligence, in representing your
9	community, in representing the interests of your
10	constituents and with that, I vote aye.
11	COMMITTEE CLERK: Weprin?
12	COUNCIL MEMBER WEPRIN: Aye.
13	COMMITTEE CLERK: Williams?
14	COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: May I be
15	excused to explain my vote?
16	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: So ordered.
17	COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Thank
18	you. I just want to echo some of the comments of
19	Council Member Mendez that this is a difficult for
20	me as well. I wish many of these universities
21	would stop the building that they're doing, but
22	also coming in with Council Member Chin whether I
23	agree with her or not agree with her, I've always
24	found her to be fair and really try to find the
25	best balance humanly possible, and so it's out of

2	that relationship I have with her and knowing the
3	energy and the research that went into here and
4	the amount of work that she did even though I'm
5	not the most happy with what we have, but I do
6	have respect for what she went through in trying
7	to balance both the university and the community's
8	needs here. I'm going to vote aye. While I have
9	NYU here, I would press upon them to please in
10	another category remain neutral in many of the
11	union problems that are going on there. Thank
12	you.
13	COMMITTEE CLERK: Ignizio?
14	COUNCIL MEMBER IGNIZIO: Yes. I
15	just want to vote aye and want to point out to my
16	colleague, Margaret Chin, who engaged in a very
17	difficult battle here, but now the real work
18	begins for the community and for you, NYU. This
19	community clearly has an issue with you, and now
20	is your opportunity to begin a new day and wipe
21	the slate clean and say we are going to be
22	responsive to them because clearly we heard today
23	no matter what you got out this, whether you were
24	for it or against it, is that the community does
25	not believe that NYU has been a good neighbor and

2	you start that rebuilding process today and under
3	the leadership of Council Member Chin, I hope you
4	take advantage of that and I hope the community
5	says we don't always win, but in the end of the
6	day, we are going to ensure that our community
7	remains a part of this pact that was created by
8	this body. I vote aye.
9	COMMITTEE CLERK: Halloran?
10	COUNCIL MEMBER HALLORAN: Mr.
11	Chair, may I be excused to explain my vote?
12	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: So ordered.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER HALLORAN: I live in
14	a district that has always had concerns with
15	development and overdevelopment and it's clear
16	that the community here has some serious concerns;
17	however, it is the practice of this body to defer
18	to the Council Member in whose district such
19	projects lie to give leadership and no one can on
20	either side of this equation doubt that Margaret
21	has worked tirelessly to try to find solutions.
22	They are not perfect. They are not going to fix
23	the problems that exist. That's clear. NYU has
24	an obligation to the community as a whole as my
25	colleagues have pointed out, but this body is

2	going to be dealing with these types of problems
3	more and more as our city grows, and we are
4	reaching a stage at which development itself is
5	going to become the watch word for the future. We
6	cannot stop building. We need people to be
7	working right now. Certainly these projects will
8	do that. There have to be safeguards. I think
9	that the way we have structured our body in terms
10	of putting restrictive covenants and declarations
11	is not sufficient. There do need to be actual
12	legal triggers that can be used. They are not
13	there now. I hope and trust in Margaret's good
14	stewardship of her community to make sure that
15	this deal does not go awry, but this body should
16	be concerning itself with these bigger issues,
17	which have not been dealt with and which we deal
18	with piecemeal every time these things come to the
19	floor, so I would encourage all of my colleagues
20	to support Margaret in this, but to also look to
21	the future because the city, its development, its
22	infrastructure is badly in need of a total look by
23	this body and we need to do that sooner rather
24	than later. In deference to the Council Member in
25	whose district this lies, I vote aye.

5	Members, please sign the Committee Report.
6	CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: I want to take

8	Benjamin [phonetic] and-quiet please-thank the
9	Land Use staff Gal Benjamin et al for everything
10	that they did. They worked with all sides in this
11	party to come to this agreement today. I wanted
12	to remind everyone that you need to be quiet as
13	you're going out, and that the next subcommittee
14	meetings will be held on the 23^{rd} and the full
15	committee on the 24^{th} . With that, the meeting for
16	July 17^{th} , 2012 Land Use Committee is hereby
17	adjourned.
