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All right, let's see, we only have one item on the calendar today, it's the Rainbow Room, which is Land Use number 745, action number 20135180 HKM in Manhattan Community Board 5. And I'm pleased to ask Kate Daly from the Landmarks Preservation Commission to come up and present it to us. Jenny's on vacation.

7	day off once in a while. My name is Kate Daly,
8	I'm the Executive Director of the Landmarks
9	Preservation Commission, and I'm here to testify
10	on the commission's designation of the Rainbow
11	Room.
12	On September 11th, 2012, the
13	Landmarks Preservation Commission held a public
14	hearing on the proposed designation of the Rainbow
15	Room and the proposed designation of the related
16	interior landmark site. The hearing had been duly
17	advertised in accordance with provisions of law.
18	Four people spoke in support of the designation,
19	including the owner, Tishman Speyer, the New York
20	Landmark's Conservancy, the Historic Districts
21	Council, and Mary B. Dierickx. There were no
22	speakers in opposition to designation. On October
23	16th, 2012, the commission voted to designate the
24	Rainbow Room an interior landmark.

Since opening on October 3rd, 1934,

the Rainbow Room has been one of New York City's premier nightspots. An elegant supper club to dine, dance, and enjoy incomparable views.

Located at the east end of the 65th floor of 30 Rockefeller Plaza, this room is particularly notable because few interiors of this type survived from the early 20th century. The Rainbow Room was designed by the Associated Architects, the architects of Rockefeller Center. Wallace K. Harrison, a member of the firm Corbett, Harrison & McMurray, acted as lead architect, working with interior decorator, Elena Bachman Schmidt. This double-height space was conceived in the building's original design as a single volume, without columns. The style is Streamlined Modern, with calculated neo-classical flourishes.

The commission urges you to affirm the designation. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you very much. Any questions from my colleagues? Anyone with good stories of dates at the Rainbow Room where they noticed the outstanding landmarked interior and are looking forward to its preservation?
