2	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Good morning,		
3	and welcome to today's Finance Committee Hearing.		
4	My name is Domenic M. Recchia, Jr. I am the Chair		
5	of this wonderful Committee. I'd like to		
6	introduce all my colleagues who have joined us		
7	here today. We have Council Member Al Vann,		
8	Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer, Council Member		
9	Karen Koslowitz, Council Member Joel Rivera, and		
10	of course myself, Domenic M. Recchia, Jr. Today		
11	we have several items on our agenda. We have a		
12	transparency reso, three bid items, and one Land		
13	Use item. Let's start with the transparency		
14	resolution. This resolution sets forth new		
15	changes in the designation of certain		
16	organizations receiving local, aging and youth		
17	discretionary funding as well as new changes in		
18	the designation of certain organizations receiving		
19	funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the		
20	expense budget. Organizations appearing in the		
21	reso that have not yet completed the		
22	prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's		
23	Office of Contracts, the Council or any other		
24	entity are identified with an asterisk next to its		
25	name. Additionally as with all transparency reso,		

Council Members will have to sign a disclosure
form indicating whether or not a conflict exists
with any of the groups on the attached list. If
any Council Member has a potential conflict of
interest with any organization listed, he or she
might want to disclose the conflict at the time of
their vote. Please also disclose any conflicts
that you have with the proposed subcontractor that
are used by organizations you sponsor for
discretionary funding. This disclosure must be
made before the subcontractor can be approved.
Members will be contacted by the Council Ethics in
Employment Council, Nadir, to complete disclosure
forms as necessary. Next we have three BID items.
The first BID item is the Myrtle Avenue BID
located in Council Member Diana Reyna and Liz
Crowley's district in Queens. This item sets
March 13 th at 10 a.m. to consider a local law that
would amend the BID district plan to remove
certain services that the BID is currently
required to provide and to allow for additional
services. The next BID item is the HUB Third
Avenue BID located in Council Member Arroyo's
district in the Bronx. This item sets March 13 th

at 10 a.m. to consider a local law that would
amend the BID's district plan to allow for capital
improvement program amended services currently
required to provide by the BID and change the
level of assessment on vacant properties in the
BID. The last BID item is the proposed Soho BID
located in Council Member Chin's district in
Manhattan. This item sets March 13 th at 10 a.m.
to consider a local law that would establish the
Soho BID. These are all of the BID items and all
the affected Council Members have expressed
support of these items. Our next and last item is
a Land Use Item Sunset 203K located in Council
Member Diana Reyna and Erik Dilan's district in
Brooklyn will receive a full property tax
exemption for 40 years, the rehab of five
buildings that provides 21 units of rental housing
for low income families. Both council members
support this item. These are all our items on
today's agenda. Representatives from HPD are here
to answer any questions you may have on the Land
Use item and Finance staff is here to answer any
question you may have on the transparency reso.
Before we take questions, if there are any, I want

	to remind Finance members that tomorrow at 10 a.m.
	in the Council chambers the Finance Committee will
	jointly with the Committee on Community
	Development, chaired by Council Member Al Vann, to
	hold an oversight hearing examining the Department
	of Finance's assessment practices relating to
	properties in New York City and properties
	affected by super storm Sandy. This afternoon my
	counsel, Tanisha Edwards, will e-mail you the
	hearing briefing documents, which I encourage you
	to read prior to tomorrow's hearing.
	Representatives from the DOF and New York City Tax
	Commission which handles assessment appeals of
	members of the public have been invited to
	testify. I encourage all my colleagues to attend
	this very important hearing. Now back to today's
	items. SBS Deputy Commissioner Elizabeth De Leon
	will say a few words about the three BID items on
	today's agenda. We are joined by Council Member
	Leroy Comrie and Council Member Gale Brewer. Yes?
	Oliver Koppell. I said it before. Recognize the
	chair from the Bronx, Oliver Koppell. Okay. Go
	ahead Small Business Services.

DEPUTY COMMISSIONER DE LEON

2	BHARGAVA: Good morning. Good morning, Mr.
3	Chairman and members of the Finance Committee. I
4	am Elizabeth De Leon Bhargava, deputy commissioner
5	at SBS. I am joined today by my assistant
6	commissioner, James Mettham and Eddie [phonetic]
7	Yang from my staff. SBS supports the City Council
8	resolution setting the date, time and place for
9	the public hearing concerning the establishment of
10	the Soho Business Improvement District in the
11	borough of Manhattan. The Soho BID's steering
12	committee has completed successfully the outreach
13	and planning work consistent with SBS program
14	policies. In addition SBS has reviewed the
15	boundaries of the proposed SOHO BID and found the
16	boundaries to be acceptable. The proposed BID
17	includes properties along both sides of Broadway
18	from Canal Street to Houston Street. SBS will
19	arrange for the publication of the summary of the
20	City Council resolution at least once in the city
21	record. The SOHO bid steering committee will
22	arrange the mailing of summary of the resolution
23	as required by law. As requested by Council
24	Member Chin, changes have been made to the
25	proposed Soho BID plan. The changes include the

2	following: residential condo and co-op units will			
3	be assessed at just one dollar per year. The			
4	annual BID budget was reduced from 700,000 to			
5	550,000 and the revised plan will only include			
6	three proposed services: sanitation and snow			
7	removal, pedestrian and public safety and general			
8	administrative services instead of the six			
9	originally proposed. SBS is submitting the			
10	revised Soho BID plan as attached. Additionally,			
11	SBS supports the City Council resolution setting			
12	the date, time and place for the public hearing			
13	concerning amendments of the HUB Third Avenue and			
14	the Myrtle Avenue district plans. Over time, the			
15	needs of both districts related to certain			
16	services have changed. The HUB Third Avenue BID			
17	wishes to modify existing services to add a			
18	capital program in the district. The changes in			
19	services would result in the modification of the			
20	public safety, sanitation, promotion and marking			
21	programs and a community service program. The			
22	addition of a capital improvement program will			
23	provide for street and sidewalk amenities within			
24	the district. In order to finance the capital			
25	improvements the HUB Third Avenue BID shall change			

2	the method of assessment for vacant properties to
3	an amount equal to 68 percent of the commercial
4	property footage rate. The Myrtle Avenue BID
5	wishes to discontinue a maintenance program and in
6	place of that program add sanitation and graffiti
7	removal services, additional security, business
8	promotional services and additional holiday
9	decorations. The HUB Third Avenue and Myrtle
10	Avenue BIDS will arrange for the publication of a
11	public hearing notice at least once in a local
12	newspaper as required by law and in addition the
13	BIDs will mail a notice to local property owners
14	as requested by the Finance Committee. Thank you.
15	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you
16	very much. Anybody have any questions? So after
17	you have done this for the Soho BID, this will
18	complete and we can move forward?
19	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER DE LEON
20	BHARGAVA: Absolutely.
21	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: and what is
22	the timeline again for how long we have to wait?
23	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER DE LEON
24	BHARGAVA: The timeline? Eddie, would you like to
25	answer that question on the specifics?

2	EDDIE YANG: Yes, after the public
3	hearing on the $13^{ m th}$, there will be a 30 day
4	period, and at the end of that time, the City
5	Council may take up the Soho BID legislation and
6	give its approval or disapproval at that time. So
7	we are looking at a timeframe ofwe're now in
8	Marchsometime in mid-April, late April for the
9	City Council approval of that legislation.
10	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Okay. So
11	sometime in April we can move forward. We have to
12	wait 30 days from March 13 th ?
13	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER DE LEON
14	BHARGAVA: Yes. There is a waiting period.
15	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: At least.
16	DEPUTY COMMISSIONER DE LEON
17	BHARGAVA: Mm-hmm.
18	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Okay. Anyone
19	have any questions about any of these three BIDs,
20	the transparency, the Land Use items? Okay. I
21	want to thank the SBS for coming here today.
