2	CHAIRPERSON ROSE: Good morning.
3	My name is Debbie Rose and I am the Chair of the
4	Committee on Civil Rights. I would like to
5	recognize, first, my colleagues, who are present
6	here today from the Civil Rights Committee. They
7	are to my left, Council Member Andrew King who is,
8	this is his first Civil Rights Committee meeting
9	hearing. I want to thank you and welcome you to
10	this Committee. And Council Member Chin, a
11	faithful Council Member for this Committee. I'd
12	also like to thank our Committee Counsel Gillian
13	Beckford and Damian Budthick, our Policy Analyst
14	for all the work that they have put into making
15	this hearing possible today. On January 22 <sup>nd</sup> , 2013
16	the Committee on Civil Rights voted to pass
17	proposed introductory bill number 814A, a local
18	law to amend the administrative code of the City
19	of New York in relation to prohibiting
20	discrimination based on an individuals
21	unemployment. The legislation was then passed by
22	the full Council on January 23 <sup>rd</sup> , 2013. On
23	February 22 <sup>nd</sup> , 2013 the Mayor issued a message of
24	disapproval vetoing this legislation. That veto
25	message was formally accepted by the Council at

2	it's February 27 <sup>th</sup> stated meeting. Today, the
3	Committee will vote to repass intro number 814a
4	and to file the Mayor's veto message M1047 intro
5	number 814a, I'm sorry, the Mayor's veto message
6	M1047. Intro number 814a would make it unlawful
7	discriminary practice for employers to base hiring
8	decisions on an applicants unemployment unless
9	there is a substantially job related reason for
10	doing so. and indicating in a job advertisement
11	that being currently employed is a requirement for
12	the job. Or that individuals who are unemployed
13	will not be considered for the position. Anyone
14	who has been discriminated against would be
15	permitted to bring an action at the Commission on
16	Civil, on Human Rights or in court. Intro number
17	814a would be the first law in the country to
18	provide a private right of action for those
19	unlawfully discriminated against for being
20	unemployed. The question before the committee
21	this morning is whether intro number 814a should
22	be repassed notwithstanding the objections of the
23	Mayor. And I'd just like to say, how are you
24	supposed to get a job if you can't get a job? And
25	with that, I would like to ask the clerk to call

5	Civil Rights, intro 814a, Mayor's veto message
6	1047. Council Member Rose?

12	MR. PIN: By a vote of three in the

14	abstentions the have been adopted. Members,
15	please sign your Committee Report.

17	leave the voting open for at least until 10
18	o'clock, or a half an hour, a half an hour pending
19	the arrival of other Committee Members for this
20	very important vote. I thank you for your time
21	and this hearing is now adjourned, oh no, it's not
22	adjourned. I just asked to keep it open for a
23	half an hour. Sorry. [laughter] I just wanted to
24	bang the gavel everybody. So, it will remain open
25	until 10:15. Thank you. [pause]
