ago but I'll just take a moment to reintroduce 2 myself. I'm a 40 year resident of the City of New 3 York. I live in Manhattan and I've been on the 4 5 Board since 2005. The role of the Board is very important, as the Chairman briefly summarized. 6 The function of the Board, we enforce, we interpret and we administer Chapter 68 of the City 9 Charter. The purpose of those conflict of 10 interest provisions as it says in the preamble to 11 the, to Chapter 68, is to preserve the public 12 trust, to promote public confidence in government, 13 to protect the integrity of government decision 14 making and to enhance government efficiency. 15 on that last one, the framer's of Chapter 68 and I 16 as a member of the Board, believe that carrying 17 out those first functions of promoting integrity and pubic confidence, that is what enhances 18 government efficiency. I believe that I've been 19 20 able to make a positive contribution to the work 21 of the board and will be able to do so going 22 forward if my appointment is confirmed. I bring 23 to the Board's work, first if all, quite simply, 24 the perspective of someone who lives in this city 25 and I rely on government service and public

servants in numerous ways as a citizen of this
city. And a delivery of city services honestly
and fairly is important to me just as a citizen of
the city. I'm a lawyer. I've been a lawyer since
1976. My legal career has included representing
public servants, their collective bargaining
representatives and city agencies. So, I've
become familiar with the workings of city
government through that. I've also represented
fiduciaries and for the last almost ten years I
have worked as an independent fiduciary, which
means acting on behalf of someone else to manage
someone else's affairs and assets bound by a duty
of loyalty and a duty to avoid conflict. And I
think that that professional experience that I
have helps me to understand how best to interpret
and administer the law as it is. And with that,
I'll be happy to take any questions.

CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you. We'll first hear from Mr. Crowell.

MR. ANTHONY CROWELL: Good morning members of the Committee and Chair Rivera. you. My names is Anthony Crowell. Safeguarding public integrity is fundamental to the orderly and

effective administration of government. New York 2 City has among the most well regarded laws to 3 guard against conflicts of interest in public 4 5 service. During my 15 year tenure with New York City, first as an Assistant Corporation Counsel a 6 the Law Department and then as Special Counsel and Councilor to the Mayor, and the Mayor's office, I 9 developed a solid understanding of virtually all 10 aspects of city operations and law, including the 11 purpose and intent of the conflicts of interest, 12 lobbying and financial disclosure laws. I also 13 gained a hands on, practical knowledge of the application of those laws to real life situations. 14 15 Because I remained so committed to helping the 16 mission of city government and because I 17 understand so well the roles of both rank and file 18 staff and high ranking officials having served in both roles myself, I would like to service the 19 20 city again by sharing my legal expertise and 21 practical experience as a member of the Conflicts 22 of Interest Board. I've long believed that having 23 more individuals with ground level knowledge and 24 experience on the Conflicts of Interest Board, 25 like, the kind I have gained, would be a great
