Many of the trade license issued by the city have a requirement that says where you needed to go to get your experience, leaving some veterans that they train and work on the busy - - throughout the U.S. and overseas - - .

With this bill veterans would have to repeat experience in New York City to qualify for a license. Enter 959458, sponsored by myself, would make - - website a one-stop shop for job and resources for veterans.

touched	because we're extending the certification
in respe	ct to contracting so that their lives will
resume,	and they could be viable.

And I think it's important and that's why I'm here, and I think everyone. And for my dad, thank you. - - My father say.
