My name is Diana Reyna. I am Chair of the

Committee on Small Business. Today's hearing is
on two bills Proposed Introduction Number 942a and

Proposed Introduction Number 949a. Both of which
were first considered in a joint hearing with the

Committee on Governmental Operations on February

28th of this year. These bills implement
recommendations of the regulatory review panel
first convened by the council in 2009. To find
ways to make it easier to own and to operate small
businesses in New York City.

I often hear from small business owners who want to obey the laws but who nonetheless question whether the goal of city regulations is to improve public safety or to impose fines to cover budget shortfalls. They complain that navigating the bureaucracy of regulations and the agencies that enforce them is an onerous burden for small businesses that lack a dedicated government relation staff.

The regulatory review panel was convened in response to such concerns and intent in these bills to address them. I'm very pleased

to see that these pieces of legislation to drive
home a very clear message from the City Council.
We will educate our small businesses before we
punish them, finding compliance to be the
priority. Proposed Introduction Number 949 would
require the Department of Buildings, Consumer
Affairs, Health and Mental Hygiene, Environmental
Protection, Sanitation, Fire and Transportation to
conduct a review of the violations they each
enforce under the New York City administrative
code, the rules of the city of New York and their
New York City health code and recommend to the
Council and the Mayor violations that should be
given cure periods or periods of time in which a
small business can correct any existing violation
without incurring a fine.

The report would be due 120 days from the effective date of the legislation. As we consider this bill it is important to note that it is only a first step. Once the agencies report their findings, it will be up to the Council on the administration to take further action to change the regulations for which there should be opportunities to cure. When we finally do we will

save businesses time and money and foster a more productive relationship between small business owners and city agencies. Proposed intro number 942a creates a mechanism for small businesses to present their regulatory issues and concerns to agencies on an ongoing basis. Recognizing that Chambers of Commerce can play a significant role in representing their members' interest before the city, the bill would require specific agencies responsible for regulating small businesses to appoint liaisons who report to the city's Chief Business Operations Officer Tokumbo Shobowale and be responsible for maintaining open communication between local chambers of commerce and other stakeholders.

I would like to acknowledge my colleagues, members of this Committee on Small Business. We have been joined by Council member Peter Koo, Council member Ruben Wills, Council member Andy King, Council member Mathieu Eugene, and I want to thank our staff to this committee, counsel Jeffrey Campagna as well as our policy analyst Faith Corbett and Ralph Hernandez, our finance analyst.
