3	Welcome to today's Finance Committee Hearing. My
4	name is Domenic M. Recchia, Jr. I'm the Chair of
5	the Finance Committee. At this time I'd like to
6	introduce my colleagues. We have Minority Leader
7	Jimmy Oddo, Council Member Vincent Ignizio,
8	Council Member Oliver Koppell, Council Member Gale
9	Brewer, Council Member Donovan Richard, Council
10	Member Diana Reyna, Council Member Karen
11	Koslowitz, Council Member Leroy Comrie and myself.
12	Today we have three land use items on our agenda.
13	The first item, provide property tax exemptions
14	pursuant to private housing finance law to
15	properties that provide rental housing to low
16	income families. The first item is Seagirt
17	Apartments which is a property located in Council
18	Member Richards district in Queens. This property
19	was formerly under the Mitchell Lama Program
20	[phonetic] which provides 916 units of rental
21	housing for low income families and will receive a
22	35 year partial property tax exemption upon
23	entering the HDFC Program under HPD. The second
24	property taxes action is the Presbyterian HDFC,
25	Burt Ostenhouses [phonetic] property located in

2	Council Member Danny Dromm's district in Queens.
3	This property which provides 151 units of rental
4	housing for low income family and seniors will
5	undergo rehab and will receive a 35 year partial
6	property tax exemption. The last property tax
7	exemption is for 927 Columbus Avenue located in
8	Council Member Melissa Mark-Viverito's district in
9	Manhattan. This property which provides 12 units
10	of rental housing for low income families will
11	undergo rehab and will receive a 30 year full
12	property tax exemption. Those are all our land
13	use items and all respective members have
14	expressed support. Now we will call the roll. I
15	just want to remind the Council Members that
16	tomorrows the Finance Committee and the Public
17	Housing Committee will hold an oversight hearing
18	examining proposed NYCHA actions to address the
19	impact of cuts as a result of the Federal
20	sequestration. The hearing will discuss proposed
21	plans to address the shortfalls, including cost
22	cutting and other actions by NYCHA, the take over
23	of some community centers and senior centers by
24	city agencies and the implications of these
25	actions for the FY 2014 budget. Those invited to

2	testify, a representative from the Housing
3	Authority, the Department of Aging and the
4	Department of Youth and Community Development and
5	the Public and the Unions. The hearing will be
6	held at 10:00 a.m. in the Council's Chambers. All
7	my colleagues must be there. This is a required
8	Finance Committee Hearing. I hope, everybody is
9	invited to attend. Please call the roll. Hold
10	on, before we call the roll, does anyone have any
11	questions? We've been joined by Lewis Fidler and
12	Council Member Jackson [off mic] and Joel Rivera.
13	At this time we recognize Council Member Donovan
14	Richards would like to say a few words.
15	COUNCIL MEMBER RICHARDS: Well,
16	today is a great day and momentous day for the
17	people of the Rockaway's. As many of you know, we
18	went through the devastation of Hurricane Sandy
19	and we really had an issue trying to locate
20	affordable housing for many of the residents in my
21	district who are, unfortunately, put in the
22	temporary hotel situation. We still have 200
23	families who are trying to find some portion of
24	affordable housing. So today, for us to be, for
25	today for us to now have 916 units of affordable

2	housing now being added back into the Rockaway's,
3	it is a great day for those families. And one of
4	the things I said I was going to do when I got
5	elected and I remember being elected and seeing
6	Councilman Recchia and we were speaking about
7	this. I said, now is the time, we have to do
8	this. And he was gracious enough to really work
9	with us. So, I just want to thank you on behalf
10	of my community and HPD for certainly trying to
11	meet the need and help us meet the need of the
12	people of the Rockaway's and I urge you all to
13	vote yes.

15	you, Council Member. You deserve a wonderful job
16	on this because not too many people could. This
17	is a victory when you get an apartment complex to
18	go back into some affordable housing program. And
19	I want to thank you for your support and all you
