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2	CHATRPERSON MEALY:	Good afternoon.

My name is Darlene Mealy. I serve as the Chair of the New York City's Council Committee on Contracts. It is my pleasure to welcome you today. Thank you all for attending. Before we proceed I would like to recognize the Council Members who are present here today, Letitia James of the Committee, Robert Jackson, Michael Nelson and I would thank, Miss Manegaoux [phonetic] legal staff here. Today the Committee will vote on Resolution 1739 which concerns the City's smallest contracts, micro purchases. In April, the Procurement Policy Board voted to adapt a ruled amendment to increase the City's micro purchase limit from \$5,000 to \$20,000. Resolution 1739 would ratify that increase. This resolution will allow agencies to forgo the long and sometimes complex bidding process for its smallest contracts. By increasing micro purchase limits agencies will be flexible to procure more of its smallest purchases quickly and efficiently. Now, any time we broaden the scope of contracts that do not require competitive bidding we must be cautious. We do not take this step lightly. From

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what we have gathered during our April hearing on
this resolution and the talks we had with
administrations, sufficient safeguards are in
place to make sure that micro purchasing is not
abused with regards to either the cost or vendor
selection. Given small fractions of City's
contracting budget that new limit will capture we
believe that an increase to the micro purchase
limit presents an opportunity to improve agencies
operations without significantly increasing
financial Again, thank you for all
attending. With nothing further, anyone have any
statements? I turn over to Robert Jackson.

COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: Thank you,
Chair Mealy. I appreciate the opportunity to
comment. Hello? Yeah. So, Chair Mealy, I thank
you for the opportunity to testify regarding this
particular, it's on. Whoo. Hello? It's better?
Thank you for the opportunity. I read the
statement by Andrea Glick [phonetic] the Chief
Procurement Officer and the Director of the
Mayor's Office of Contract Services. And clearly,
what it says is that this is going to make it
easier for the City agencies to do business but it

will also, it clearly gives the impression that
it's going to be better for MWBE's minority and
women owned business enterprises to do business
with the City. And that they will have robust
oversight of agencies using the micro purchase
method. Clearly, if this means increasing the
amount of MWBE's, so, micro purchases, I'm in
favor of it. Considering the fact that
understanding that MWBE's are small business, the
backbone of our great city. I have heard it from
Mayor Bloomberg, I heard it from many, many
elected officials and if, in fact, that is the
case, let's move forward in ensuring that small
businesses have greater opportunity and less time
to get contracts in this small amounts. I just
think that we as City Council must ensure and
maybe have reports from Marks [phonetic] regarding
to ensure that, in fact, it is increasing the
diversity for MWBE's with these small micro
purchases. So, with that, I say, yes. But let's
continue to oversight. Thank you.
CHAIRPERSON MEALY: Letitia James?

COUNCIL MEMBER JAMES: Thank you.

My name is Letitia James and I too want to join

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with my colleague and the Chair of this Committee
again in support of this piece of, this
resolution. Obviously, if we can increase
opportunities for women and minority businesses in
the City of New York, I fully support that. I
just hope that as we move forward and we study the
numbers and the data that the opportunities for
WMBE increases as a result of this legislation and
I look forward to renewing those numbers as we
move forward in the next administration. Thank
you, Madam Chair.

CHAIRPERSON MEALY: Thank you.

Anyone else? I just hope that we definitely can and we have them make sure that we continue to be vigilant on making sure that some of the contracts are not just using a WMBE, this micro purchasing, to really exclude them from the big, million dollars of contracting.
