3	opening the Full Land Use Committee for Wednesday,
4	June 26, 2013. We are joined by Council Members
5	Vincent Ignizio, Mark Weprin, Sara Gonzalez, Peter
б	Koo, Mark, Steve Levin, Jessica Lappin, Daniel
7	Garodnick, Annabel Palmer, Maria del Carmen
8	Arroyo, Inez Dickens, Al Vann, and Diana Reyna. I
9	said, I started, I want, yes, and Diego and
10	Andriano, yes. Today the Full Land Use Committee
11	will be voting on LU number 847,848 and 849 with
12	the modifications which will make up the
13	applications dealing with Madison Square Garden.
14	I want to congratulate the Subcommittee Chair,
15	Council Member Weprin who held a lengthy meeting
16	last week where many discussions and ideas were
17	vetted regarding the project along with thoughtful
18	testimony that was brought forth on the condition
19	of the special permits that MSG seeks, mainly with
20	regard to the term of the arena permit and the
21	type of signage to be permitted outside and the
22	need for a revamp station. And clearly it was a
23	substantive meeting with a lot of thought and a
24	lot of ideas that were bandied about during the
25	hearing. I want to thank everyone that attended.

I want to reiterate also that as Council Member
Weprin said earlier that Madison Square Garden is
not responsible for Penn Station. They work with
the, they work with many people in trying to
create an opportunity which, would came out in the
hearing regarding the future of Penn Station
working with the, when they were planning the
future of Farley [phonetic] and are willing and
indicated their willingness to do whatever's
necessary to help and show that Penn Station can
be updated as it is in the interest to make sure
that there is a consistent and efficient
transportation hub in that area. They are
modifications which I'll go through quickly. The
term of the arena special permit has been reduced
to ten years. After many discussions and after
that the permit must go back through the Council
for, through a ULURP program. We did not feel it
was wise that the Council would subvert their
power to City Planning. With respect to the MSG
signage program they will allow Madison Square
Garden to install the two additional signs on 8 th
Avenue façade, will allow the MSG to sponsor
advertising on the signs and will allow MSG to put

up new signs without having to wait for Amtrak to
install new station signs. Lastly, the benches
that were suggested for the public plaza. They
have agreed to remove them. There, again, we are
going to be voting on, again as I said in the
beginning, we're going to couple Land Use Items
847, 848, 849, with modification and on a vote to
approve. I just want to inform Council Members
that the next Subcommittee Meetings will be heard
on July 22^{nd} , if we ever leave here this evening
because we may be here until midnight and beyond
with the vote 'cause we were voting on these
overrides and Members are going to talk. So, I'm
betting midnight. I lay nickel on midnight.
Anyhow, so, with that and does anyone, would
anyone like to say anything on the application
that's being proposed? All right, seeing none, I
would recommend we call the roll and an aye vote
on the items with voting on Land Use 847, 848, 849
with modifications on a vote to approve.

14	adjourn the meeting, again, the next Subcommittees
15	will be July 22 nd . See you later this evening.

17	MR. MARTIN: Council Member Mendez?
18	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: I vote aye
19	on all.
20	MR. MARTIN: The vote is now 14 in
21	the affirmative. [pause] Council Member Barron?
22	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Well, the
23	fact that Madison Square Garden doesn't pay the
24	taxes that they ought to pay to the City and I
25	know we have nothing to do with that, and I want

2	to put that on the record as well but this is a
3	corporation that needs to be more corporate
4	friendly to the City before the City give it
5	breaks. And even though it will create jobs and
6	it will do some wonderful things for some people
7	I'm voting no until Madison Square Garden pays
8	their fair share of taxes to the City. They need
9	no more breaks from the City. With that, I say
10	no.
11	MR. MARTIN: The vote now stands at
12	13 in the affirmative, one in the negative and no
13	abstentions. [pause] Council Member Williams?
14	COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: I vote
15	aye.
16	MR. MARTIN: The vote on the
17	Committee on Land Use is now 15 in the
18	affirmative, one in the negative, no abstentions.
19	[pause] Council Member Lander?
20	COUNCIL MEMBER LANDER: Aye.
21	MR. MARTIN: The vote now stands at
22	16 in the affirmative, one in the negative and no
23	abstentions. [pause] [off mic] Council Member
24	Rivera?
25	COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: Thank you

2	very much. I vote aye on all items on today's
3	agenda.
4	MR. MARTIN: The vote currently
5	stands at 17 in the affirmative, one in the
6	negative, no abstentions. [pause] [off mic]

11	Committee on Land Use is 18 in the affirmative,
