2	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: [gavel] Good
3	morning. I am pleased to call this meeting of the
4	City Council's Land Use Subcommittee on Landmarks,
5	Public Siting and Maritime Uses to order. I am
6	City Council Member Brad Lander joined by members
7	of the committee, Annabel Palma from the Bronx and
8	Rosie Mendez from Manhattan and we're pleased also
9	to be joined by other members of the Land Use
10	Committee. We have very brief items on our
11	calendar for today that we've heard previously.
12	First, I just want to note for the
13	record that on Tuesday, October 22nd this
14	subcommittee unanimously approved with two
15	modifications the LPCs designation of the West End-
16	Collegiate Historic District Extension, Land use
17	number 918. I misspoke and I just want to clarify
18	for the record the tax block and lot designation
19	for one of the two properties, which has been
20	excluded from the Historic District, the Rutgers
21	Presbyterian Church House at 236 West 73rd Street,
22	and the correct tax block and lot for that property
23	we excluded by our vote on Tuesday is Manhattan tax
24	block 1164, tax lot 42. That is the Rutgers

Presbyterian Church House at 236 West 73rd Street.
That is what we voted to exclude on Tuesday and
what we are bringing forward to the full committee
as part of our broader approval of the West End Collegiate Historic District Extension today.

7 And then we have two items on our calendar for today, which we heard a couple of 8 9 weeks ago and they are both child care centers in 10 Council Member Reyna's district. Land use number 11 938 and 939, the UTD Bushwick Early Learning Child 12 Care Center, and 939 is the Bushwick United Early Learning Center. We had a number of questions for 13 the Administration for Children's Services, who did 14 15 not have particularly satisfying answers for us at 16 the time and I know have provided some subsequently 17 information to Council Member Reyna, and let me turn it over to her to talk about it before we 18 19 vote.

20 COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Thank you so 21 much, Mr. Chair. I just wanted to thank the 22 committee and you for your indulgence in making 23 sure that we were able to represent our district 24 and these two particular sites that our city leased 25 with sound leases. Unfortunately, the scope that

1 COMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITINGS & MARITIME USES 4 was communicated to the council was limited to five 2 3 We cannot expand those years because it years. 4 would be out of scope to do so in the interest of our community, and as much as I pushed back it was 5 not possible due to charter rules. So I wanted to 6 7 just share that for the record because I'm not pleased that we are signing off on a five year 8 9 lease with no option to renew for an additional 10 amount of years. I also wanted to just share we 11 have received communication from ACS and there has been interesting information that corrects the 12 record as to the last hearing we had on this issue 13 and it reads as follows: Dear Council Member 14 15 Reyna, below please find the details that you 16 requested with respect to the two city leases at 17 issue. As you will see, the proposed rent at 600 18 Hart Street for the next five years is the same as 19 the previous year; as the previous rent, excuse me, 20 \$312,157 per year. The proposed rent for 200 Central Avenue is \$294,000, only significantly 21 higher than the previous rent of \$199,760. 22 The increase is due to the fact that the landlord is 23 planning to do significant work to improve 24 conditions as explained below: landlord to replace 25

So I 4 wanted to just read that for the record to make sure that we understand these were some of the 5 questions that were asked and it is to the 6 7 satisfaction of this committee and myself representing this district. There was also items 8 9 that were supposed to be followed up that still 10 need... have been requested time from ACS and we 11 are expected to receive in the next few weeks a 12 catalogue of every ACS city lease including the building conditions, terms of the lease including 13 14 duration and total cost, cost per seat per 15 building; that's one item outstanding, the 16 evaluation criteria for how New York City 17 determines whether to renew or terminate a lease is 18 the second finding. The process by which the terms 19 of a lease are negotiated with individual owners is the third. New York City's rationale for renewing 20 the two subject leases for a term of five years 21 when the previous lease terms were for 20 years was 22 23 answered and that particular rationale was based on the fact that given the changing needs of the city 24 and the uncertain fiscal climate according to ACS 25

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2	it would be bad practice for the city and non-
3	profit providers to enter into long-term leases.
4	They want to reassess every three to five years to
5	ensure we are meeting the needs of both community
6	and taking into account the city's finances. So
7	that particular question was answered, and the
8	contact information of the two owners so that our
9	office and my successor can continue to hold
10	accountable with information regarding the two
11	sides have been satisfied as well. Thank you so
12	much.
13	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you, Council
14	Member Reyna, for your diligence in this matter and
15	I just want to flag that many of the and for
16	pushing us to really do our job to have some
17	oversight. I think we there's been a lot of
18	frustration and we're honored that the Chair of the
19	General Welfare Committee is a member of this
20	Subcommittee and she has often been pushing the
21	Administration for Children's Services in that
22	committee to be more forthcoming with the necessary
23	information for us to understand the ACS lease
24	portfolio and you know, why it is put together the
25	way it is and how much we're paying and what the

So I will call to 4 attention the people that are interested in these questions. The General Welfare Committee is having 5 a hearing on Monday that people may want... you 6 7 know, focusing on Early Learn and that people may want to attend to push on these things and that you 8 9 know, the subcommittee will continue to be 10 supportive of Chair Palma and the General Welfare 11 Committee's efforts to keep getting good answers 12 here, but the track record of getting those answers over the last of the four years that I have been 13 14 here is unfortunately discouraging and has made it 15 difficult for us to work together to really have 16 confidence when... just I was as nice as I could be 17 Anyway, so welcome to Council Member Arroyo, so. 18 who is a member of the committee and with that... 19 unless any other members have comments, with that and that lack of enthusiasm for the information 20 provided, we will nonetheless move forward and 21 you're satisfied, Council Member Reyna that you 22 23 know, not broadly but specifically that we should 24 move forward to approve the extension of these Alright, so yes, so we're coupling Land 25 leases.

LEGAL COUNSEL: Council Member Palma. 6 7 COUNCIL MEMBER PALMA: Aye. 8 LEGAL COUNSEL: Council Member Arroyo. 9 COUNCIL MEMBER ARROYO: Aye. 10 LEGAL COUNSEL: Council Member Mendez. 11 COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: Aye. 12 LEGAL COUNSEL: I have votes four in the affirmative, zero abstentions and zero 13 negatives. Land use items 938 and 939 are approved 14 15 and referred to the full Land Use Committee. CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Alright, so we'll 16 leave this... can we... if... until there's a 17 18 quorum for Land Use [background] can we leave the 19 vote open for Council Member Williams? 20 LEGAL COUNSEL: We can leave the vote... you can adjourn and leave the vote open 21 22 until Land Use starts. 23 CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Great. Alright, 24 so we'll adjourn the committee and we'll leave the vote open until we get started with the Land Use 25

COMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITINGS & MARITIME USES Committee. Alright. [gavel] Thank you. Yes, hopefully we'll have that soon. [Pause] LEGAL COUNSEL: Council Member б Williams. COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Aye. LEGAL COUNSEL: The vote now stands on Land Use 938 and 939 five in the affirmative, zero abstentions, zero negatives.
