CHAIRPERSON LANDER: [gavel] Good
morning. I am pleased to call this meeting of the
City Council's Land Use Subcommittee on Landmarks,
Public Siting and Maritime Uses to order. I am
City Council Member Brad Lander joined by members
of the committee, Annabel Palma from the Bronx and
Rosie Mendez from Manhattan and we're pleased also
to be joined by other members of the Land Use
Committee. We have very brief items on our
calendar for today that we've heard previously.

First, I just want to note for the record that on Tuesday, October 22nd this subcommittee unanimously approved with two modifications the LPCs designation of the West End-Collegiate Historic District Extension, Land use number 918. I misspoke and I just want to clarify for the record the tax block and lot designation for one of the two properties, which has been excluded from the Historic District, the Rutgers Presbyterian Church House at 236 West 73rd Street, and the correct tax block and lot for that property we excluded by our vote on Tuesday is Manhattan tax block 1164, tax lot 42. That is the Rutgers

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2 | Presbyterian Church House at 236 West 73rd Street.

That is what we voted to exclude on Tuesday and what we are bringing forward to the full committee as part of our broader approval of the West End-

6 Collegiate Historic District Extension today.

And then we have two items on our calendar for today, which we heard a couple of weeks ago and they are both child care centers in Council Member Reyna's district. Land use number 938 and 939, the UTD Bushwick Early Learning Child Care Center, and 939 is the Bushwick United Early Learning Center. We had a number of questions for the Administration for Children's Services, who did not have particularly satisfying answers for us at the time and I know have provided some subsequently information to Council Member Reyna, and let me turn it over to her to talk about it before we vote.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Thank you so much, Mr. Chair. I just wanted to thank the committee and you for your indulgence in making sure that we were able to represent our district and these two particular sites that our city leased with sound leases. Unfortunately, the scope that

COMMITTEE ON LANDMARKS, PUBLIC SITINGS & MARITIME USES 4 was communicated to the council was limited to five We cannot expand those years because it would be out of scope to do so in the interest of our community, and as much as I pushed back it was not possible due to charter rules. So I wanted to just share that for the record because I'm not pleased that we are signing off on a five year lease with no option to renew for an additional amount of years. I also wanted to just share we have received communication from ACS and there has been interesting information that corrects the record as to the last hearing we had on this issue and it reads as follows: Dear Council Member Reyna, below please find the details that you requested with respect to the two city leases at issue. As you will see, the proposed rent at 600 Hart Street for the next five years is the same as the previous year; as the previous rent, excuse me, \$312,157 per year. The proposed rent for 200 Central Avenue is \$294,000, only significantly higher than the previous rent of \$199,760. increase is due to the fact that the landlord is planning to do significant work to improve conditions as explained below: landlord to replace

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roofing system resilient surface and repair work to building exterior and included in this rate. wanted to just read that for the record to make sure that we understand these were some of the questions that were asked and it is to the satisfaction of this committee and myself representing this district. There was also items that were supposed to be followed up that still need... have been requested time from ACS and we are expected to receive in the next few weeks a catalogue of every ACS city lease including the building conditions, terms of the lease including duration and total cost, cost per seat per building; that's one item outstanding, the evaluation criteria for how New York City determines whether to renew or terminate a lease is the second finding. The process by which the terms of a lease are negotiated with individual owners is the third. New York City's rationale for renewing the two subject leases for a term of five years when the previous lease terms were for 20 years was answered and that particular rationale was based on the fact that given the changing needs of the city and the uncertain fiscal climate according to ACS

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it would be bad practice for the city and nonprofit providers to enter into long-term leases.

They want to reassess every three to five years to
ensure we are meeting the needs of both community
and taking into account the city's finances. So
that particular question was answered, and the
contact information of the two owners so that our
office and my successor can continue to hold
accountable with information regarding the two
sides have been satisfied as well. Thank you so

much.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you, Council Member Reyna, for your diligence in this matter and I just want to flag that many of the... and for pushing us to really do our job to have some oversight. I think we... there's been a lot of frustration and we're honored that the Chair of the General Welfare Committee is a member of this Subcommittee and she has often been pushing the Administration for Children's Services in that committee to be more forthcoming with the necessary information for us to understand the ACS lease portfolio and you know, why it is put together the way it is and how much we're paying and what the

So I will call to attention the people that are interested in these questions. The General Welfare Committee is having a hearing on Monday that people may want... you know, focusing on Early Learn and that people may want to attend to push on these things and that you know, the subcommittee will continue to be supportive of Chair Palma and the General Welfare Committee's efforts to keep getting good answers here, but the track record of getting those answers over the last of the four years that I have been here is unfortunately discouraging and has made it difficult for us to work together to really have confidence when... just I was as nice as I could be Anyway, so welcome to Council Member Arroyo, who is a member of the committee and with that... unless any other members have comments, with that and that lack of enthusiasm for the information provided, we will nonetheless move forward and you're satisfied, Council Member Reyna that you know, not broadly but specifically that we should move forward to approve the extension of these Alright, so yes, so we're coupling Land
