2	CHAIRPERSON GARODNICK: How about
3	now? I will start it again. I want to welcome
4	everybody to the Consumer Affairs Committee of
5	the City Council. Today is Wednesday, December
6	18. My name is Dan Garodnick. I have the
7	privilege of chairing this committee and I'm
8	joined today by Council Members Oliver Koppell,
9	Karen Koslowitz, and Charles Barron. Today is
10	our last meeting of the year and we are closing
11	out what has been a productive legislative
12	session by voting on three bills, two of them.
13	Intros 876A and 1039A are meant to improve
14	regulations for sidewalk cafes. Council Member
15	Diana Reyna is the sponsor of 1039A and I am
16	the sponsor of 876A. In order to operate a
17	sidewalk café, a restaurant needs to obtain
18	both a revocable consent and a sidewalk café
19	license, and while the procedure to renew a
20	license is relatively simple, renewing the
21	consent is a frequently drawn out process.
22	We've heard many frustrations from restaurants
23	about this problem, including from business
24	owners who receive fines for operating an

unlicensed café while they were waiting on

their renewals to come through. Intro 876A
addresses this problem in two ways. First, it
mandates that a sidewalk café is not deemed
unlicensed as long as the business submitted a
timely renewal application and held a valid
license at the time that it did so. And while
first time applicants will still receive a
consent term of only two years, the bill
lengthens the term for renewals for four years.
This will lighten the load on both businesses
and on the Department of Consumer Affairs while
maintaining the ability of communities to
ensure that new cafes are good neighbors. Intro
1039A by Council Member Reyna also addresses
the application process for revocable consents.
It streamlines the process by allowing DCA, the
Department of Consumer Affairs, to waive its
public hearing and eliminates the need for
approval by the mayor's office of contract
services. Both of these bills were heard in
this committee back in May and I know that we
are glad to beto have been able to resolve
outstanding issues, the satisfaction of both
husiness and our Community Boards before the

2	end of the term. The last bill on today's
3	agenda is Intro 1177A, which is designed to
4	update regulations for collateral loan brokers,
5	also known as pawnbrokers and dealers in
6	secondhand goods. I sponsored this bill at the
7	request of the mayor. We held our initial
8	hearing on it in November, and since then we've
9	made a number of amendments to reflect the
10	concerns raised at that hearing. Intro 1177A
11	requires pawnbrokers and secondhand dealers to
12	make some of their records available
13	electronically to the NYPD. These businesses
14	are already subject to record keeping
15	requirements under both state and local law,
16	but making these records available online will
17	make themmake accessing them vastly simpler.
18	Detectives will no longer have to go door to
19	door and struggle over hand-written logs, a
20	search that took hours before now can take mere
21	seconds. In deference to the testimony at our
22	hearing, we made a number of amendments.
23	First, we limited the information to be
24	uploaded online to only details about the item,

25 not about the customer. We also imposed a time

2	limit for that information so that it is not
3	retained online indefinitely. Finally, we
4	removed scrap processors from this bill
5	altogether. Taken together these amendments
6	result in a tighter, more focused bill with
7	increased sensitivity to privacy concerns.
8	This bill strikes the right balance between
9	protecting customer information and allowing
10	the NYPD to conduct investigations in a timely
11	and efficient manner. It has been a privilege
12	to serve as the Chair of this Committee, and I
13	am glad we are able to end the year on a
14	productive note. I'd now like to ask the Clerk
15	to call the roll, and I certainly will
16	recommend an aye vote on all three bills.
