2	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Good afternoon.
3	It's December 18th, 2013. My names is James Vacca.
4	I'm Chair of the Committee on Transportation. And
5	this is the final hearing of this Committee for
6	this session. I want to thank and congratulate my
7	staff and the committee members for all their hard
8	work over the last four years. I want to thank the
9	staff to my transportation committee, Lyle Frank,
10	Jonathan Masarano [phonetic], Kafal Zoloft for
11	their help. And I want to thank my staff in my
12	district office; Stacey Gardner is my legislative
13	policy person who is there and all my staff for
14	doing a great job.
15	You know, if this bill passes the
16	Transportation Committee will have passed 44 bills
17	in four months. Oh, in four years not four months.
18	Let me say that again. Upon passage of this bill
19	the Transportation Committee will have passed 44
20	bills in four years. So I am proud of that record.
21	It's been a labor of love and I've enjoyed it. And
22	I may not be back here. I don't know what God's
23	plans are for me, but whatever they are I look
24	forward to serving.

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Today we're here to vote on Council 2 3 Member Comrie's proposed introduction 10055A, a law that would require the NYPD to report more 4 information regarding hit and run vehicle 5 collissions. Over the past several months, this 6 Committee has taken great strides to increase the 7 8 safety of roadways, particularly in our oversight of the NYPD's protocols in relation to collision 9 10 investigations.

This bill addresses a particular type 11 12 of collision that has effected so many of our 13 communities, hit and run incidents. These 14 collisions, particularly those that result in serious injury or death or criminal incidents and 15 must be thoroughly investigated by the police. 16 It is in the interest of public safety for the NYPD to 17 report statistics relating to such incidents and 18 Intro 1055 would require the New York City Police 19 Department to report the number of such hit and run 20 21 accident desegregated by precinct quarterly.

In addition, the bill has been amended to also give the number of cases closed with or without an arrest to be presented to the Council and the public. This way we will be able to see

2	what percentage of cases are successfully closed
3	and it will give the Council in its oversight and
4	budgetary role a better idea of whether increased
5	resources are need to apprehend the perpetrators
6	who commit these horrible acts. Also the bill
7	would require the NYPD to give to the Council a
8	brief description of the investigation of each
9	case, again, helping the Council in its oversight
10	and budgetary role.
11	At the first hearing for this bill,
12	which the NYPD did not attend, we heard testimony
13	from a family whose loved ones were victims of
14	failed hit and runs. They felt like the progress
15	of the investigation of these crimes was not
16	properly communicated to them. There was no
17	indication to the Committee as to what, if any,
18	investigation occurred in this case. And this was
19	not the first time the Council has heard testimony
20	from families of individuals involved in fatal
21	crashes who feel that they were not informed of
22	what, if any, investigation took place.
23	This is unacceptable. Intro 1055 is
24	designed to simply report more information about

24 designed to simply report more information about25 these investigations. Our role in the City Council

2	is to exercise oversight over city agencies. And I
3	believe we have illuminated a problem that effects
4	too many of our constituents. So, therefore, on
5	this piece of legislation introduced by Council
6	Member Comrie, Intro 1055, the Chair recommends an
7	aye vote.
8	I'd like to introduce the members of
9	the Transportation Committee who are here. To my
10	left Darlene Mealy, Peter Koo, myself, James Vacca,
11	Jimmy Van Bramer, Ydanis Rodriguez, Debbie Rose,
12	Gale Brewer, David Greenfield. Without further
13	ado, I will now ask the Clerk to please call the
14	roll. The Chair recommends an aye vote.
15	THE CLERK: William Martin, Committee
16	Clerk. Roll call vote Committee on Transportation.
17	Council Member Vacca.
18	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: The vote's aye.
19	THE CLERK: Brewer.
20	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: I vote aye. I
21	just want to mention some years ago a florist who
22	had a wonderful shop on Broadway in the West 80s
23	he was in his 80s. He and his brother had a shop
24	and he was killed on a hit and run. And he always
25	said why didn't somebody investigate, what are the

2	facts? And so this is you know, thinking of
3	him. I want to thank Jimmie Vacca for all of his
4	leadership. I do want to let him know that God is
5	not going to help in in the future on the City
6	Council. I think there are other people who have
7	more of an influence. I do want to say how much I
8	appreciate the work that you do, how hard you work,
9	and it's a pleasure being on this committee. Thank
10	you.
11	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Thank you, Gale.
12	THE CLERK: Koppell.
13	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: He's in the men's
14	room I think someone said. Can you come back to
15	him? Can you come back to Oliver Koppell?
16	THE CLERK: Mealy.
17	COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: I vote aye.
18	THE CLERK: Rodriguez.
19	COUNCIL MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Aye. I'd
20	also like two years ago a young person who
21	recently graduated from college, Mr. Rivera, he was
22	crossing Machullo [phonetic] Parkway and he was
23	killed in a hit and run. And still today his
24	mother is looking for an explanation and
25	information from the NYPD. Even though when you

2	look at Fox 5, if you were to Google Fox 5, you can
3	see how the person who committed the hit and run,
4	he pulled his car in fire so he can get rid of the
5	proof of that incident. And still there's so many
6	questions and information has not been provided.
7	So I hope that with this bill we will be able to
8	get more information so there won't be this type of
9	hit and run. Thank you.
10	THE CLERK: Koppell.
11	COUNCIL MEMBER KOPPELL: Aye.
12	THE CLERK: Garodnick.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: Aye.
14	THE CLERK: Koo.
15	COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: Mr. Chairman, can
16	I explain my vote?
17	CHAIRMAN VACCA: Yes, Mr. Koo.
18	COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: Well, today's
19	piece of legislation will increase transparency and
20	accountability in ensuring that the NYPD is using
21	all the tools it has at its disposal to investigate
22	hit and run accidents. I'm proud to have written
23	this bill with Council Members Comrie and Mendez.
24	Although we cannot reverse the emotional and
25	physical pain caused by hit and run accidents, we

2	hope to send a clear message to community members
3	that the city government is taking this issue
4	seriously. With that a vote yes.
5	And then I also want to commend our
6	Chairman for doing a marvelous job during the last
7	four years. Thank you for our Chairman's efforts.
8	I hope you'll continue to do the same next four
9	years.
10	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Thank you,
11	Councilman.
12	THE CLERK: Rose.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER ROSE: I also vote aye
14	on this very important piece of legislation. This
15	issue has been probably an issue that has touched
16	every one of our districts. And I thank the
17	sponsors, the prime sponsors of this bill. And I
18	just want to say that it has really been a pleasure
19	working with Chairman Vacca. He honestly knows
20	where Staten Island is. He has taken the ferry.
21	And of those 44 pieces of legislation in the past
22	four years, Staten Island has benefited by leaps
23	and bounds as a result of him having shepherd these
24	44 bills through this committee. And I'm
25	especially thankful, and I'm going to say it for

3	ferry bill passed and made a reality without us
4	having to hurt someone.
5	Thank you, Chairman. You know, you've
6	been an astounding Chair. Thank you so much. And

9	Member Rose, very much.
10	THE CLERK: Van Bramer.
11	COUNCIL MEMBER VAN BRAMER: I vote aye.
12	THE CLERK: Greenfield.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER GREENFIELD: May I
14	explain my vote? Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I
15	first, of course, I want to say this is a very
16	important piece of legislation. I'm very proud
17	that we're voting for it and it's so important. I
18	see it's being covered by Cablevision/Optimum/New
19	York One, and I appreciate that as well. And I do
20	want to just say that Chair Vacca truly is one of
21	the outstanding Chairs here in the New York City
22	Council. He is passionate about the issue that he
23	chairs. He knows transportation inside out. He's
24	done amazing work. I believe we've passed more
25	bills then just about any other committee and all

2	the bills have improved the safety and the quality
3	of life of New Yorkers and this is that capstone.
4	And I very much am looking forward to
5	serving with you in whatever capacity that may be.
6	I adore Gale Brewer, but I will disagree and say
7	that God has a plan for everyone. So thank you
8	very much.
9	THE CLERK: Ignizio.
10	COUNCIL PERSON IGNIZIO: Aye.
11	THE CLERK: By a vote of 11 in the
12	affirmative, zero in the negative and no
13	abstentions, item has been adopted.
14	MR. KOPPELL: Mr. Chairman, before you
15	adjourn the meeting I just would like to
16	compliment
17	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: Mr. Koppell. I'm
18	sorry.
19	MR. KOPPELL: Yes, I would like to
20	compliment you, my Bronx colleague, for doing an
21	outstanding job. You know, I'm one of those that
22	feels that John Lou was a wonderful chairman of
23	this committee and I didn't expect the
24	necessarily that the conduct of the committee would
25	not only continue but perhaps even improve under

2	the new chair, and I want to compliment you not
3	only for the bills that we've passed but also for
4	your constant concern and attention to whatever
5	transportation problem afflicted the city after
6	Sandy, after other problems and we all benefited
7	from your leadership. Thank you.
8	CHAIRPERSON VACCA: I thank you so much
9	Councilmen Koppell. I thank everyone. This has
10	been a wonderful experience for me. And to work
11	with good people is always the nicest thing that
12	happens, you know, and I work with wonderful
13	people. Transportation affects everyone, whether
14	it's a ferry, whether it's a bus, whether it's a
15	subway line or whether it's walking or bicycling,
16	it's just a way of life that New Yorkers live with
17	every day. So whatever contribution I've been able
18	to make, I've been blessed, and I want to continue
19	doing something here and we'll see what that is.
20	But I thank you very much. As long as
21	they give me a room with a window because I have
22	claustrophobia, that is all I have to tell you.
23	But I thank you all. And without further to do,
24	this hearing is adjourned.
