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2 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Good morning, 3 ladies and gentleman. My name is Joel Rivera. I'm going to be the Acting Chair of today's Land Use 4 5 Committee. I'm joined here by my assistant sitting 6 on my lap, Sophia Rivera. I'm also joined by my 7 colleagues in the Council. With us we have Council 8 Member Charles Baron, Council Member Robert 9 Jackson, Council Member Al Vann, Council Member 10 Maria Del Carmen Arroyo, Council Member Inez 11 Dickens, Council Member Dan Garodnick, Council 12 Member Jessica Lapin, Council Member Rosie Mendez, Council Member Koo, Council Member Levin, Council 13 14 Member Weprin, Council Member Williams, Council 15 Member Reyna and Council Member Ignizio is here 16 with us as well. 17 Today we're going to be voting on

18 several items. I'm going to have the clerk read 19 the items into the agenda.

THE CLERK: Okay. Land Use Item 987 Meadows Application No. 20142201TCM, sidewalk café 696 Madison Avenue, Manhattan Community Board 8 in Council Member Garodnick's district. Land Use Item 1002, the Randolph at Broom Application No.

Council Member Robert Jackson has a 9 10 comment. COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: 11 Thank you, Mr. 12 Chair. Good morning, my colleagues. I am -- while 13 I'm voting for the Seaside Parks and Community Arts 14 Center, I did not have the opportunity based on my schedule to listen to all of the people who gave 15 testimony. And I was approached this morning by a 16 representative of the New York City Community 17 Gardens Coalition which raised some concerns. 18 19 And what I clearly indicated to the representative is that I have not been directly 20 21 involved in the negotiations and the discussions on 22 this particular project. So I don't know all of the particular details like they know and like the 23 24 other parties know who have been negotiating and 25 dealing with this particular matter and I will be

1 COMMITTEE ON LAND USE б voting yes. But clearly, I think that the issues 2 or concerns that they raised should be considered. 3 And I hope they were. 4 5 I wanted to say that for the record. Understanding that I do know that in my district б 7 that I represent community gardens are very, very important for the livelihood and welfare of our 8 community in which people involved bring the 9 10 community together and they grow fruits and vegetables and other good things in order to have 11 12 the type of holistic vitality of the community. So 13 with that, I just wanted to say that even though I 14 will be voting yes on this particular matter. Thank you. 15 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Council Member 16 17 Barron. COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: That's not 18 19 nice. You know, I'm leaving so I can fire away now for sure. 20 21 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: There's children in the audience so --22 COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I just want to 23 24 courage my colleagues when we see conflicts and contradictions in projects, sometimes a no vote is 25

2	not necessarily against the project but it just
3	simply means hold it up until some things can get
4	resolved. So I think the Seaside project should be
5	held up. And if you can Council Member Jackson, if
6	you can, and others because it's beyond the
7	gardens. The gardens are extremely important and
8	that's a major issue in it.
9	But it's also infrastructure problems,
10	sewage, there's problems with toxic grounds, the
11	EIS hasn't been down properly. There could be very
12	toxic grounds there. We need to look at that
13	again. We need to look at more community inclusion
14	of the process so people can determine you know,
15	be more involved in what should be put there. A
16	lot of people are all right with an amphitheater
17	but not at the expense of gardens and having sewage
18	problems and having toxic problems.
19	So if we can, my colleagues, and I know
20	we don't usually do this but since some of you are
21	leaving so you won't be punished, you can vote no
22	now just to hold it up. And a no vote is not
23	against the local council member, but a no vote is
24	for the community saying let's hold it up and let's
25	hold it up and I guarantee you, I didn't say
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1 COMMITTEE ON LAND USE 8 this to solicit that, but if you'll want to clap 2 again it's all right. No, stop. You're not 3 supposed to do that in here. 4 5 But on a serious note, if we can help the community on this one, it doesn't mean the 6 7 project is not going to happen but a no vote can really get the project in the shape that not only 8 benefits the developers and those we will benefit 9 10 from this project but also benefit the community. So I'm trying to appeal to my colleagues to do a no 11 12 vote and let the project go through the process and 13 come out better for all. Thank you. 14 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Any other questions or statements or members from the 15 Committee. At this point in time seeing there are 16 no other questions or statements. 17 I'll ask the Clerk to please call the roll. 18 19 THE CLERK: Acting Chair Rivera. 20 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: I vote aye and I 21 urge my colleagues to vote aye and Sophia votes aye as well. I do see some friends in the audience. 22 I recognize Karen Washington who is from my district 23 24 and who has a community garden there. I have been 25 a big fan of community gardens my entire life and I

2	know the value they provide and I am hopeful this
3	project moving forward I understand that there
4	is going to be relocation and I hope the new
5	location will bring life to what's needed there in
6	terms of the garden moving. With that being said,
7	I do vote aye.
8	THE CLERK: Council Member Reyna.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Permission to
10	explain my vote.
11	CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Yes.
12	COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: Thank you very
13	much. I wanted to just raise the issue I had
14	raised yesterday at the subcommittee level
15	regarding the MWBE and local business enterprise
16	percentage. I understand and commend the work that
17	has reached up until this point, reaching what was
18	in the contract with the holding group, a 15
19	percent MWBE procurement goal, but making sure that
20	EDC understands we could have pushed for and should
21	be in the works of revising that contract, which
22	they mentioned they will evaluate, to be able to
23	increase the percentage to a 20 percent so that it
24	mirrors the city's procurement goal of Local Law
25	One.

2	I look forward to seeing that that
3	revision is going to be completed and that the
4	contract will reflect what's going to be so I
5	just received word that they did consider and it is
6	just in. So, therefore, I would like to vote aye
7	on all.
8	THE CLERK: Council Member Barron.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I just want to
10	say once again, even when they relocate gardens,
11	that's usually a rap they give the community so
12	that they can settle for something they shouldn't
13	be settling for. Because relocation and I've
14	had that happen in my district a lot, they say
15	they'll relocate and then you spend years and you
16	never find the space so you find inadequate space.
17	Relocation can mean anything. So for all those who
18	are maybe not voting no because of relocation,
19	that's unacceptable.
20	So I vote no on LUs 994 to 999, which
21	is all of the Seaside Park. I vote no on that and
22	aye on all the rest.
23	THE CLERK: Council Member Jackson.
24	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: I vote on aye
25	on all based on what I said.

2	THE CLERK: I'd just like to remind all
3	Committee members that you have to sign the
4	committee reports and they'll be delivered to you
5	shortly.

7	THE CLERK: Council Member Vann.
8	COUNCIL MEMBER VANN: Aye.
9	THE CLERK: Council Member Arroyo.
10	COUNCIL MEMBER ARROYO: Yes.
11	THE CLERK: Council Member Dickens.
12	COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: Permission to
13	explain my vote.
14	CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Yes.
15	COUNCIL MEMBER DICKENS: I strongly
16	promote community gardens. They are very important
17	in my district. They provide an opportunity for
18	the communities to have a place within the inner
19	cities that allows for growth of vegetables,
20	flowers, a place to sit, a safe haven for our youth
21	and our seniors and family to participate.
22	So it worries me and I question on sea
23	haven that this is done. Contrary to my
24	colleague my esteemed colleague who will be
25	departing December 31st, and that's Council Member

2	Barron, when a community garden has to be relocated
3	in my district I ensure that it's within that
4	neighborhood before I agree to it and that it is of
5	at least a comparable or larger size. I'm trusting
б	that the council member whose district that it is
7	in has done so and therefore I'm voting aye on all.
8	THE CLERK: Council Member Garodnick.
9	COUNCIL MEMBER GARODNICK: Aye.
10	THE CLERK: Council Member Lappin.
11	COUNCIL MEMBER LAPPIN: Aye.
12	THE CLERK: Council Member Mendez.
13	COUNCIL MEMBER MENDEZ: I vote all on
14	aye, but I'm going to abstain on any of the LU
15	members associated with Seaside. Do I need to give
16	you those numbers or can you read them into the
17	record? They're numbers 994 thorough 999.
18	THE CLERK: Council Member Koo.
19	COUNCIL MEMBER KOO: Aye on all.
20	THE CLERK: Council Member Levin.
21	[Pause]
22	THE CLERK: Chair Weprin.
23	COUNCIL MEMBER WEPRIN: Aye.
24	THE CLERK: Council Member Williams.

2	COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: May I please
3	explain my vote?
4	CHAIRMAN RIVERA: Yes.
5	COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS: Thanks. So
6	I'm in a bit of a quandary. I am very concerned
7	about this project, but I'm also a little
8	frustrated. I've met some folks in the street and
9	asked them to contact my office so I can speak
10	about what these issues are and I didn't hear from
11	anybody. And I want to also be fair to my
12	colleague who has been working on this. So when I
13	ask for a response, I really need to get it because
14	I am very concerned about what's going on here and
15	I feel it unfair to get information the day of that
16	I then have to vote against my colleagues. So that
17	really, really bothers me.
18	And I'm saying this not just for these
19	groups but I've said this before to groups, please
20	reach out and then they just don't. And then it's
21	hard to do the thing that you believe is right to
22	do. I had, based on my original concerns, planned
23	on voting no but it's hard to do that when I'm just
24	getting information today. So I am going to
25	abstain right now for L. Use Nos. 994 to L. Use
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1	COMMITTEE ON LAND USE 14
2	Nos. 999 with the anticipation of getting some
3	information.
4	But I will say I am very much leaning
5	towards yes because I think it's unfair to spring
6	this on my colleague when I have asked this
7	information for a number for some time before
8	when I could have actually processed it a lot
9	better. And aye on all the rest.
10	THE CLERK: Council Member Ignizio.
11	COUNCIL MEMBER IGNIZIO: Yes.
12	THE CLERK: Council Member Levin.
13	COUNCIL MEMEBR LEVIN: I vote aye.
14	[Pause]
15	THE CLERK: Vote on Committee on Land
16	Use. All items are adopted by a vote of 15 in the
17	affirmative, zero abstentions and zero negatives
18	except Land Use Items 994, 995, 996, 997, 998 and
19	999, which are adopted by a vote of 12 in the
20	affirmative, one in the negative and two
21	abstentions.
22	[Pause]
23	CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: With all votes
24	being taken, this meeting is now adjourned.
