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2 CHAIRPERSON CROWLEY: Good morning.

Today, the Fire and Criminal Justice Committees going to vote on Proposed Intro 1174A, which is the local law to amend the New York City Fire Code in relation to the enhancement of emergency preparedness in New York City and the adoption of the current fire safety standards as incorporated in the 2009 edition of the international fire code and to amend certain provisions of the New York City Charter, New York City mechanical code and the New York City plumbing code consistent with the amendments to the New York City fire code. The committee will also vote on a preconsidered resolution which finds that the enactment of Proposed Intro 1174A does not have significant adverse impact on the environment and is consistent with the state environmental quality review act. Committee's first hearing on the proposed revisions to the fire code was held on November 21st, 2013 and a number of amendments have been made since that hearing. These amendments are detailed in the Committee report. The fiscal impact statement which indicated net revenues

COMMITTEE ON FIRE AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVCIES for the fiscal years 2015 and 2016 is made a part of the hearing record. I recommend a yes vote on the bill 1174A and the pre-considered resolution. At this time I'll now ask the clerk to take the vote. COMMITTEE CLERK: Kevin Penn [phonetic], Committee Clerk, roll call on the Committee on Fire and Criminal Justice, Intro 1174A pre-considered reso. Council Member Crowley? CHAIRPERSON CROWLEY: I vote aye.

COUNCIL MEMBER VALLONE: Briefly explain--excused to explain my votes. As you know at the hearing I had some concerns. I think this is a good bill, but I had some concerns about protection for fire fighters on roofs. After spending late last night talking to Rob Callander [phonetic], the excellent counsel to this committee who has done an unbelievable job for all these years, 10:30/11:00 last night convinced me that my concerns would be taken care of and that this bill was asked for by the fire department, that
