3	Mic's off. Okay. Good morning and welcome to
4	today's Finance Committee hearing. My name is
5	Domenic M. Recchia, Jr. I'm the Chair of the
6	Finance Committee. Before we get started I'd
7	like to introduce all my colleague who have
8	joined us here today. We have Council Member
9	Julissa Ferreras, Council Member Vincent
10	Ignizio, Council Member Rivera, Council Member
11	Koppell, Council Member Comrie, Council Member
12	Fidler, Council Member Cabrera, Council Member
13	Al Vann, Council Member Brewer, Council Member
14	Karen Koslowitz, Council Member Jimmy Oddo, and
15	Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer. Before we
16	start with our agenda, I just want to take a
17	quick moment to say a few words about my tenure
18	here at the Council. For many of us today, this
19	will be our last official action taken as City
20	Council Members. I am grateful the opportunity
21	to serve as Council Member. I'm grateful to
22	serve as the Council Member for the $47^{th}$
23	District, and I am thankful that I had the
24	opportunity to serve with the members of this
25	legislative body. In my 12 years tenure at the
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City Council, first as the Chair of the 2 Committee on Cultural Affairs, Libraries, 3 International Group Relations and then Finance 4 Chair, I was able to make a meaningful impact 5 on the lives of New Yorkers, cultural 6 institutions, and the culture fabric of the 7 city as a whole. This was all done by working 8 hand in hand with my fellow Council Members. 9 Ι 10 want to thank all of you for your dedication and commitment to public service. It has truly 11 12 been a privilege to serve with you as we work 13 to make this city better for our constituents 14 and the generations upon generations of New Yorkers who will call this city home in the 15 years to come. Under the leadership of Speaker 16 Christine Quinn, the City Council is a 17 legislative body that all New Yorkers can be 18 proud of. Although I leave the Council with a 19 heavy heart, the weight is lessened because I 20 21 know I have established friendships that will last a lifetime. It's been great being here, 22 but I have to say I had an outstanding staff. 23 2.4 My staff has been wonderful for many, many years, and especially the Finance staff. I want 25

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to thank my staff who has been with me. I want 2 3 to thank Ashley Owens [phonetic]. I want to thank Rommy [phonetic]. I want to thank Thomas 4 who are here, but I also want to thank all 5 those staff members who worked for me for many, б many years. But my Finance staff is the best 7 that there could be. Under the leadership of --8 [applause] They deserve a round of applause. 9 10 [applause] Under the leadership of Preston Niblack Deputy Director, Jeffery Rotas 11 12 [phonetic], my wonderful attorney, Tenisha 13 Edwards [phonetic]. Tenisha, you're the best. 14 Our wonderful economist, Ray Magesky [phonetic], Latonya Mckinny [phonetic], Nathan 15 Toth [phonetic], Regina Ryan, Scott Crowley, 16 and all the unit heads and analysts in the 17 division, I want to thank you all. It's been 18 great. I wish all of you the best of luck 19 because of you that I was so successful in 20 21 being a good Finance Chairman and one that could never forget what the staff really means. 22 Your dedication to this city is unremarkable 23 and people of the city should know how great 24 all of you are. So now, we'll get down to 25

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business of today. We have nine items on our 2 agenda. My Counsel, Tenisha Edwards, emailed 3 Finance Members the briefing papers for today's 4 agenda. So in the interest of time, I will only 5 itemize the bills on our agenda. We are voting 6 on a transparency reso. Remember to view all 7 the charts carefully and disclose to any 8 potential conflicts. We have Proposed Intro 9 10 172-A sponsored by Council Member Jimmy Vacca, which would exempt all not for profit 11 12 organizations from paying FDNY fees. We have 13 Proposed Intro 1040-A sponsored by Council 14 Member Donovan Richards, which requires the administration to create an interactive 15 searchable online database that tracks super 16 storm Sandy funds provided to New York City. 17 Next, we have Proposed Intro 1204-A which 18 extends the tax rate on hotel rooms. Next we 19 20 have Proposed Intro 1171-A sponsored by Council Member Al Vann, which amends the tax lien to 21 provide additional protections for individuals 22 whose property is subject to the lien sale. 23 2.4 Next, we have the preliminary budget extender, which extends the date for the Mayor to release 25

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the preliminary budget to February 12<sup>th</sup>. Next, 2 we have legislation that would have extended --3 that would extend healthcare insurance covers 4 to surviving spouse of a New York City Police 5 6 Department employee who died in the line of duty when struck by a truck on November 30<sup>th</sup>. 7 Next, we have a Land Use Item Council Member 8 Carmen Arroyo's district in the Bronx, the 9 10 building 1A Compass Residence which provides under 10 units of rental units to low income 11 12 families will receive the full tax exemption 13 for 40 years. And lastly, we have Intro 1186, 14 which is a Local Law that would establish the Hudson Yards bid located in the District of 15 Speaker Quinn who supports the establishment of 16 this bid. I will provide details on this item. 17 Of course, by law, the committee must answer 18 the following four questions before the 19 Committee vote on establish of this bid. The 20 Department of Small Business Services who is 21 here today will give us this information to 22 help us decide. One, all notices of hearing 23 24 for all hearings required to be held published and mailed as required. Does all the real 25

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2 property within the districts boundary benefit the establishment of the district, except as 3 otherwise provided by law? Is all real property 4 benefitted by the district included within the 5 district? And is the establishment of the 6 district in the best interest of the public? If 7 the committee finds the affirmative on these 8 four questions and the number of objects 9 required to prevent the creation of such 10 district are not filled, then the legislation 11 12 can be adopted. Those are all our items on 13 today. Before we here from the Department of 14 Small Business Services regarding the Hudson Yards bid, does anyone have any questions for O 15 & B, HPD, or council staff on any of the above 16 items? Okay. Okay. We recognize Council 17 Member Lewis Fidler. 18 19 COUNCIL MEMBER FIDLER: Before we get the Council Member Oddo who--20 21 CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Right to the very end, huh, Fidler? 22 COUNCIL MEMBER FIDLER: 23 Oh, I think-24 25

9	you know, as well as they serve you, they
10	served each and every one of us. They really
11	did an absolutely phenomenal job from Preston
12	to Nutrition Chairman Rhotas [phonetic] to
13	Judge-elect Edwards and to every single one of
14	you, I want to extend my thanks, but I think
15	the one thing that wasn't said was what a
16	terrific job you've done chairing this
17	committee and I want to express to you how much
18	we have appreciated the work you've done
19	protecting tax payers, protecting programs,
20	working with all of us making sure that our
21	interests were all heard and represented here
22	at the Finance Committee and at the Council.
23	And so on behalf ofI hope on behalf of all my
24	colleagues, I want to say a very hearty thank
25	you to you, Domenic Recchia.

4	Member Fidler. Member Jimmy Oddo?
5	COUNCIL MEMBER ODDO: Preston, of
6	all the outgoing members, who do you think
7	embodies that wonderful mixture of intelligence
8	and wit and institutional memory and good looks
9	best?
10	PRESTON NIBLACK: Council Member
11	Domenic M. Recchia, Jr. seems to me to be the
12	embodiment of all that one would want in a
13	Council Member.
14	COUNCIL MEMBER ODDO: Nicely played.
15	I just
16	PRESTON NIBLACK: [interposing] But
17	the borough of Staten Island is undoubtedly the
18	best borough in all of the City of New York.
19	COUNCIL MEMBER ODDO: I just ask you
20	to come up there
21	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: I second that.
22	COUNCIL MEMBER ODDO: And well
23	played by you, sir. I want you to sit up there
24	for a moment, Preston, because I want you to
25	take a victory lap. You know, I first started

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coming in this building in the early 90's, and 2 3 for seven glorious years I was a staffer here, and the relationships I made back then are 4 lifelong relationships and the camaraderie 5 among staff back then was just--it was a 6 blessing, and I--we, as individual members are 7 reminded every budget, every budget cycle, 8 every one of those wonderful budget negotiating 9 10 meetings that you and your staff that are outqunned, if you will, by the OMB [phonetic] and 11 12 by the folks across the hall. You guys have 13 done so well by us, and the dedication that you 14 and Jeff and everyone has demonstrated is so very much appreciated at the public -- and I 15 guess they want no, you know, they'd rather see 16 17 paint dry, but the public should see every now and again what happens in those meetings and 18 how professional you and your staff were in 19 allowing us to try to be a check on the 20 executive and try to have our fingerprints on a 21 budget. We're often criticized that we only 22 deal with a fraction of a fraction of the 23 24 percentage of a budget and we play the periphery, but that periphery happens to be 25

3	run-away youth, and all the things that we as
4	the representatives of the public, we hold
5	dear. And I can't thank you guys enough. You
6	have been fun. You're well informed and

9	certainly did right by me and my district and I
10	just want to thank you.
11	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you,
12	Council Member Jimmy Oddo.

15	recognize Council Member Al Vann.
16	PRESTON NIBLACK: May I just make one
17	quick response to Council Member Oddo?
18	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Yes.
19	PRESTON NIBLACK: I just wanted to
20	say that I think that although we were always
21	outnumbered by OMB, the Finance division was
22	never out-gunned by them.

24	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Council Member
25	Al Vann, before you make your statement, I just

2	want to recognize we've been joined by Council
3	Member Robert Jackson. Council Member Al Vann?
4	COUNCIL MEMBER VANN: Yeah, thank
5	you, Mr. Chair. I think the protocol has pretty
6	much been established, so it would be redundant
7	for me to have to thank Niblack, and Rhotas,
8	and Recchia, and Tenisha [phonetic]; it's been
9	done, and I think we all agree with that, and I
10	would include obviously my staffers and Dotty
11	[phonetic] who worked on this, but I want to
12	thank this committee because I hope you're
13	aware that we've been involved in reforming the
14	land sale process since probably 2011, and
15	because of the votes that you have taken, we
16	have really made it able for everyday people,
17	people trying to make it to hold on to and
18	retain the only asset they would probably ever
19	have in life, which is their house. And you
20	ought to be commended for that, and I'm very
21	happy that I was informed enough and have
22	enough support that we could advance that kind
23	of legislation, and the piece you have today
24	that we have voted on or will vote on is a very
25	significant conclusion to that process, at

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least for me, and that is very often too many 2 people when they die, they don't leave a will, 3 and therefore, those who would have inherited 4 that property have to go through a long costly 5 and messy process to try and establish their б position so they would be able to take 7 advantage of the land sale, which obviously, 8 would probably be too late, but because of the 9 10 bill we will vote on today, we make it simple. We make it easy and believe me, a lot of 11 12 people, a lot of poor people will be able to 13 hold onto their property because of it, and I'm 14 very pleased to have had the opportunities to serve with you, Tenisha, you did a tremendous 15 job negotiating this piece out. I mean, it's 16 unbelievable, beyond my expectation, but I 17 wanted to thank you in particular, but I want 18 to thank all of the Finance Committee. 19 I want 20 to thank my colleagues for being supportive. 21 Thank you. CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you 22

22 Council Member Al Vann. Council Member Leroy 24 Comrie?

3	sure my colleague is okay. Thank you, Mr.
4	Chair. I just want to also echo it as today is
5	my last day as a Council Member before this
6	body and is our last committee meeting as well.
7	The comments of Lou Fidler and Jimmy Oddo and
8	Al Vann, all more eloquent speakers than I, but
9	I want to thank the Finance staff, the Counsel
10	to the Committee, the Chairman, all of the
11	committee members that worked on finances. Head
12	of the Queens delegation over the past 12
13	years. I've had a lot of opportunities to work
14	with the Finance staff on many issues, both in
15	my district and for the delegation and for the
16	issues on the entire city. When we stepped into
17	save NYCHA back in '04, when we worked on the
18	teachers issues, helping them when we worked on
19	libraries issues. There's not been an issue
20	that this Finance staff has not been able to
21	become up with ideas, with methodologies to
22	save the City. And time and time again, this
23	Finance staff has led the fight and led the
24	effort to direct us to a better path and a
25	better idea. The implementation of the
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2 immigrant opportunities initiative, the immigration--the implementation of the CASA 3 initiative, the Workforce initiative, all of 4 5 the things that we were able to do as a council, what we had to do in 2002 to try to 6 rescue the city when the city was in a flux and 7 trying to re-establish itself after 9/11. 8 The Finance staff led the way, gave us sound advice 9 and information and directions when we had to 10 make hard choices. I'm just so humbled to have 11 12 been a part of that. I'm so thankful to all of 13 the members of the Finance staff and all of 14 your support staff as well that worked with you to make sure that we had the information, 15 worked with all of us to makes sure that we 16 made the right decisions. So, all of a sudden 17 I'm getting emotional. I'm not--I try not to 18 show my emotion, because you know, men are not 19 supposed to cry. You know, but --20 21 [laughter] [applause] 22 COUNCIL MEMBER COMRIE: Oh, lordy. 23 [off mic] Yeah, but it's been fun. It's been 24 fun, you know, even when we've argued. It's 25

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been fun when we had to deal with issues. 2 It's been fun because at the end of the day no 3 matter what, where you were or what you did you 4 were about making the City better. No matter 5 what district, what borough, what party, you б know? Jimmy Oddo and I knew each other before 7 I came on board, but I can say that he's truly 8 been someone that I would do anything for. So, 9 and all of the members. I didn't--I'm going to 10 stop right now. I was going to say more at the 11 12 meeting later, but I've truly enjoyed this 13 opportunity. Thank you, Domenic, for being a 14 friend and not just on the council business, but on regular business and thank you all. 15 CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you, 16 Leroy Comrie. You'll be missed. Okay, now 17 we're going to hear from Small Business 18 Services. They're going to give us a quick, 19 20 brief statement. Small Business Services, 21 business on the Hudson bid. ANDREW SCHWARTZ: Good morning, Mr. 22 Chairman and members of the Finance Committee. 23 I'm Andrew Schwartz, First Deputy Commissioner 24

for the Department of Small Business Services.

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I'm joined today by James Mettham, Assistant 2 Commissioner. As required by the Business 3 Improvement District Law, the Hudson Yards bid 4 steering committee mailed a summary of the City 5 Council Resolution to each owner of real 6 property within the proposed district that the 7 address is shown on the latest city assessment 8 role and to other persons registered with the 9 10 City to receive tax bills concerning property within the district and to tenants of each 11 12 building within the district. In addition, SBS 13 arranged for a required publication of the 14 resolution in the City record. We're now pleased to report the results of the objections 15 filed with the City clerk against the 16 establishment of the Hudson Yards Business 17 Improvement District. At the conclusion of the 18 objection period of 5:00 p.m. on December 14<sup>th</sup>, 19 and taking into consideration any objections 20 21 post marked by that date, there was one valid objection filed with the City Clerk. Therefore, 22 owners of 0.01 percent of assed value of all 23 24 benefitted real property situated in the district filed objections, and 0.012 percent of 25

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2 the owners of benefitted real property filed objections. So the total assessed value of 3 property in the district is 854,988,037 dollars 4 and the total number of properties is 1,160, 5 6 which are held by 855 property owners. Our review concludes that the level of objections 7 filed in terms of either the number of property 8 owners or percentage of assed valuation is 9 10 within the acceptable threshold needed to advance the bill for favorable consideration by 11 12 the Full City Council and SBS requests the 13 Council approve the establishment of this bid. 14 The Department of Small Business Services supports the establishment of the bid which 15 will be managed by the Hudson Yards/Hell's 16 Kitchen Alliance District Management 17 Association, and in our judgment, the bid will 18 improve business conditions and the quality of 19 life in Hudson Yards and Hell's Kitchen area 20 21 making it a better place to live, work, and visit and laying the groundwork for further 22 neighborhood development activities in Midtown 23 West. We thank the Committee for its 2.4 consideration of this and the 25 bids that the 25

4	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Thank you very
5	much. We recognize Council Member Gale Brewer.
б	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Thank you. I
7	always have a question.
8	ANDREW SCHWARTZ: We know that. At
9	least you're consistent from my last meeting.
10	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Yeah, I am
11	very consistent. The partI know Hell's
12	Kitchen well, but how do you have a bid when in
13	Hudson Yards when all I see are trucks and a
14	lot of construction? So I don't understand
15	who's the bid person in Hudson Yards? Is it
16	Related and someone?
17	JAMES METTHAM: Good morning. My
18	name is James Mettham. I'm assistant
19	Commissioner at SBS. There are over 800
20	properties in the Hell's Kitchen/Hudson Yards
21	area.
22	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Hell's
23	Kitchen, I know. Every one of them
24	JAMES METTHAM: And this, you are
25	correct that this does take into a
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consideration a number of development 2 3 properties that will be coming online over the next few years. Those developers, whether it's 4 Related or others, have been part of the 5 Steering Committee and stakeholders that have б been involved in formatting and talking about 7 the formation of this bid and have provided 8 their support for this particular --9

10 COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: So how many of the stakeholders are really large? 11 Are there some small property owners also, and has 12 13 the board been put together, you know, to 14 include--obviously you need a resident. I mean, I know the construction of what a bid war looks 15 like because I'm on a lot of them. So, how does 16 that work when you don't really have large 17 buildings there yet? I just don't want the big 18 guys to swallow up the small guys. 19 JAMES METTHAM: 20 It's a good

question, and it's been talked about in the Steering Committee during formation. There will be specific classes as you alluded to in terms of residential, commercial tenants as well as property owners, and property owners,

2	they'll be a mix of both commercial property
3	owners, both large and small, which the
4	district management association, the non-profit
5	will determine and work on. They've worked with
6	the Community Board as well in terms of
7	assuring that there will be a mixed
8	representation of different types of commercial
9	classes on that board.
10	COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: Thank you.
11	CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Seeing no
12	further questions. Does anyone have a question
13	on anything on the agenda for today? Without
14	seeing thatyeah, we're going to vote. Let's
15	vote then. You'll make your statement
16	afterwards. Okay, after the vote. Okay, Billy,

And I also want to thank the 9 10 colleagues, because I actually, I love going to 11 hearings when the agencies present, and I think 12 the way that it was organized, was phenomenal, 13 and the best of course was working with the 14 staff to try to figure out in budget negotiation committee how to make these numbers 15 work for the people of the City of New York, 16 and I don't know how staff did, but you know, 17 particularly with Early Learn and elsewhere. 18 They figured out a way of trying to keep senior 19 20 centers and daycare centers and so on open, which is the bread and butter and the safety 21 net that so many families have. So I am very 22 honored I was able to co-chair the Manhattan 23 24 delegation for 12 years, and sitting on budget negotiation with Finance was a real learning 25
