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1 COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES, AND ELECTIONS 3 2 [gavel] 3 CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Good afternoon and welcome to the first meeting of the New York City 4 5 Council Committee on Rules, Privileges, and 6 Elections. I think it's most popular meeting of the 7 meeting of rules, committees, and privileges, and 8 elections that I'm familiar with. But I do hope 9 you'll all come back for future meetings so when we 10 consider rules reforms and many other various in 11 sundry items. I'm Council Member Brad lander and 12 I'm honored to chair this committee. Before we 13 begin I want to introduce the other members of the 14 committee and the other council members who are 15 here today. We're honored to be joined by Speaker 16 Mark-Viverito who's a member of this committee. The 17 other members of the Rules Committee at least for 18 the next hour or two Council Member Donovan 19 Richards from Queens, Council Member Margaret Chin 20 from Manhattan, Council Member Debbie Rose from 21 Staten Island, Council Member Ydanis Rodriguez from 22 Manhattan, Council Member Rafael Espinal from 23 Brooklyn. We're pleased to be joined by the Minority Leader who's an ex officio member of this 24 25 committee and if you've gotten and read the

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2	documents perhaps a future member as well as a
3	number of other council members; Council member
4	Julissa Ferreras from Queens, Rosie Mendez from
5	Manhattan, Mark Weprin from Queens, Corey Johnson
6	from Manhattan so welcome to all of you. And I also
7	want to acknowledge the Committee Council Amotala
8	Booth [sp?] and in a little while I'll think her
9	and some other staff for the strong work that they
10	did in getting ready for today's hearing.
11	Today we're considering a proposed
12	slate of officers, committee chairs, and members
13	that will enable the city council to move strongly
14	forward into the new term under the leadership of
15	Speaker Mark-Viverito. The leaders and chairs put
16	forward here reflect the diversity of our city, of
17	our boroughs, and of this council. They've got
18	relevant experience, expertise, and life history
19	that makes them ideal for their appointments. Just
20	a few examples; our public housing committee chair
21	grew up in public housing and has spent years
22	assisting and organizing residents. Our immigration
23	committee chair proposed today is the first
24	Mexican-American in the council and has taken
25	strong leadership in his community and beyond at

Our health committee chair is 3 the first openly HIV positive member of this body and a longtime advocate for better health services. 4 They and the other chairs and leaders proposed here 5 6 will be able to work closely with the de Blasio administration toward our shared goals of reducing 7 8 inequality through more broadly shared prosperity in a thriving economy, expanding educational 9 10 opportunities, creating and preserving affordable 11 housing, addressing the challenges of 12 sustainability and resiliency facing our 13 neighborhoods in the city and so much more given 14 all the committees that are laid out here. In addition the leaders and chairs proposed today will 15 not hesitate to provide strong and independent 16 oversight to hold the de Blasio administration 17 accountable, to exercise the council's duties under 18 the charter, to help identify areas of concern and 19 20 improve the functioning of our government in ways 21 that improves the lives of the people of New York City. With these committees in place the council 22 will be able to advance legislation, negotiate 23 24 budget and land use proposals, shine a spot light on critical issues and include the perspectives of 25

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2	the full array of New Yorkers in debates over the
3	future of our neighborhoods and our city. And I
4	hope and I believe that when New Yorkers look at
5	the slate we're presenting, when they look at the
6	council, when they look at the, at our committees,
7	they will see people that have their back, people
8	that look like them, people who are asking the
9	questions they want asked and moving forward the
10	legislative priorities and goals that they want to
11	see move forward. And I'm proud of the, again the
12	committee chairs, leaders, and committee members
13	that we are putting forward today. So let me call
14	peoples' attention to the materials which are
15	before you. We have some copies for members of the
16	press and the public. Again I apologize we, we, we
17	didn't imagine such a fully subscribed committee
18	meeting but more copies are on the way and you'll
19	have them soon and additional copies will be
20	available at the stated a little later.
21	Resolution number one provides the
22	titles and descriptions of the committees and
23	subcommittees, includes amendments to ex officio
24	officers and also to the meeting frequency
25	requirement. We're currently required to meet
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1 COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES, AND ELECTIONS 7 2 monthly but there's not that much of January left 3 so we're amending it so that that requirement commences next month as opposed to this one. And 4 the accompanying message M13 provides committee 5 assignments, allowances, officers of the council, б and the creation of new committees and 7 8 subcommittees, an example we are concluding the 9 work, the good work done by the committee on lower 10 Manhattan and instead establishing a committee on 11 recovery and resiliency which will be able to focus 12 on the recovery on Sandy damaged communities and 13 consider the resiliency of all neighborhoods at a 14 critical moment moving forward. I want to say a few thank yous. A lot of work went into this document 15 and we obviously appreciate the leadership of the 16 17 speaker and her team in putting it together on the staff side last night during the blizzard fairly 18 late into the evening. I want to recognize and 19 20 thank our committee council Amotala Booth [sp?] as 21 well as Nedire[phonetic] Joshua in the General Counsel's office, Garry Altman[phonetic] and John 22 Lasansky[phonetic] in the Speaker's office, Joe 23 24 Torronto[phonetic], Rachel Goodman[phonetic], and Michael Friedman Schnapp[phonetic] all of whom put 25

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a lot of hours in getting us ready for today so
thanks to all of you.

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We could take comments now. If people have them we'll have a clock of a maximum of two minutes and let me ask whether there's any members who wish to comment beginning with Speaker Mark-Viverito.

SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: I want to thank 9 10 all of the council members that are here and the staff and the chair of this committee. Obviously to 11 12 put together this list of assignments and 13 chairmanships is one that comes after much 14 deliberation, conversations, visits to districts to talk to members about their interest in issues, the 15 work that we need to lay out. Very proud that as 16 17 that deliberdate[phonetic], deliberation was happening, we were able to come up with assignments 18 that are really truly reflective of the beautiful 19 diversity that is New York City. And that lays out 20 21 really the extensive scope of work and the agenda 22 that we need to build to make New York City a better place to work on behalf of our individual 23 constituents in our districts but obviously overall 24 for the city of New York. And in the years and in 25

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2	the months to come I look forward very much to work
3	in true partnership with each and every one of you
4	on behalf of New York City. And so thank you Chair
5	Brad Lander for all the work that went into this
6	and to my staff as well. And we look forward to the
7	work ahead so thank you all very much.
8	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you Madam
9	Speaker. If there's any members who are members or
10	not members of this committee. I recognize ex
11	officio member and Minority Leader Vinny Ignizio.
12	MINORITY LEADER IGNIZIO: Thank you very
13	much Mr. Chairman and then thank you Madam Speaker.
14	I just wanted to convey to those that in the press
15	and then those that are watching on television that
16	I want to confirm what the speaker is, had just
17	said. She has made a deliberative attempt to reach
18	out to every member and to gage their interest in
19	several committees and what they think they can add
20	to assist the people of the city of New York and
21	that's reflected here today. I think this is a very
22	deliberative step towards bringing this body
23	together and I think you know that's ultimately
24	what we need as a council as we move forward into
25	the budgeting process and then the law making

2	process for the next several weeks and months
3	ahead. So I just wanted to commend you Mr. Chairman
4	and commend Madam Speaker for bridging the gap
5	between all sides of this body, bringing it
6	together, and having this function is the rightful
7	body that it is. Thank you.
8	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you Mr.
9	Minority leader. Any other, either members of the
10	committee or other council members who are here
11	push to make any comments? Okay seeing none we will
12	move on to the roll call on the, on the items on
13	today's calendar. We are coupling the vote on
14	resolution one regarding the committee and
15	subcommittee designations, ex officio members, and
16	meetings together with the message pursuant to M13
17	addressing the committee assignments and
18	allowances. And I would ask the committee council
19	to call the role.
20	CLERK MARTIN: William Martin, Committee
21	Clerk. Roll call vote committee on Rules. Council
22	Member Lander.
23	COUNCIL MEMBER LANDER: Aye.
24	CLERK MARTIN: Rodriguez.
25	COUNCIL MEMBER RODRIGUEZ: Aye.

12	CLERK MARTIN: By a vote of seven in the
13	affirmative, zero on the negative, and no
14	abstentions both items have been adopted.
15	[applause]
16	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you. I want
17	to make a couple of closing comments before we
18	adjourn the meeting just on the next steps for the
19	rules committee. One important item, there are many
20	important items in these documents but one
21	important item that the committee took today and
22	that we hope the full council will take as well is
23	to expand the membership of this rules committee to
24	better reflect the diversity of the council. We're
25	adding the Minority Leader. We just voted to add
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1 COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES, AND ELECTIONS 12 the Minority Leader, to add Council Member 2 Garodnick, Council Member Dickens, Council Member 3 Levin, and Council Member Williams to this 4 5 committee. As a result the committee will be in a stronger position as we move forward in the coming 6 weeks to consider the advice and consent 7 appointments put forward by the mayor as well as 8 proposals for rules reform to strengthen the 9 10 council as a body which we'll be taking up in this 11 committee. The first appointment will be 12 considering is Mayor de Blasio's nomination of Mark 13 Peters to serve as the Commissioner of the New York 14 City Department of Investigation, a key position in guaranteeing integrity, combatting corruption, and 15 improving New York City government. We look forward 16 to fair and thorough hearing next week and it has 17 been scheduled or is in the process of being put on 18 the calendar for next Thursday, January 30th at 19 10:30 a.m. We'll do that out in the, out in the 20 21 chambers where we'll give Mr. Peters a fair and thorough hearing about his qualifications and his 22 vision for the department of investigation 23 including his plans for appointing the first NYPD 24 inspector general to provide strong and independent 25

1 COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES, AND ELECTIONS 13 oversight to help improve policing in all of our 2 3 communities as required by the law that the council passed last year. And we'll look forward to 4 receiving, people are welcome to come and testify 5 6 at that hearing or if you have questions that you believe we should ask please reach out to us and 7 provide them. We also look forward to receiving 8 nominations for the Landmarks Preservation 9 10 Commission, Taxi and Limousine Commission, and 11 other positions that we anticipate will be coming 12 in the future. And in addition we've committed to 13 move forward this quarter with a rules reform 14 process to make the council more responsive, transparent, and effective, taking the politics out 15 of member items, ensuring fair consideration of 16 legislation, other ideas as well. And we'll begin 17 that process with a public hearing which will 18 invite members of the public, good government 19 groups, council members, and others to testify 20 21 about proposals for changes that they believe or members of the public you believe would strengthen 22 the council. I promise that we'll listen carefully 23 and consider all the ideas not only the ones in the 2.4 platform that some of us released in the fall but 25

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2	all the ideas that people bring to us before we
3	bring a specific proposal back to this committee
4	and to the full council to consider later this
5	year. So with that, I hope that's enough of a
6	teaser that some of you will come back to future
7	meetings of the rules committee with thanks to the
8	Speaker, to the other members of this committee and
9	the other members of this council.
10	[gavel]
11	CHAIRPERSON LANDER: This meeting of the
12	rules committee is adjourned.
