Finance Committee hearing; my name is Julissa

Ferreras and I chair the Committee on Finance; I

would like to thank my colleagues for joining me,

Council Member Ignizio, Council Member Johnson,

Majority Leader Van Bramer, Council Member Rodriguez,

and Council Member Gibson.

Today we have three items on our agenda; we have two land use items and a transparency resolution; let's start with the land use items. The first is Riverview House, which is located in Council Member Gibson's district in the Bronx. This property current has an Article 5 partial tax exemption, which are exemptions provided to a rental project owned by a redevelopment company using project-based Section 8 subsidy contracts. Riverview House's current

property tax exemption will expire soon. The resolution today will provide a new partial tax exemption to Riverview House for 40 years. This property contains 383 units and provides rental housing to low-income families.

The next land use item is also in Council Member Vanessa Gibson's district in the Bronx; Artsbridge Senior Housing will receive an Article 11 partial property tax exemption, which is provided to Housing Development Fund companies for the purpose of encouraging non-profits organizations to build and operate housing for low-income households. This property will provide 61 units of rental housing to low-income seniors. The property tax exemption will be in effect for 40 years and will be regulated by the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, although otherwise known as HPD.

Council Member Gibson supports both of these projects and representatives from HPD are here to answer any questions you may have on these land use items.

Our last item on the agenda is a transparency resolution; this resolution sets forth new changes in the designation of certain

organizations receiving local aging and youth discretionary funding, as well as new changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council and other entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk.

As with all transparency resolutions,

Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form

indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any

of the groups on the attached list. If any Council

Member has a potential conflict of interest with any

of the organizations listed, he or she has the

opportunity to disclose a conflict at the time of

their vote.

As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors that are used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved; Jeremy Polskar [phonetic] from the General Counsel's Office

can assist you should you have any questions
regarding the disclosure.

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These are all the items for today; before we take questions from the members on these items I will turn the mic over to my colleague, Council Member Gibson for a comment on the two land use items for today.

COUNCIL MEMBER GIBSON: Thank you Madame Chairwoman and good morning to my colleagues and to each and every one of you. I'm truly delighted today to have not one, but two items on the Finance agenda this morning, an Article 5 and as well as an Article 11 tax exemption. I do know these projects very, very well and I'm really appreciative of the work of Council as well as HPD to make sure that we offer continued opportunities for affordable housing across the City of New York. Riverview is a longstanding building in my community, one of my neighbors and I know that this extension will certainly provide that critical housing for families throughout our city. And Artsbridge, to which I'm really excited about being built by Highbridge CDC and the Highbridge community of my district, is an attempt to provide opportunities for our seniors. We know that we have

a vacuum of senior housing across the City and this
is an opportunity to provide that affordable housing
opportunity for many, many low-income seniors in the
community in the Bronx. So I'm thankful to the
Chairwoman as well as my colleagues and HPD for their
support of this and look forward to working with all
of you so that we can continue to have these
opportunities to grant tax exemption programs to many
of our developers that recognize the fact that
affordable housing is the investment that's needed in
this City, so I'm proud to support this and thank you
so much for your leadership, Madame Chairwoman.
