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2 CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS: Good morning. 3 Welcome to today's Finance Committee hearing. I am Julissa Ferreras, and I chair the Finance Committee. 4 I'd like to acknowledge that we've been joined by 5 Council Members Rodriguez, Council Member Van Bramer, 6 Council Member Cumbo, Council Member Rosenthal and 7 8 everyone else will be joining us shortly.

9 Today we have a very heavy agenda. We have 10 three bid items, a Transparency Resolution, two 11 budget modifications, the council's operating budget 12 for fiscal 2015 and the execute budget extender.

Let's start with the execute budget extender. The administration has asked us to extend the date of first submission of the fiscal year 2015 executive budget from April 26th to May 8th, by providing the administration extra time to release the executive budget.

19 The council will need extra time to hold 20 its Executive Budget Hearings which will now conclude 21 no later than June 6th, rather than May 25th. This 22 legislation would also extend the other Charter 23 mandated dates relating to the Executive Budget 24 actions taken by other officials, such as the 25 Independent Budget Office and the Borough Presidents.

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2 The legislation also changes the Mayor's submission
3 of revenue estimate and the date for fixing the tax
4 rates from June 5th to June 18th.

5 Our next piece of legislation relates to 6 the council's operating budget. Under the Charter, 7 the council has until March 10th to submit to the 8 Mayor its own operating budget for the next fiscal 9 year. This budget must be presented to the Mayor for 10 inclusion in the Executive Budget without amendment 11 by the Mayor after the Council approves it.

12 In January, the Charter date was extended 13 to April 10th by legislation passed by this 14 committee. This year the Council's budget totals just over \$56.66 million dollars, which reflects an 15 increase of 10 percent from last year, or just one-16 tenth of a percent of the City's budget. 17 The Council's budget increase reflects the Council's 18 expansion in committees, as well as in the central 19 staff's operation, including the establishment of a 20 new division such as the Economic and Community 21 Development division and the expansion existing 22 divisions to allow the council to exercise greater 23 oversight over the City's operations and allow the 24 council to be in a better and more skilled position 25

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2	to shape the values of our city. The Council's			
3	Administrative Services Director, Ed O'Malley and our			
4	Fiscal Officer, Marcello Testa are here to answer			
5	questions on the council's operating budget.			
6	The third item we will discuss is a			
7	Transparency Resolution. This resolution sets forth			
8	new changes in the designation of certain			

9 organizations receiving local aging and youth
10 discretionary funding, as well as new changes in the
11 designation of certain organizations receiving
12 funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the
13 budget.

Organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the pre-qualification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk.

As with all transparency resolutions, council members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If a council member has a potential conflict of interest with any of these organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of

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2 their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any 3 conflicts you may have with the proposed 4 subcontractors that are used by organizations 5 sponsored by discretionary funding.

6 These disclosures must be made before the 7 subcontractor can be approved. Jeremy Parker 8 [phonetic] from the General Counsel's office can 9 assist you with any questions or concerns regarding 10 disclosures.

Our fourth and fifth items are two budget 11 12 modifications. We have an expense budget 13 modification and a revenue modification. The revenue 14 budget modification or MN3 (phonetic) would recognize \$1.964 billion in new revenues, the bulk of which 15 comes from taxes. This reflects the unexpected 16 17 strength of the City's real estate market and O & B's [phonetic] under estimation of personal income tax 18 19 collection. Miscellaneous revenues mostly come from assets and sales of various kinds. The expense 20 21 budget modification would modify units of appropriation and transfer city funds between various 22 agencies in fiscal year 2014 expense budget. 23 The expense budget modification would also 24

fund Council's initiatives, the net effect of the

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2 proposed modification is zero. The changes included 3 in MN2 are those current year new needs. Peg \mathbf{r} estoration and other adjustments presented in the 4 November 2013 updated of the financial plan in the 5 February 2014 plan update. More details are in your б documents and representatives from the Office of 7 8 Management and Budget are here to answer any questions you may have on the two budget 9 10 modifications.

Lastly, we have three bid resolutions. 11 12 These resolutions set the hearing date of April 29th 13 at 10:00 a.m. for the Finance Committee to consider 14 amendments to the district plans for three bids. The Church Avenue bid in Council Member Eugene's 15 district; the Kings Highway bid in Council Member 16 Deutsch's district seeks a district plan amendment to 17 delete provisions in their district plan that require 18 the bids to maintain brick pavers along the sidewalk 19 in the district. 20

This change will shift the liability of sidewalk maintenance from the bid to the individual property owners. The Downtown Alliance bid in Council Member Chin's district also seeks a district plan amendment to require the commercial portion of a

2	mixed-use property to be assessed at the commercial
3	rate, rather than the residential rate of a dollar.
4	Representatives from the Department of
5	Small Business Services are here to answer any
б	questions you may have on the three bid items.
7	These are all the items for today. I will
8	now open the floor to members who may have questions
9	on the bids, the Transparency Resolution, the two
10	budget modifications, the council's operating budget
11	or the executive budget extender.
12	I would like to also acknowledge that we've
