District Landmarking. I just wanted the record to

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reflect that as we have made as we have put in the requirement that the contributions of African Americans be noted when there is a significant contribution that they made in this district so their being landmarked. But I wanted to highlight that going back to about 1640 there were a dozen or so free and so called half free blacks who were given a land track in this same district that we are now land marking. And the land was given to them, they cleared the land, they farmed the land and then in 1667 the land was taken from them without any compensation. So going down further as we talk about reparations this would certainly be on the instances that we would be able sight. In 1815, 1850's the area was known as little Africa and it composed the largest concentration of African Americans living in the United States at that time. They were targeted 1863 during the draft riots. They were a targeted We want that to be noted as well. area. And finally there were significant Africa Americans who lived there namely Henry Highland Garnett was there and the church that became known as Mother AME Zion Church which located in that area as well.
