SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: Thank you, my colleagues.

So we're here today -- a quick meeting, hopefully -- to vote on three home rule messages that will authorize and urge Albany to pass State legislation relating to New York City issues before the end of their legislative session.

Senate Bill 7892 and Assembly Bill 10144 would authorize the establishment of a citywide 25-mile-per-hour speed limit. A few weeks ago we passed

a broad package of local laws to improve traffic safety, but in order to take this next vital step of establishing a citywide limit of 25 miles per hour, we need State authorization to do so and this home rule message will request just that. I also wanna recognize, I know that we do have Amy Cohen Eckstein who is here with us today who lost her son, Sammy Cohen Eckstein; she's been an incredible activist and advocate, going to Albany many times to encourage that this legislation be passed; she's been non-stop

on this, so I do wanna recognize and thank her for

being here with us today.

Our next home rule message authorizes and urges the passage of Senate Bill 7849-A and Assembly Bill 10021-B, which would allow New York City to expand joint bidding to public work projects across the five boroughs. Allowing joint bidding on contracts will facilitate the timely, cost-effective and convenient completion of public work projects involving private utility work.

And the final home rule message
authorizes and urges the passage of Preconsidered
State Legislation Resolution S.7664 and A.9059, which
would amend the New York City administrative code to

2	reflect a change in union representative for pilot

4	two. This change in the administrative code has
5	become necessary because pilot and marine engineers
6	are as of recently represented by the United
7	Firefighter Association and as such, should be
8	represented through UFA on the pension fund board.
