SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: Thank you Madam Public Advocate. I'm... Good morning to everyone.

SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: So I, obviously we had, wanted this meeting to happen sooner so we will try to get through as quickly as possible and ... I appreciate everyone's patience. It really was an important date, our first budget here in the city council adopting the fiscal year 15. Some of our colleagues have been very patient. I know Council Member Cornegy had his daughter here celebrating her 10 years and her birthday. Obviously we'd have preferred him to be home with her. And Council Member Julissa Ferreras had told me earlier that while she was here her son took his first step so...

SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: It is the moments that we lose in our, in this work but I, I appreciate everyone's patience and it really is that we're all teaching each other here our first

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2 steps in this new Council. So we're voting on the

3 fiscal year 2015 budget.

UNKNOWN FEMALE: May we have quiet in the chambers please.

[background comments]

SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: ...2015 budget, this budget is balanced. And because of the council's tireless advocacy it does a lot of good for New Yorkers. It is responsible, progressive, and collaborative. The budget we're voting on today doesn't just reflect the priorities of 51 members, it reflects the needs of 8.4 million people in all five boroughs. By working together we created a process in which every member was heard and every member had input. Every community in New York City had a seat at the table. And every community stands to benefit. This was a budget process that New Yorkers can be proud of. It was a process that was substantive, thorough, and sparked real debate about real issues that affect New Yorkers. This budget reflects New York's values. We're a city that takes care of our own, seeks to lift people up, and strive to give more opportunities. This budget addresses public safety, employment

2	opportunities, education, health, and
3	infrastructure in real and meaningful ways. The
4	Council's work was exhausting and the results you
5	know. NYPD will very soon have 200 more police
6	officers on the beat. These officers will help
7	those decreasing levels all over the city and will
8	give NYPD more of the tools they need to succeed.
9	NYPD will have 200 more civilian staff to make sure
10	uniformed officers are available to do the police
11	work they were hired to do. This budget will also
12	give thousands of children access to free lunch
13	through an important pilot program. This pilot
14	program will help keep our school children fed
15	allowing them to focus on learning and not where
16	their next meal will come from. Both of these
17	initiatives are wins for New Yorkers and we are
18	proud to have championed them. In addition every
19	neighborhood will benefit from this budget. With
20	over 66.5 million for vital services and programs.
21	Additionally our budget provides over 80 million
22	dollars in supportive programs highlighted in the
23	council's budget response such as our gun violence
24	initiative which will help neighborhoods across the
25	city. Our budget also includes 15 million dollars

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for 14 new council initiatives, 36 million dollars in enhancements, and 51 million dollars to maintain existing council program. These include keeping NYCHA community and senior centers open across the city,...

SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: ...funding an additional one, 11,700 summer jobs for our youth,...

[applause, cheering]

income childcare vouchers, expanding the city council's anti-gun-violence initiatives, providing funding for the city council merit based scholarship program for CUNY students, investing in New York City's parks by increasing funding for Parks maintenance. The council has also set aside 15 million dollars for 14 new innovative initiatives which reflect the council's diversity. Some of these include supporting English classes and legal services to New York City's immigrants to support and strengthen their participation in the democratic process. Funding asthma screening education, community health workers, care coordination, and pest control for children with

۷	ascima. The council's also proud to sponsor
3	initiatives in areas such as, such as anti-gun
4	violence, children services, criminal justice
5	services, cultural affairs, CUNY, domestic violence
6	prevention, education, health services and
7	prevention, homeless services, housing, immigrant
8	services, legal services, libraries, and mental
9	health services, parks and recreation, public
10	safety, senior services, small business services,
11	and workforce development. And the tax commission's
12	veteran services and youth community and
13	development. And we'll be rollling out many new
14	initiatives thanks to the council as well. One of
15	these initiatives is to provide LGBT senior
16	services in every borough. The critical shortage
17	[applause, cheering]
18	SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: The critical
19	shortage of, of culturally competent and welcoming
20	services for LGBT elders, especially those elders
21	living in poverty outside of Manhattan calls out
22	for a solution as part of New York City's
23	commitment to reduce inequality. LGBT seniors in
24	every community needs services tailored to them

located in areas that are accessible to them.

Another initiative expands the capacity of
community based providers to meet mental health
needs for court involved and foster system youth
and families. This includes implementing an
effective risk assessment tool to determine as
early as possible in the arrest process whether or
not juveniles are in need of mental health services
as well as engaging families of court involved
youth through family counselling, respite services,
and other evidence based practices, and connecting
community based providers to other non-governmental
organizations that have familiarity with the
courts; ACS, DOC, and other relevant city and state
agencies. Through this new initiative we can help
young New Yorkers who are at, at risk get the help
they need before it's too late, a goal we should
always strive for in our juvenile justice system.
Also through capital funding we're able to launch
programs to renovate unsafe bathrooms in public
schools. And additionally the council and the de
Blasio administration are collectively committing
nearly 50 million dollars towards NYCHA security
measures including putting security cameras in

public housing complexes in order to make New

3 Yorker, New York safe for all of our residents.

[applause, cheering]

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SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: I'm very proud of the results we'll be delivering with this budget but I'm also very proud of the reformed process we used this year to make this process more inclusive and equitable than ever before. For your first time ever this year discretionary funds have been distributed through a formula that gives an equal baseline to every district with additional funding for districts that have high levels of need based on poverty level. Every New Yorker should benefit from this process and our reformed discretionary process has ensured that no district is losing out because of politics. So I want to thank all of my colleagues so much for their collaboration. And I also want to thank the tremendous work of the finance and central staff for this budget. And I will name each and every one of them; Latonya McKinney [sp?]...

And that means a lot.

COUNCIL MEMBER FERRERAS: Thank you Madam Speaker. Speaker Mark-Viverito I want to thank you for your leadership throughout this process and because of your leadership that we are able to adopt this progressive, transparent, and equitable budget tonight. I also want to thank you for supporting my desire to serve this council as its finance chair and allowing me the opportunity to serve the people of this wonderful city in this roll. It is my goal not to only make my constituents proud but also make my fellow council members and speaker proud. So thank you again for this opportunity. Now if I could take a moment of personal privilege. I'd like to mention my father Julio Ferreras, a man who 40 years ago came to this country as a calculus professor from the Dominican Republic only to realize that he would have to go back to college in the United States and start his academic career again. He took a job pumping gas in

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the Bronx when I was three months old in order to support me and my mother. I now wonder if when he was looking at his three month old baby girl if he would have ever thought that she would one day become the Chair of the New York City's Finance Committee and stand proudfully today after negotiating a 75 billion dollar budget.

COUNCIL MEMBER FERRERAS: I want to thank my parents for all they have done for me throughout my life and I want to dedicate this budget to the hardworking New Yorkers embodied in this city, by the immigrant who will now have access to legal defense that will keep his family in tact throughout the New York immigrant family, through the New York Immigrant Family Unity Project, the mothers who will feel the relief of knowing their children are cared for through priority five vouchers, for our youth who will, who through the summer youth employment program will be given an opportunity to earn money while learning valuable job skills, for our students who will be able to get help paying for their education through the council's merit based scholarship, for our

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seniors who won't have to worry about their senior centers closing and where they will get a hot meal. The speaker did an excellent job at summarizing many of our programs and initiatives that were funded in this year's budget. However I would like to highlight the other changes in the budget that reflect the new focus of transparency, equal participation that I have champion in negotiations with administration. I'm happy to say that we are able to restructure several units of appropriation finally.

appropriation for UPK and Early Intervention in next year's DOE budget. In addition the administration has agreed to seven terms and conditions in, to include them into this budget.

And this is a big deal. We have never come close to getting this many terms and conditions included in the budget ever. I know that the speaker said a round of thank yous to the Finance Committee earlier but we can never say too many thank yous, especially to the people who are so deserving of it. First I will address the council members, all

51 of us work collaboratively, collaboratively with
each other and the administration to accomplish
tremendous feats in this budget. What we all have
in common is our shared goals to serve the
residents of this city and offer them quality
services, greater opportunity, and increase access
to information. I also want to thank the speaker's
staff, Ramone Martinez [sp?], Jeff Rhodas [sp?] for
helping me through this budget process. Although
Jeff is no longer in the finance division as he has
moved onto greener pastures to the speaker's office
he has been instrumental in this budget's process
and I thank you. And I would also like to thank our
talented and hardworking finance staff under the
leadership of our new acting director Latonya
McKinney [sp?]. Latonya has been the finance, at
the finance division for many years. This is her
first budget as the leader of the division and I
thank her for her excellent work she has gone
throughout, she has done throughout this budget
