CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you very much, Sergeant-at-Arms. Good morning, everyone. My name is Mark Weprin and I am the chair of the Zoning and Franchises Subcommittee and this the continuation of a recessed meeting that happened yesterday, where we heard two items, one that is two Land Use numbers; yesterday, had the hearings and we will be voting today. Those two items were the preconsidered M 770445, which is the IHOP restaurant International House of Pancakes in Council Member Inez Barron's district, and also Land Use numbers 98 and 99, which is the 49th Avenue rezoning in Council Member James Van Bramer's district.

We are joined this morning at the committee by the following committee members: Council Member Vincent Gentile; Council Member Ruben Wills; Council Member Donovan Richards; Council Member Antonio Reynoso, who we think has the star, although it's being reviewed by you know the stewards; there is some dispute; Council Member 2 Ritchie Torres and Council Member Vincent Ignizio,

3 so we have a quorum and we are going to move

4 directly to a vote. This meeting will be followed

5 by the Land Use meeting, so please everybody stay

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Before we vote on Land Use number 98 and 99, I have a statement from Council Member Van Bramer, who isn't here at the meeting this morning, but he is in the building. He asked me to read the following statement into the record. The statement says, "The project on 49th Avenue and the Zoning Subcommittee... that the Zoning Committee on Land Use will vote on today will continue the progress of Long Island City. The project will bring much needed affordable housing to the neighborhood. am pleased to have worked with the developers to bring artists practice and rehearsal space to the buildings through an agreement with Spaceworks and I am pleased that the developer has signed an agreement with SCIU 32BJ to ensure union jobs and benefits for building workers as part of the project. Finally, the change in the zoning map will round out the Long Island City special district by making a small but meaningful change.

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COUNCIL MEMBER REYNOSO: May I please explain my vote?

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Mr. Reynoso to explain his vote.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNOSO: Thank you. just wanted to acknowledge that the zoning that's going into this district is truly reflective of a mixed use and a more comprehensive and holistic approach to zoning and planning that we don't do all too well occasionally in the City of New York, and not necessarily us and I want to encourage that in manufacturing districts that we can find a balance where we can get some assistance for all this to low income housing and also maintain manufacturing, and in this case increase to a M5 for more usage and this is what I want to continue encouraging this committee, is that we do look at the diversity and the opportunities that we have and I vote aye.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Great and I'm sure we'd love to have you take the Pulaski Bridge and come visit anytime you want. We're also joined by a member of the committee, Dan Garodnick as well, and I go back to Anne McCoy.
