2	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS: Cornegy, Miller,
3	Gibson, Cumbo, Van Bramer and I believe Johnson is
4	coming up the stairs. Before we begin, I want to
5	wish everyone who is celebrating Rosh Hashanah at the
6	end of this week a happy, healthy and a sweet New
7	Year to you and your families.
8	Now, turning to our agenda, we have four
9	items that we will begin voting on today. First, we
10	have a transparency resolution relating to the
11	designation of certain organizations to receive
12	funding in the Expense Budget. Our second item is an
13	Expense Budget modification. Our third item is a
14	resolution concerning the Fordham Road Business
15	Improvement District, and our fourth item is a Land
16	Use item.
17	Let's start with the transparency
18	resolution. This resolution sets forth new changes
19	in the designation of certain organizations receiving
20	local aging and youth discretionary funding, as well
21	as changes in the designation of certain
22	organizations receiving funding pursuant to certain
23	initiatives in the budget. As with the last
24	transparency resolution, this resolution contains re-
25	designations in many of our Council initiatives.

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2 Organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process 3 conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, 4 the Council or any other entity are identified in the 5 attached chart with an asterisk. As with all 6 7 transparency resolutions, council members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a 8 conflict exists with any of the groups on the 9 attached list. If any council member has a potential 10 conflict of interest with any of the organizations 11 12 listed, he or she has the opportunity to disclose the 13 conflict at the time of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with the 14 15 proposed subcontractors that are used by 16 organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. 17 These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved. Jeremy Plafker 18 [phonetic] of the General Counsel's office can assist 19 20 you with any questions or concerns regarding disclosures. 21 2.2 Next, we have an Expense Budget 23 modification. This modification represents movement of approximately \$3.4 million of funding between and 24 within city agencies to relocate appropriations to 25

2	fund City Council initiatives, as well as
3	discretionary programs. The appropriations that will
4	be affected are those reflected in three transparency
5	resolutions voted on by the Council in this fiscal
6	year, including the transparency resolution that we
7	are voting on today. The net fiscal impact of this
8	modification is zero. If any council member has any
9	questions about the modification, our Finance
10	Division director, Latonia McKinney is here to answer
11	them. Is she? Oh, there she goes, okay.
12	The third item on the agenda is a BID
13	item relating to the Fordham Road BID in Council
14	Member Torres' district in the Bronx. The Fordham
15	Road BID was established in 2005 and is generally
16	comprised of the regional Commercial Center of the
17	West Bronx. The BID includes the third busiest
18	retail court in New York City and serves over 80,000
19	visitors a day. It includes more than 300 businesses
20	with an annual sales and revenue of \$500 million.
21	The retail tenancy in the BID is characterized by
22	both small independent merchants, as well as large
23	national and regional chains. At this time, the BID
24	is seeking Council approval to do three things:
25	expand its boundaries to include two additional tax

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2 lots that include 1 Fordham Plaza, a 14-story office 3 building with numerous retail establishments on the ground floor and Fordham Plaza, a public plaza who 4 5 serves as a major transportation hub. The second is to increase its annual expenditure from \$625,000 to 6 7 \$670,000 a year. And the third, to amend the district plan to include a cap on all assessments so 8 that the maximum annual assessment to be paid by any 9 individual property will not exceed \$45,000. 10 The 11 resolution sets forth the date and time of the 12 hearing that this Committee will hold to consider the 13 legislation that will effectuate the changes I have 14 just described. The hearing will take place on 15 October 7th at 10:00 a.m. in this room with the 16 representatives from SBS here to answer any questions 17 about this BID item.

18 Lastly, we have a Land Use item, which is 279 Wyckoff in Council Member Rafael Espinal's 19 20 district in Brooklyn. This property will provide two 21 units of affordable housing for low-income families 2.2 and is part of a larger 11 building affordable 23 housing project that will provide 46 units of affordable housing overall. The property will 24 receive a full property tax exemption for 40 years 25

2	through HPD/HDFC's program. The Council member
3	supports this project and representatives from HPD
4	are here to answer any questions you may have on the
5	Land Use item.
6	Does anyone have any questions? I'll
7	first do questions on the mod. Any questions on
8	transparency? My opening statement was that great,
9	huh? Yes. Thank you, ladies. On the BID? On the
10	Land Use item? Okay, we will now have Billy Martin,
11	the Committee Clerk call the roll. We've also been
12	joined by Council Member Ignizio and Council Member
13	Johnson. Hello.
