3	CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS: Good morning and
4	welcome to today's Finance hearing. I am Council
5	Member Julissa Ferreras and the chair of this
6	committee. We've been joined by Council Members
7	Rosenthal, Rodriguez, Majority Leader Van Bramer,
8	Council Member Gibson, Council Member Johnson,
9	Council Member Levine. We have a short agenda
10	today; only two items. The first item is a
11	transparency resolution and the second item is a
12	BID legislation. The transparency resolution sets
13	forth new changes in the designation of certain
14	organizations receiving local aging and youth
15	discretionary funding as well as new changes in the
16	designation of certain organizations receiving
17	funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the
18	budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution
19	that have not yet completed the prequalification
20	process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract
21	Services, the council and other entities are
22	identified in the attached chart with an asterisk.
23	As with all transparency resolutions council
24	members will have to sign a disclosure form
25	indicating whether or not a conflict exist with any

2	of the groups on the attached list. If any council
3	member has a potential conflict of interest with
4	any organizations listed he or she has the
5	opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of
6	their vote. As a reminder pleased disclose any
7	conflict you may have with proposed subcontractors
8	that are used by discretionary funding. These
9	disclosures must be made before the subcontractor
10	can be approved. Jeremy Plofker [sp?] of the
11	Generals Councils Office can assist you with any
12	questions or concerns regarding disclosures. The
13	BID item that we have, we will be voting on today
14	is resolution 462 which sets forth December 8 th 14
15	at 10:00 a.m. in this room as a date, time, and
16	place to hold the public hearing concerning the
17	local law that would authorize and increase the
18	budgets of 10 BIDS. The budget increases have been
19	requested by the property owners within the
20	boundaries of each BID. The increases would be used
21	to enhance the services provided in each of these
22	BIDs; for example additional sanitation, holiday
23	lights display, outdoor art projects, and
24	marketing. The 10 BIDs that are seeking budget
25	increases are the 34 th Street BID in Council Member

2	Johnson's district, the 47 th Street BID in Council
3	Member Garodnick's district, the 86 th Street Bay
4	Bridge BID in Council Member Gentile's district,
5	the 161 st Street BID in Council Member Gibson's
6	district, the 125 th Street BID in Council Member
7	Dickens' district, the Columbus Amsterdam BID in
8	Council Member Levine's district, the Forest Avenue
9	BID in Council Member Rose's district, the Myrtle
10	Avenue Brooklyn BID in Council Member Cumbo's
11	district, the Steinway BID in Council Member
12	Constantinides district, and the Sunnyside Shines
13	BID in Council, in Majority Leader Van Bramer's
14	district. All of the council members have submitted
15	letters in support of the requested budget
16	increases. More information regarding the specific
17	amounts of the assessment increases and the
18	additional services that will be provided can be
19	found in the community report prepared by the
20	Finance Division. For those, those are the items
21	for today. I will first open up the floor for
22	questions on the transparency resolution and then
23	for questions regarding the assessment increases.
24	Any questions? Seeing none Before I have Billy
25	Martin the Committee Clark Where is Rilly? Oh

2	we're here before Billy? Oh no! Where is Billy?
3	Alright. I wanted to mention one housekeeping item.
4	I have requested that representatives of the HPD,
5	from HPD come to the council to do a briefing on
6	HDFCs, Article 11 tax exemptions, and some of the
7	other property tax exemptions that we are regularly
8	considering in this committee. The briefing will
9	take place on Wednesday, December 3 rd at 1:00 p.m.
10	on the 16 th floor. So members and your staff please
11	be sure if you can't make it if you can send a
12	staff. This is on all the tax recommended
13	legislation that we vote on out of this committee.
14	It should be a great opportunity for us to learn
15	about the property tax exemption process for HDFCs.
16	So please bring your questions and concerns about
17	specific projects if you have them. I strongly
18	encourage all my colleagues to attend. And can I
19	call the roll? People have to get Alright well
20	Billy's late but the good news is members we no
21	longer have to sign sheets. Yay! So I could have
22	totally taken the roll. Alright, Billy Martin will
