CHAIRPERSON KOO: Today, we only have one item to go over, Land use Item 138, Draper Hall No. 20155169 HHM. This item already has been through the hearing and a public hearing a couple days ago, and today we are going to vote for this. And before we call the roll, I have this statement to read.

Draper Hall will create much needed affordable housing for one of our most vulnerable populations, low-income elderly households. There are many senior citizens on fixed incomes in District 8, which is why it is important to make certain this project creates affordable housing opportunities

targeted to the local community, as well as elderly across the city. As such, the following commitments have been secured: As this project will increase-will include the use of project-based Section 8 vouchers, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development determines the community preferences for affordable housing. HUD has agreed to set aside 25% of the units for the local community, the highest commitment obtained from HUD on a Section 8 project to date. HUD has also committed to conducting a full demographic analysis of the community, borough and city to determine if a larger community preference can be secured for Draper Hall. The New York City Housing Authority has committed to conducting targeted outreach to all local seniors on the larger Section 8 waiting list to inform them about affordable housing opportunities at Draper Hall.

The developer SKA Marin will coordinate a focused market effort in the local community, and are committed to enlisting the services of local community-based organizations to conduct outreach prior and doing marketing. We will continue to work with all parties involved in the development of this project to maximize the community preference at
