3	Feliz Ano Nuevo, as we enter into 2015, and this
4	being our first meeting of the year. So, I want to
5	begin today by acknowledging Officers Andrew Dossi
6	and Aliro Pellerano, who were wounded in the line of
7	duty late Monday night in the Bronx, in Council
8	Member Ritchie Torres' district. I know I speak for
9	the entire Council in wishing them a quick and
10	complete recovery. And it's good to hear that they
11	are on their way.
12	Violence against our police officers is a

horrible and deplorable crime. It is an assault 13 against all New Yorkers, and those who are 14 responsible should be prosecuted to the fullest 15 extent of the law. Everyday New York's police 16 17 officers risk their lives keeping New Yorkers safe, and we're very grateful for their service, dedication 18 19 and commitment. I would also like to ask my 20 colleagues to stand. 21 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: All rise. 2.2 PUBLIC ADVOCATE JAMES: Please rise. 23 Everyone in the balcony please rise. 24 SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: As we pay our respects to Detective Ramos and Detective Liu, the 25

2	two NYPD officers who were assassinated last month in
3	a tragic and horrific act of senseless violence. And
4	we all know it has been a difficult several weeks
5	since that occurred. Additionally, I want to join in
6	remembering Governor Mario Cuomo who passed on
7	Thursday, January 1st. Mario Cuomo was a remarkable
8	man, a trailblazer, and an inspiration for all New
9	Yorkers. Our deepest condolences go out to the Cuomo
10	family, and to Governor Cuomo whose eulogy was
11	extremely moving and touching. So on behalf of Mario
12	Cuomo, Detective Liu and Detective Ramos, I ask my
13	colleagues to join me in a moment of silence.
14	[a moment of silence was observed]
15	SPEAKER MARK-VIVERITO: Thank you, my
16	colleagues. Today, we're voting on two budget
17	modifications to invest additional funds to keep
18	programs that provide vital services to New Yorkers.
19	For example, we're allocating \$2.5 million to help
20	implement President Obama's Executive Order on
21	Immigration, and \$4.9 million to the Human Resources
22	Administration Homeless Prevention efforts. As you
23	all remember, back in June we fought for every dollar
24	of funding to important initiatives across the city.

25 But the fight to make sure that every New Yorker gets

3	in June. Today, thanks to the advocacy of this
4	Council and the leadership or our Finance Chair
5	Julissa Ferreras we're able to allocate additional
6	funds to so many deserving programs. And this is
7	something that we should recognize because it's
8	something that has really been seen before. And
9	obviously, there always is room for improvement, but
10	this is something that we as a City Council should be
11	extremely proud of.

But, it's not just council members who 12 put in hard work around here. That extends to the 13 14 staff as well, and we thank them deeply for the hard 15 work they engage in each and every day. But, today we're getting ready to send off a very special member 16 17 of our staff. As some of you, many of you already 18 know, Jeff Rodus will be leaving us this Friday. 19 [groans] Jeff [laughs]--Jeff has served in our 20 Capital Budget Unit and Finance Division now as Deputy Chief of Staff for 24 years. [applause, 21 2.2 cheers, whistles] All right, Jeff. Yay, Jeff. If 23 we--if we don't stop, I think he's going to start crying. [laughter] You know, Jeff has told me that 24 basically his whole--almost his whole professional 25

2 career has been here at the Council. And we are deeply, deeply indebted to him for that. Under four 3 different Speakers, Jeff has worked at the highest 4 level with administration and agency officials to 5 ensure that the Council's budget and oversight roles 6 7 have a positive impact on the City of New York. We are all going to miss Jeff greatly. I know for me 8 personally as Speaker now for a year, your friendship 9 and partnership has been tremendous, Jeff. Obviously, 10 we're going to miss Jeff's quirky humor, his 11 12 unparalleled knowledge, and his tremendous leadership. So we definitely want to wish him the 13 14 best of luck in the next phase of his professional 15 career. We're very proud of you, me personally, 16 Jeff. Thank you very much, and I know there is going to be a great party later on for you so--17 18 I would also like to finish by noting that tomorrow January 8th marks one year since we 19 20 came together in this Chamber and began our current session under a new City Council. It's been an honor 21 2.2 and a privilege to serve as Speaker this past year, 23 and I'm very proud of the way we've come together as
