CHAIRPERSON FERRERAS: Good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee hearing. I am Julissa Ferreras and I am the Chair of the Committee. I wanna thank everyone for joining us today. We've been joined by Council Members Rodriguez, Miller, Cornegy, Johnson and Gibson and I know there's more members that are coming up on their way.

I wanna take this opportunity to congratulate our Speaker on what I thought and I'm sure many of my colleagues, was a very successful State of the City yesterday, so we're looking forward — and this Committee is going to be doing a lot of oversight on making sure that a lot of the ideas and policy direction that she had put forth yesterday, that we're able to deliver that on this budget, so I just wanted to thank her for stepping us in the right direction, but also for us, we're going to be fully engaging in this budget process so it is officially kicked off.

Today we will consider a transparency resolution, a Preconsidered Intro related to the tax lien sale and a BID item.

2	Let's start with the transparency
3	resolution. The transparency resolution sets forth
4	new changes in the designation of certain
5	organizations receiving local, aging and youth
6	discretionary funding, as well as new changes in the
7	designation of certain organizations receiving
8	funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the
9	budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution
LO	that have not yet completed the prequalification
L1	process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract
L2	Services, the Council and any other entity are
L3	identified in the attached chart with an asterisk
L 4	(*). As with all transparency resolutions, Council
L5	Members will have to sign a disclosure form
L6	indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any
L7	of the groups on the attached list. If any Council
L8	Member has a potential conflict of interest with any
L 9	of the organizations listed, he or she has the
20	opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of
21	their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any
22	conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors
23	that are used by organizations sponsored by
24	discretionary funding; these disclosures must be made

before the subcontractor can be approved. Jeremy

Now let's address the Preconsidered If you remember, at the end of January the Council adopted Local Law 14 of 2015, which extended the authority of the Commissioner of the Department of Finance to sell tax liens until December 16th. an effort to ensure that the tax lien sale is fair, efficient and effective, one of the things the law did was create a temporary task force comprised of the Administration and the Council to examine ways to minimize nonpayment of charges that were subject to the lien sale, including increasing awareness and the participation in tax benefit programs. force is also charged with evaluating payment arrangements and evaluating the impact of the tax lien sale process on affordable housing, particularly as it relates to HDFC.

The task force is required to hold its initial meeting by September 1st, 2015 and issue a report detailing its findings and recommendations by September of 2016. The Preconsidered Intro before us today would make two technical amendments to Local

Law 14. First, it would change the date of
appointment of the task force members no later than
60 days after enactment of the Local Law 14 to no
later than August 1st, 2015. Second, it would
clarify that The Speaker can appoint any individual
to the task force that is an employee of the Council.
While on the subject of the tax lien sale, I'd like
to remind my colleagues that the lien sale this year
will take place on May 15th, 2015; this means that
the last day to pay, enter an agreement or fill out
an exemption or eligibility checklist is May 14th,
2015. My Chief Counsel, Tanisha Edwards, recently
sent all Council Members a 90-day list of property
notice for sale in the main sale; I urge all my
colleagues, particularly those whom I met in December
whose districts have historically been the most
affected by the lien sale, to please reach out to
your constituents on the list. You should encourage
them to either pay the amount they owe or enter into
a payment arrangement as soon as possible to prevent
the inclusion in the lien sale.

Lastly, we'll be voting on a resolution concerning the establishment of the South Shore

Business Improvement District. The resolution sets

forth the date and time of the hearing that this
committee will hold to consider the legislation
establishing the BID. The hearing will take place on
February 26, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. in this room. This
BID will be located on Staten Island in Council
Member Ignizio's district and will consist of three
small non-contiguous commercial strips located in the
towns of Great Kills, Eltingville and Annadale. This
is an interesting BID because it will be the City's
first BID consisting of three separate commercial
strips under the umbrella of one BID. The BID will
be comprised of 217 parcels of land containing 275
businesses, most of which are independently owned and
some of which are regional and national chain stores.
The majority of the BID is commercial, but there are
also public facilities, transportation and utilities,
vacant land and 82 residential units. The BID will
have a relatively small budget of \$185,000 in its
first year, with the average assessment being
approximately \$1002 per year and the maximum
projected assessment being \$5090 per year. I
understand that Council Member Ignizio is here and
would like to say a few words about the BID.

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2 COUNCIL MEMBER IGNIZIO:

: Thank you,

Madame Chairwoman and let me say your hair looks lovely, [background comments] being a married man, I know I have to notice these things and you being my friend, I have to point them out; your hair looks a lot better than your previous chairman did for Finance, [background comments] that's for sure. That's a little dig on my friend Dominic. Anyway, we're very excited on the South Shore to be forming this BID and I appreciate all the work that went into it from my staff and from the people in the community; ultimately we're breaking new ground with showing local communities that they can have BIDs if they are creative with their development process and what we did here was, we used the Staten Island Rapid Transit as the connecting link to all these towns and ultimately will lower administrative costs so we're able to get more bang for the buck in these local communities and ultimately provide for a better business environment and for the constituents and patrons to use these commercial districts, so we're very excited about it; I thank you, Madame Chairwoman for carrying this and we look forward to its adoption at the end of the month.
