CHAIRPERSON CHIN: I'm Council Member Margaret Chin, Chair of the Council's Aging Committee. I'd like to first acknowledge my colleagues that are here today, Council Member Paul Vallone, Chair of our Senior Center Subcommittee, Council Member Koslowitz, Council Member Rose. And, we have Council Member Rosenthal visiting us because she is the sponsor of the resolution that we'll be voting on today. Oh, and then Council Member

Today, the Committee will be voting on two important items. The first Proposed Introduction 702-A sponsored by Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito and myself would require the Department for the Aging to create a guide for building owners to help make modifications and improvements to dwelling units, which would allow older New Yorkers to age at home in a safe and comfortable environment. Seniors have expressed and overwhelming desire to stay in their home and communities. And, this guide will be an

important resource for landlords to assist them in doing so. I thank Speaker Mark-Viverito for her leadership on this issue--important issue to older New Yorkers, and I'm proud to have worked with her on this legislation, which I know will benefit thousands of senior tenants in our city.

The Committee will also be voting on Proposed Resolution 426-A, sponsored by Council Member Andrew Cohen and Helen Rosenthal. Which calls upon the New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign S.4748 and A.5565A. Legislation eliminate the sunset provisions related to income threshold increase for the senior citizens rent increase exemption, and disability rent increase exemption programs. The income threshold increases signed into law last year have allowed approximately 13,000 additional households to qualify for SCRIE and DRIE programs. If these increases are permitted to sunset in July 2016, the ability of these households to remain in their homes affordably will be threatened.

I thank Council Member Cohen and
Rosenthal for their advocacy on this issue, and join
their call for the state to permanently extend the

SCRIE and DRIE increases. I would like to thank our staff who worked on this bill and resolution, Eric Bernstein, the Aging Committee Counsel; Kelly Taylor, our former Aging Committee Counsel; James Subudhi, Aging Committee Policy Analyst, and Dohini Sompura, Aging Committee Finance Analyst. And I urge my colleagues to vote in favor of these items, and I will now ask Council Member Rosenthal to give some

COUNCIL MEMBER ROSENTHAL: Thank you so much, Chairperson Chin for bringing this to the Aging Committee today, and giving me an opportunity to talk about this resolution. I want to thank Council Member Cohen for joining me in this effort to call on the New York State Legislature and the Governor to eliminate the sunset provision of the SCRIE and DRIE programs' recent baseline increases for eligibility. The New York City Rent Freeze Program, formerly known as SCRIE and DRIE help eligible seniors citizens age 62 years and older and tenants with qualifying disabilities to stay in affordable housing by freezing their rent. Prior to 2014, seniors were only eligible for the New York City Rent Freeze Program if their annual household income was below

\$29,000 and tenants with disabilities were only eligible if their annual household income was below \$20,412 for a single or \$29,484 for two or more

Last year, Council Member Chin's resolution expanded the income cap for SCRIE to \$50,000 and I was proud to introduce the resolution to do the same for DRIE. SCRIE and DRIE area lifeline for seniors and people with disabilities. Since the income cap was raised to \$50,000 last year, an additional 13,000 people became eligible for these programs. 13,000 people who would lose that right if the State does not renew funding in 2016. Let's make the higher cap for SCRIE and DRIE permanent so that seniors and people with disabilities on limited incomes don't need to worry every year that they will be forced out of their homes. Today, we need to make it clear to lawmakers in Albany that raising rents on these 13,000 seniors and people with disabilities that qualify for this program is unacceptable. Thank you very much.
