CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Good morning and welcome to the New York City Council's Committee on Rules, Privileges and Elections, which is resuming from a recess. My name is Brad Lander; I am honored to chair this committee. We're joined this morning by Committee Members Margaret Chin from Manhattan, Jumaane Williams from Brooklyn, Inez Dickens from Manhattan, Dan Garodnick from Manhattan, Debi Rose from Staten Island, Ydanis Rodriguez from Manhattan, as well as several other additional Council Members who are joining us this morning, Council Member Liz Crowley, who chairs our Committee on Fire and Criminal Justice, which has oversight of the Department of Corrections; I think... I don't know if I said Council Member Mark Levine is a member of the Committee, as well as Council Member Danny Dromm, who was the putter-forward of the nomination for Stanley Richards, and we're all -- putter-forward, that's an official term in the Charter, the putter-forward, and Council Member Ruben Wills from Queens, welcome to all of you.

We're also joined by six wonderful nominees who we got to have a long conversation with;

COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES AND ELECTIONS 4 we are resuming what was a three-hour public hearing yesterday, so welcome to Dr. Ramanathan Raju, Dr. Rosa Gil and Karen Redlener, who are being nominated to the New York City Board of Health; William Aguado being nominated to Taxi and Limousine Commission; Stanley Richards being proposed by the Council for the Board of Corrections and Patricia Machir being proposed by the Council to the New York City Youth Board.

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I will just read the formal letters of introduction, but then I wanna let people know; we had said that members who weren't available yesterday and who had additional questions, that we would reopen any of these public hearings, and if anyone has an additional question or wants to make a statement, we'll make room to do that.

I will tell you that I thought
yesterday's hearing was genuinely inspiring and that
our conversations about social determinants of health
and confronting inequality through and thinking about
the health systems and what they can and can't do on
their own and in combination with other systems; our
conversation with Stanley Richards about opportunity
and redemption and what's possible in the city if we

think about it in some different ways of what we need to be doing at Rikers; with Council Member Dromm and The Speaker; our conversation with Mr. Aguado about how the TLC can relate to communities and his community experience, and our conversation with Patricia Machir about creating opportunities for young people and working with some of the smaller community organizations were really good, so would I encourage anyone who's watching this morning to go look at yesterday's hearing and you'll see that we've got an inspiring and very impressive set of nominees.

That said, let me dispense with a couple of quick pieces of business and then if anyone has questions or comments, and then we'll proceed to a vote.

I see we've also been joined by Council
Member Jimmy Vacca from the Bronx and someone else...
and Council Member Rafael Espinal from Brooklyn,
who's a member of the Rules Committee. Also like to
acknowledge Counsel to the Committee, Jason Otano and
our great staff -- Chuck Davis, Director of
Investigations, as well as Deandra Johnson and Diana
Arriaga from the Council's Investigative Unit.

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The Mayor also submitted William Aguado's name for the Council's advice and consent concerning his nomination for appointment to the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission; if the Council gives its advice and consent, William Aguado, a Bronx resident, will fill a vacancy and serve the remainder of a seven-year term that expires on January 31, 2022.

The Council will consider Stanley
Richards for appointment to the Board of Corrections;

Stanley Richards, a resident of the Bronx, will replace Alexander Rovt and be eligible to serve the remainder of a six-year term expiring on October 12, 2020.

And finally, the Council will consider

Patricia Machir for recommendation for appointment to
the Youth Board; if the Council votes to make this
recommendation and the candidate subsequently
appointed by the Mayor, Patricia Machir will be
eligible to serve on the New York City Youth Board
for an undefined term.

So with that, let me open it up to any of my colleagues who have either questions for any of the -- can we simultaneously reopen all of the hearings that we recessed yesterday -- so questions or comments from any member or non-member of the Committee; we're now open for comment; we'll begin with Council Member Vacca, followed by Council Member Crowley.

COUNCIL MEMBER VACCA: Thank you,

Mr. Chair and I certainly wanted to comment on the

nominees we have today; Ms. Gil and I have had

And I thank all the others, but I really wanted to single out as well Bill Aguado; Bill Aguado has been a voice in the Bronx in the arts for many, many years, Bronx Council of the Arts; he's an institution in our borough, and I wanted to make sure, even though I'm not on the Committee, I wanted to make sure that a Bronx Council Member was here to indicate that we're supportive of you; we put you on the Taxi and Limousine Commission because of your integrity and your record of service, and I would hope that the Committee members here will vote in favor of your nomination. I was pleased to support you from the inception and even mentioned the idea to you, I remember, at a botanical gardens function; I said, "Oh my god, you'd be great for the Taxi and Limousine Commission, " and I remember your response, "Jimmy, what do you think?" So, although that's my paraphrasing, of course; not yours. But Bill, I wish you the best and I urge the members to vote yes.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you, Council Member Vacca. Council Member Crowley.

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COUNCIL MEMBER CROWLEY: Thank you,

Mr. Chairman. Good morning. I am Council Member Elizabeth Crowley; I also have the privilege of chairing the Fire and Criminal Justice Committee here at the Council. I wanted to be here to congratulate Stanley Richards on the good work that he's done in his career and for being interested in wanting to serve our city in the capacity of a member of the Board of Corrections. I support him in his efforts and I know we'll have a chance to vote on that as a body later today, but I wanted to wish him well and I

Mr. Richards was incarcerated himself and made the most of that; he educated himself and started to believe in his future and his work with The Fortune Society since leaving prison he has helped countless individuals to believe in themselves and to achieve a better life. So I thank you, Mr. Richards, and I look forward to out good work together.

look forward to our good work together.

CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you, Council Member Crowley. I'm pleased that we've been joined by our Speaker, Melissa Mark-Viverito and I have prevailed upon Council Member Dromm to briefly

COUNCIL MEMBER DROMM: Thank you,

the name of Stanley Richards to the attention of our

Stanley and I have known each other about four years now, when a friend of mine who was previously incarcerated went to The Fortune Society and I've seen the magic that The Fortune Society has done with folks and that magic in many ways is orchestrated by the work of Stanley Richards. fortunate also today to be joined by the founder of The Fortune Society, David Rothenberg, who is here in the back -- David, give us a wave back there as well -- who had the idea and the concept that formerly incarcerated individuals could reform their lives and turn their lives around and make themselves productive taxpayers, as David Likes to say, in society as well. We've been joined by my friend Robert as well, who is a client at The Fortune Society at this point.

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and I'm very proud of all of them and I really look forward to the work that Stanley is going to be able to do and to the perspective that Stanley is going to bring to the Board of Corrections, because I really do believe that the philosophy of The Fortune Society, in particular of unconditional love, of giving people second, third, fourth chances, whatever it is that they need to be supported in their efforts to re-enter society as productive citizens is ultimately what has been successful with those who have been formerly incarcerated.

And I also believe that Stanley Richards believes, as many of us in the Council do, that there are preventative measures that we should be taking to ensure that many of our youth that are mentally ill; are substance abusers don't actually have to wind up on Rikers Island and I believe that Stanley is also in line with our Speaker's philosophy, as she has expressed, about helping individuals who are on Rikers Island achieve bail, because the majority of the people who are on Rikers Island are in fact people who are not convicted of any crime yet and simply are there because they cannot afford bail and so many of the ideas and suggestions that have been

COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES AND ELECTIONS put out there, especially in light of the federal investigation into what's happening on Rikers Island, the expose in the New York Times, are issues that Stanley is well aware of and I am confident that he will tackle these issues in a very fair, professional and thorough way and in a way which would be in line with the majority of thinking of the members of New York City Council, so I am very proud to support Stanley; I really thank our Speaker, because I do not believe that under any other administration this would have happened; having a formerly incarcerated person who actually has gone through Rikers Island and knows the system is going to be able to lend a perspective to the Board of Corrections that has not been given before, and I thank our Speaker and I thank our Chair for giving me this time and for really making sure that this nomination went through in a timely and productive way. Thank you very, very much.

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CHAIRPERSON LANDER: Thank you, Council
Member Dromm for those remarks and for your
leadership on this issue in this Council and the
prior Council and in bringing Mr. Richards to our
attention.
