buildings, including single- and two-family row

houses, flat buildings and apartment houses. This
application is from the districts of Council Member

Robert Cornegy and Laurie Cumbo; both Council Members
support this application by the Landmarks

LU No. 232, Hunts Point Peninsula

Apartments, application submitted by HPD for the grant of an Article 11 tax exemption for 5 multiple dwellings which provide rental housing for low-income families; this application is in Council Member Arroyo's district.

LU No. 229, Arthur Clinton cluster, an application submitted by HPD requesting UDAAP designation and a tax exemption for property located at 62 West Tremont Avenue; this application is in Council Member Cabrera's district.

Application submitted by HPD for LU No. 230, Mermaid, West 16th Street, a proposed amendment to a previously approved UDAAP; the project was originally approved for the construction of 14 condo units and two-family homes; this amendment will facilitate the construction of 7 three-family homes containing 21 dwelling units for sale to low-income purchasers; this application is in Council Member Treyger's district.

LU No. 233, application submitted by HPD requesting UDAAP designation and a tax exemption for 7 vacant single-family homes which will be rehabbed and sold to low-income purchasers; this application is in Council Member Miller's district.

LU No. 234, application submitted by HPD requesting UDAAP designation and a tax exemption for 5 vacant single-family homes which will be rehabbed and sold to low-income purchasers; this application is in Council Member Richards' district.

LU No. 235, application submitted by HPD requesting UDAAP designation and a tax exemption for one, only one, sadly, vacant single-family home located at 43 Harbor Road, which will be rehabbed and 2 sold to one low-income purchaser; this application is
3 in Council Member Rose's district.

LU No. 236, Grand and Rogers cluster, this application is submitted by HPD for an amendment to an application that was previously approved in October 2013, adding two additional buildings and an Article 11 tax exemption which will provide approximately 88 rental dwelling units; this application includes buildings in The Speaker's district and Council Member Gibson's and Arroyo's district.

The subcommittees have all recommended approval of these items, as I do as well; as you, the members of which these items are located in their districts.
