CHAIRPERSON ULRICH: Thank you. All Thank you. [gavel] Good morning. right. I am Council Member Eric Ulrich, Chair of the Veterans Committee. Today we are voting on Proposed Resolution 747-A, which I have co-sponsored along with my good friend and colleagues and a member of this Committee Council Member Andy Cohen of the Bronx. This resolution would declare this and every June to be PTSD Awareness Month in the City of New York. As the committee just heard last week from Commissioner Sutton and other witnesses, veterans groups, service providers and advocates on the front lines of veteran mental health care Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder can have deep and at times debilitating effects on service members returning home from military service not to mention their family members. Thousands of veterans in New York City of all services struggle with PTSD each and every day. Aside from the significant impacts this can have on an individual's health and relationships

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they have with their friends and family, the stigma surrounding PTSD can affect their financial and professional circumstances as well. We heard how important outreach and support are to letting our veterans know that they are not alone in making the readjustment back to civilian life. Our city must be well informed about PTSD to be able to help veterans recognize symptoms, seek and obtain care and overcome the societal stigma that too often creates barriers when we should be creating opportunities and providing the help that they need. Officially recognizing June as PTS Awareness Month will be an important first step in increasing the public's awareness around PSD--PST--PTSD, thank you, and helping New York City's veterans get the support and care that they need. I'm urging my colleagues to vote in favor of this resolution. I want to thank Council Member Cohen for his advocacy on behalf of mental health issues in New York City, but particularly around helping veterans who suffer from I'm going to ask him to say a few words, but PTSD. before I turn the mic over to him, I want to thank our committee staff, Eric Bernstein, Committee Counsel, Kevin Ryan our Policy Analyst, whose last

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day is today. I don't know where Kevin is. He was here, but it was Kevin's last day working for the Council, and we wish him nothing but the best. And, of course, John Russell, our Financial Analyst. And before I ask the Clerk to call the roll, I'll ask

Council Member Cohen to say a few words, please.

COUNCIL MEMBER COHEN: Thank you, Chair.

I just really want to thank you for your leadership on this, and the opportunity to work together to get this done. I think that's a very--on a day that's going to be a very good day, this is a cherry on top. So I'm very pleased and I want to go officially on the record as saying I had nothing to do with why we didn't vote on this the other day. [laughter]

Member Cohen. We've been joined by the members of the committee. I want the Clerk to record their presence as well as their votes, Council Member Cabrera, who is also a Mental Health expert. It's the right word? And spiritual, and spiritual that's right, and we could use more of that. Council Member Cohen, of course, and Council Member Paul Vallone, myself and Council Member Maisel was here. I'm assuming he's coming back here any moment. We'll
