CHAIRPERSON GREENFIELD: Good morning, good morning, good morning. My name is David Greenfield. I'm the Councilman from the 44th Council District in Brooklyn. I'm privileged to serve as Chair of the Land Use Committee. I welcome my esteem colleagues who are members of the committee. What the committee is voting on today is approve the resolutions before you for presentation and vote by the full council. The resolutions reflect the recommendations of the applicable subcommittee.

Before we go to the audience, I want to acknowledge that this is a very, very sad day at the Land Use Committee because after over three and a half years of service to the Council our extraordinary general counsel is taking leave for green pastures. I mean that literally. [laughter] I couldn't help myself. I'm sorry. Anne McCaughey has worked on some of the biggest and most challenging projects that have come through the Council in recent years, NYU, Hunts Point, Madison Square Gardens, Domino, and Astoria Cove just to name a few. Those are not easy project, but with her

lot coverage requirements in connection with proposed

130,000 square enlargement to the hospital on East

71st Street. This application is Council Member

Kallos' district. How are you, Kallos?

NO. 254 and 255 are related. It's okay to talk, just
